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## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report represents a compilation of information previously provided in a variety of annual reports prepared by the Internal Affairs Bureau. These include the Investigative Division Report, Police Vehicle Crash Report, Pursuit Data, Use of Force Report, Use of Force against Animals Report and Subpoena Processing Report. These reports had a targeted circulation, and in some cases were limited to the Internal Affairs Bureau. Due to ongoing investigations and reviews of matters that occurred in calendar year 2013, all statistics are based on matters closed as of December 31, 2014. To date there remains open 1 case involving a cruiser crash, 3 cases involving use of force and 25 cases involving other administrative investigations.

The purpose of this report is to provide this information in a format for use by all Department commanders. It is anticipated that the information contained in this annual report will be utilized by commanders when answering statistical questions. Additionally, this information may be used for performance measurement and review regarding a variety of operational issues.

Information is provided regarding administrative investigations, including numbers and types of cases, disciplinary action for sustained cases by violation and by rank, initial inquiries, use of force, pursuit and PIT incidents, cruiser crashes, and summary information concerning subpoenas and civil litigation.

The following information summarizes calendar year 2013 activity:

568 administrative investigations involving 685 employees were conducted in 2013. 258 (45%) of the investigations involved cruiser crashes and/or the operation of police vehicles. The remainder involved a variety of misconduct allegations. 17% of the complaints were initiated by citizens or outside referral, while the remaining 83% were in response to internally generated concerns.

Charges were sustained in 238 (45%) of the cases. Disciplinary actions included; 192 oral reprimands, 39 written reprimands, 10 suspensions, 1 termination, and 6 resignations or retirements in lieu of discipline.

421 initial inquiries or dissatisfaction with service complaints were documented in 2013. 443 use of force incidents were recorded. There were 2 sustained violations for use of excessive force out of 66 investigated cases. Officers were involved in 121 pursuits and utilized the PIT 10 times. 118 (46%) of 258 cruiser crashes were determined to be preventable. 18 law suits or civil claims were filed against the Department. 273 FOIA requests and 858 subpoenas were processed by the Inspections Division.











As used here, a vehicle accident is any occurrence involving the county's owned or operated vehicles producing injury or property damage. Accident claim types as used throughout this report are explained in the examples below. While county vehicles were driven more than 31 million miles and this poses a significant risk, the total incurred is a small portion of overall claim costs. **The number of vehicle claims and costs has been steadily declining.**

Accident rates are useful to analyze a department's safety record and the effectiveness of its training and loss prevention programs. A department's accident rate is influenced by conditions such as the rapid response mode of ambulances, fire trucks and police cruisers, which raise risks that are difficult to control. While this is useful information, the accident rate must be analyzed along with the percentage of total claims to get a true picture of an agency's accident experience.




