Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**COUNTY WIDE****COLD CASE HOMICIDE****I-95/Backlick Road**

*Fairfax County Crime Solvers is still seeking the public's assistance identifying the person responsible for a homicide that occurred 20 years ago. About 9:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 29, 1989, 18-year-old Amy Baker was driving southbound on Interstate 95 near Backlick Road when her car experienced difficulties. Amy abandoned her blue 1970 Volkswagon Bug and walked up the exit ramp onto Backlick Road, toward the Exxon gas station. Detectives believe that her attacker confronted her on Backlick Road and forced her into the woods near the top of the exit ramp, where she was sexually assaulted and strangled. Her body, which was found two days later, was partially buried in some leaves.

Detectives continue to investigate her death and would like to speak with anyone who may have been in the area at the time of the attack, or who may have knowledge of the incident. In addition to the \$1000 cash reward offered by Crime Solvers, a \$25,000 private reward is also being offered for information which leads to an arrest and indictment in this case. A 23-year-old Fairfax-area woman was robbed while working at the Quiznos Sub restaurant, located at 13661 Lee Jackson Memorial Highway, on Saturday, March 28. Around 8:15 p.m. a man approached the employee at the counter and ordered a sandwich. When the employee rang up the order, the man produced a knife. The suspect removed an undisclosed amount of cash from the register and fled out the front door with the sandwich. The victim was not injured. The suspect was described as black, 25 to 30 years old. He was about 6 feet tall and 180 pounds. He was clean-shaven and wore a black jacket.

ASSAULT/ATTEMPT TO DISARM LAW ENFORCEMENT\RESISTING ARREST\ARREST**Airline Parkway**

4200

Police were called to the 4200 block of Airline Parkway to investigate a report of an assault on Saturday, March 28. An investigation determined that a couple had been arguing around 10:28 p.m. and the man assaulted the 27-year-old Chantilly woman. The suspect allegedly resisted arrest and tried to take an officer's firearm when they attempted to take him into custody. Darren M. Gillespie, 39, of the 4200 block of Airline Parkway in Chantilly, was transported to the

Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with domestic assault, resisting arrest and attempting to disarm law enforcement. The victim did not require medical attention. The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors recognizes that domestic violence is a serious issue in our community. Services for victims of domestic violence are offered through the Domestic Abuse and Sexual Assault Programs, which are part of the Office for Women. These programs provide victims of sexual and domestic violence with safe shelter, counseling, support groups, and 24-hour hotlines through the Fairfax Women's Shelter and the Victim Assistance Network. He wore a red shirt, black jeans and a red or black hat.

Arlington Boulevard / Graham Road

Chain Bridge Road

A man attempted to snatch a woman's purse on Sunday, March 29. The victim, 40, of Bowie, Maryland, parked her car at the Tysons Corner Center mall, located at 1961 Chain Bridge Road, next to a black Chevrolet Suburban. As she got out, the driver of the SUV also exited and grabbed her purse. The victim and the suspect struggled briefly, but the suspect let go of the bag when the victim called out to a passerby. He fled in the vehicle. The suspect was described as black, about 30 years old. He had brown eyes and wore a black jacket, blue pants, white sneakers and a black ball cap.

Police responded to a report of a robbery near Hollywood Road and Lee Landing Drive on Monday, March 30. The victim, a 30-year-old Falls Church woman, was walking on a path around 11:15 p.m. when two men confronted her, one of whom is an acquaintance. The victim handed over an undisclosed amount of cash when one of them brandished a handgun. The suspects fled on foot and the victim called police a short time later.
