

There are three sections in this report: Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS; Section II: PROPERTY CRIMES; and, Section III: ANIMAL RELATED INCIDENTS. Sections are appropriately identified. Within the sections, incidents are organized by station, then by type of offense. They are listed alphabetically by street address.

Addresses shown indicate blocks and not specific locations. Thus an entry showing Chain Bridge Road 4100 would mean the 4100 *block* of Chain Bridge Road, not the address 4100 Chain Bridge Road.

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

GRADUATION

*Twenty recruits graduated the Auxiliary Police Officer (APO) program on Tuesday, November 14 at 7 p.m. Of those graduating, 19 will volunteer in Fairfax County and one in the town of Vienna. The ceremony was held in the board room of the Fairfax County Government Center. Fairfax County is planning to hold its next Auxiliary Police Academy session in spring 2007. To be considered, applicants must live in Northern Virginia and be at least 21 years of age. Applicants must be in good health and without a criminal record or history of drug use, and not be an applicant for police officer in any jurisdiction. Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS

SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)

ROBBERY

Airline Parkway/Lufthansa Circle

*On Sunday, November 12 around 12:15 a.m., a 32-year-old Chantilly-area man was robbed. He was riding his bicycle on Airline Parkway near Lufthansa Circle when three men approached him. They asked for a cigarette and one of the men pulled a gun from his waistband. The suspect brandished the gun at the victim while pushing him off the bike. The victim gave up his wallet, and the suspects fled in a black SUV. The victim was not injured. The suspects are described as three black men about 24 years old. They were about 6 feet tall and around 175 pounds. The suspect with the gun had black hair and brown eyes and was wearing all black clothing. The second suspect was wearing a light-colored baseball jersey, blue jeans and a white hat. The third suspect was also wearing all black clothing. He drove the black SUV that fled towards Lee Jackson Memorial Highway.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)

POLICE PURSUIT

Richmond Highway/Lukens Lane

*A police pursuit on Friday afternoon ended with the apprehension of a man wanted on outstanding warrants. Officers were responding to a domestic violence call at 3:25 p.m. on November 10 when a lookout was broadcast for the vehicle belonging to the suspect who had just fled the home. An alert officer located the suspect's vehicle on Richmond Highway near Lukens Lane and attempted to make a traffic stop. The driver of the vehicle refused to stop the car and a pursuit ensued. Officers pursued the suspect through several neighborhoods and were eventually able to stop his car. However, the suspect fled from his car and officers gave chase on foot near the recreation center on Fordson Road. The foot pursuit ended a short distance away when officers apprehended the suspect. The driver of the car, James Kelly, 28, of no fixed address, was arrested and charged with three counts of attempted malicious wounding, speed to elude and driving on a suspended license. In addition, Kelly was charged with several outstanding warrants for failing to appear in court on an assault charge, simple assault and

obscene telephone calls. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and remanded to the custody of the Sheriff's Office.

ROBBERY

Little River Turnpike

6200

On Monday, November 13 at 8 p.m., a 43-year-old Burke-area man was robbed. The man was walking through a parking lot in the 620 block of Little River Turnpike when he was approached by three men. One of the suspects tripped the victim who fell to the ground. The suspects took the victim's bag and fled. The victim was not seriously injured. The suspects were described as black men in their 20s. All three suspects were approximately 6 feet tall and weighed between 130 to 180 pounds. The first suspect wore a black shirt, black pants and white sneakers. The second suspect wore a long black jacket, and the third suspect wore a long, blue shirt and jeans.

ROBBERY

Little River Turnpike

7400

*A suspect in three previous bank robberies in Fairfax County is believed to have struck again. At around 4:30 p.m. Wednesday, November 15, an employee of the Bank of America at 7400 Little River Turnpike was in the lobby greeting customers. A man tapped her on the shoulder, handed her a note and asked for help. The employee recognized the man from one of two previous robberies at the same bank, ran to the back of the bank and slammed the vault door behind her. The suspect pulled out a butcher knife he brought with him and ran up and down the teller line demanding money. None of the bank employees complied. After attempting to get behind the counter through a locked door, the suspect ran out of the bank. The suspect is described as an Asian man who appears to be 45 to 55 years old. He is approximately 5 feet 7 inches tall and weighs 160 to 170 pounds. He was wearing a blue jacket, tan pants and light-colored sneakers. Police believe this same man robbed the same bank on December 14, 2005, and October 27, 2006. He is also a suspect in the robbery of the BB&T bank at 1953 Gallows Road on January 27, 2006.

RESTON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 5)

DWI CHECKPOINT RESULTS

Leesburg Pike/ Baron Cameron Avenue

*Fairfax County Police Officers from the Reston District Station conducted a sobriety checkpoint to deter and apprehend intoxicated drivers on Saturday, November 11 from 11 p.m. until 1:40 a.m. Sunday. All motorists were stopped and drivers were checked to assure that their abilities to drive had not been impaired by alcohol or drugs. The checkpoint occurred near the

intersection of Leesburg Pike and Baron Cameron Avenue. Approximately 739 motorists were stopped. Three people were charged with driving on a suspended license and three with no driver's license.

HOME INVASION

Founders Way

2400

*A 56-year-old Reston-area woman was home alone in the 2400 block of Founders Way when three men forced their way into her home. On Monday, November 13 around 6 p.m., the woman heard the doorbell ring. She opened the door slightly and three men pushed open the door and entered the house. One of the suspects attempted to tie up the victim, but she resisted causing another suspect to brandish a gun. Statements were made by the suspects that indicate they know a family member of the victim. The suspects fled without taking anything. There were no apparent injuries to the victim. The suspects were described as black, between 18 and 25 years old. One suspect was 5 feet 7 inches tall and weighed about 150 to 160 pounds. He was wearing dark clothes with a red bandana over his mouth. The second suspect was 5 feet 7 inches tall weighing about 150 pounds. He was wearing dark clothing. The third suspect was 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighed about 200 pounds. He was wearing a three-quarter length black coat and all black clothes.

ROBBERY

Prewitt Place

13300

On Friday, November 11 around 10 p.m., an 18-year-old Sterling-area man was robbed. The man was waiting for his relatives in the 13300 block of Prewitt Place when he was approached by two males. The suspects pushed the victim to the ground, took his jewelry and fled. The victim was not seriously injured. The suspects were described as white men, in their 20s. Both suspects were 5 feet 6 inches tall and weighed 170 pounds. One suspect wore a gray sweatshirt and blue jeans. The other suspect wore a blue shirt, blue jacket and black pants.

FRANCONIA DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 6)

HOMICIDE/SUICIDE

Sky Blue Court

6624

*The bodies of two adults, one female and one male have been discovered inside a townhouse at 6624 Sky Blue Court in the Kingstowne area of the County. A teenage girl returning home from school found her mother dead in an upstairs bedroom and called police about 2:30 p.m. Monday, November 13. At that point, the woman's husband was unaccounted for. Following the arrival of a search warrant for the townhouse, crime scene investigators discovered the body of a deceased male in a bathroom of the home. Further investigation has determined this was a domestic related homicide-suicide. Detectives determined that the husband fatally shot his wife and then took his own life. Autopsies conducted on Tuesday, November 14 determined the cause of death to be penetrating gunshot wounds. The wife is identified as Monica O. Telfer, 45, of 6624 Sky Blue Court and her husband is identified as 54-year-old, Samuel Appiah-Kusi. Both lived at 6624 Sky Blue Court.

ROBBERY

Rivanna Drive

6100

*A 49-year-old Springfield-area man and his 15-year-old son were on the front porch of a residence on Saturday, November 11 when they were robbed. Around 3:45 a.m., a man approached the victims from the side of the house in the 6100 block of Rivanna Drive. When the victims questioned the man, he brandished a gun and demanded money. They did not comply, so the suspect grabbed a cell telephone from one of the victims. The suspect fled toward Crozet Court and drove off in a small, dark sedan with a loud exhaust, eastbound on Deepford Street. The victims were not injured. The suspect was described as black, about 17 years old. He was 5 feet 11 inches tall and weighed about 140 pounds. He was wearing a black hoodie, black mask, black pants and black gloves.

ASSAULT

Braddock Road

6800

*A 17-year-old North Springfield-area girl was assaulted Thursday, November 9 around noon at the Deerlick Park. She was jogging in the woods near the 6800 block of Braddock Road in the North Springfield area. She noticed a teenager walk past her and felt uncomfortable. When she turned to look back at him, he had turned around and started walking behind her. The teenager pushed the victim from behind, knocking her to the ground and attempted to pull her pants down. The victim was struggling with the suspect and he struck her. The suspect fled with her iPod. The victim had minor injuries. The suspect was described as black, 15 years old, 5 feet 6 inches tall and weighing about 150 pounds. He was wearing a red and black jersey, black jacket and blue jeans. An officer taking a report from a nearby private special education school, The Phillips School, located at 7010 Braddock Road, heard the suspect description and developed a suspect. Investigation concluded with the arrest of a student of The Phillips School, a 15-year-old boy from Maryland. He was taken to the Juvenile Detention Center and charged with abduction with the intent to defile.

ROBBERY

Lewis Chapel Road/Lorton Road

A 13-year-old Lorton-area boy was robbed. On Thursday, November 9 around 6:45 a.m., in the area of Lewis Chapel Road and Lorton Road the boy was waiting at a bus stop when he was approached by three males wearing black ski masks. One of the suspects tried to grab the victim however he began to run. The suspects chased after the victim, caught him and began to assault him. The suspects took an undisclosed amount of money from the victim and fled. The victim passed out and eventually regained consciousness at which time he called police. The victim was not seriously injured. The suspects were described as wearing black ski masks.

UNLAWFUL ENTRY

Dubois Street

4300

On Thursday, November 9 at 7 a.m., a 67-year-old Rose Hill-area woman was home alone when she heard a noise at her window. She went to check it out when she saw a man peeping in. She called police then saw the man go to the back deck and try to open that door. He was unsuccessful and fled. With the help of a K-9 unit and the helicopter, a person was stopped and later identified as the suspect. Patrick W. Geogheon, 20, of 4015 Javins Drive, Alexandria, was arrested and charged with entering a property with the intent to damage. He was taken to the Adult Detention Center.

BURGLARY

Alamo Street

6300

On Wednesday, November 8 at 11 p.m., a 40-year-old Springfield-area woman heard a noise at her kitchen window in the 6300 block of Alamo Street. She went to check the noise and observed that the window had been opened. Further investigation showed that the suspect(s) entered the kitchen window and removed various items from the house and fled the area. The victim was not injured. The investigation continues.

Independence Circle

5700

On Wednesday, November 15 at 11:30 a.m., a home was burglarized in the 5700 block of Independence Circle. A property manager observed two black men walking from the house carrying a large bag with computer equipment. He notified police and through investigation it was found that the items had been taken from the residence. The suspects fled in a cream color Dodge Minivan. The suspects were described as black men in their 20s. They were 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighed 120 pounds. The first suspect wore blues jeans and a pull over type shirt. The second suspect wore blue jeans and a gray shirt. The investigation continues.

WEST SPRINGFIELD DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 7)BURGLARY

Mardale Lane

*On Sunday, November 12 a family came home from church to find their home had been burglarized. The burglary occurred in the 6000 block of Mardale Lane in the Burke area between 9:45 a.m. and 2:10 p.m. Because someone in the neighborhood made a suspicious person report that morning, police were able to track down and arrest three suspects. The three arrested men are Jin Hyung Park, 46, Jin Ri, 40 and Gi Ho Yoon, 43. All three lived at 4360 Ivymount Court #4 in Annandale. They were taken to the Adult Detention Center and charged with burglary and grand larceny.

SHOTS FIRED IN SARATOGA AREA***Parthian Court**

7800

On Friday, November 10 at 10:30 p.m., several shots were fired near the 7800 block of Parthian Court. The victim, a 21-year-old Darnstown, Md., woman, was dropping off passengers in the area near Parthian Court. Soon after her passengers left, three men approached her car. One of the suspects brandished a gun at the victim, and all three suspects then attempted to take the victim's purse. During the struggle shots were fired. The victim fled the scene in her car. A police investigation determined that the suspects fled the scene in a white vehicle, possibly a 1998 Oldsmobile. The victim sustained minor injuries during the struggle for her purse. The suspect that brandished the gun was described as a Middle Eastern man, 6 feet 1 inch tall and weighing 180 pounds. He has brown eyes and long black hair, possibly pulled back into a pony tail. The other suspects were described only as Middle Eastern men.

FAIR OAKS DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 8)**EXPOSURE****Willow Crescent Drive**

3300

*A woman was in the 3300 block of Willow Crescent Drive in the Fairfax area when she witnessed a man exposing himself on Thursday, November 9. The Fairfax-area woman, 19, was in a ground floor apartment at about 12:45 a.m. when she heard a noise at the window. She went to investigate the noise and opened the blinds to find a man exposing himself. The victim got scared and went to get a friend, but when they looked out the window, the suspect was gone.

ROBBERY**Fields Bridge Road/Summit Manor Drive**

*A man and woman were robbed at gunpoint near the intersection of Fields Brigade Road and Summit Manor Drive. On Saturday, November 11 at 11:30 p.m., the victims, a 20-year-old Reston-area man and a 19-year-old Fairfax-area woman, were sitting in a car when they were approached by three or four men. The men demanded money at gunpoint and took several personal items from both victims. The suspects fled the scene. One of the victims sustained minor injuries. The suspects were described as black males in their 20s. One suspect was 5 feet 6 inches tall with a heavy build and another was 6 feet tall with a goatee.

ROBBERY

Chain Bridge Road

2941

*On Tuesday, November 14 at 3:05 p.m., the BB&T Bank located at 2941 Chain Bridge Road in the Oakton-area was robbed. The suspect entered the bank, approached a female teller and passed a note announcing the robbery and implying he had a gun. The 21-year-old Fairfax-area victim complied and relinquished an undisclosed amount of money. The suspect left the bank and walked east on Palmer Street towards the Vienna Metro Station. A lookout was broadcast and the suspect was spotted by a plain clothes officer from the Fair Oaks District Station. The suspect was taken into custody at the Vienna Metro Station. Cash and a weapon were recovered. The suspect has been identified as Igor Peter Koob. He is 19 years old, and his home residence has not yet been established. He was charged with robbery and the use of a firearm in the commission of a felony. Koob was held at the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION

Bluestone Place

6300 (Sully District Station)

On Monday, November 13 at about 8:38 a.m., an animal control officer responded to the 6300 block of Bluestone Place after a dog caught and killed a raccoon. The animal control officer quarantined the dog at home for 45 days. The owner of the dog was cited for no county dog license and no rabies vaccination for two cats. The raccoon was removed by the animal control officer and transported to the animal shelter for testing.

Cantata Court

2000 (McLean District Station)

On Saturday, November 11 around 10:30 in the morning, a deer jumped through a front window into a home in the 2000 block of Cantata Court in the Vienna area. The 4- or 6-point buck jumped through the bay window and over the couch landing in the living room, just missing a 7-month-old infant who had been lying on a blanket in front of the couch (hoof marks were found on the baby pillow). The deer crossed the room and jumped over a man, who had been sitting in a recliner. The deer then ran into the dining room and kicked an 8-year-old boy in the face. Fortunately, the boy had been wearing a football helmet and sustained only minor bruises to his forehead and nose. The deer entered the kitchen where a 2-year-old was on a tricycle. The father pushed his son out of the way and tackled the deer. Another adult assisted to contain the buck and a third neighbor was drafted to help hogtie the deer. Once he was carried outside, the ropes were cut and the deer ran away into the woods (running into the side of the house and bouncing off first). The adult in the kitchen received minor injuries and was treated at the scene. The infant apparently slept through the mayhem.

Old Chain Bridge Road

1330 (Sully District Station)

On Friday, November 10 at about 5 p.m., a Mclean-area woman advised an animal control officer that her dog had fought and killed a fox in the 1300 block of Old Chain Bridge Road. The dog, a male Presa Canario, was quarantined for 45 days at home after receiving a rabies booster shot. The dead fox was taken to the Fairfax County Health Department where it tested positive for rabies.

Priscilla Lane

1100 (Mount Vernon District Station)

On Tuesday, November 7 at about 10 a.m., a 42-year-old Alexandria-area man called animal control officers after his Labrador poodle killed a groundhog in the 1100 block of Priscilla Lane. The dog received a rabies booster shot and was quarantined at home for 45 days. The groundhog carcass was taken to the Fairfax County Health Department where it tested positive for rabies.

Wilburdale Drive

On Wednesday, November 15 an animal control officer responded to a report of a raccoon killed by a dog. The raccoon tested positive for rabies. The dog was current on his vaccinations. He was put on 45-day quarantine and the owner was advised to seek a rabies booster for the dog.
