INCIDENT: Inmate Injury

**Class I and/or
Class II Charges:**

On above date and approximate time, Inmate McKenna, Natasha #1054527 in 1F05 was yelling and banging on door for the phone. Inmate McKenna then used wet toilet paper and tore up Inmate handbook covered up the window. When PFC Oh and I went to check on Inmate McKenna we told her to take it down. Inmate McKeena refused and demanded that she be allowed to use the phone right away. We told Inmate McKeena that she could use the phone after she took down all the wet toilet paper and Inmate handbook at the window in which she refused to do so. Inmate McKeena then stayed silent for a while without answering any questions or commands given. When PFC Oh opened up the food slot to look inside the cell, Inmate McKenna used her green blanket and sheet to block the food slot so no one could see inside the cell. We told Inmate McKenna multiple times to clean off the window and remove the blanket and the sheet from food slot. Inmate McKenna refused to do so again and again. When PFC Oh tried to pull out the green blanket from one side and then I tried to pull out the sheet from the other, Inmate McKenna was holding down both blanket and sheet inside the cell. PFC Oh was able to pull out the green blanket and I then tried to remove sheet from the food slot. After I removed the sheet from the food slot, Inmate McKenna hold up her finger and said "see what you did to me". I saw one of the Inmate fingers was bleeding. Nurse Kassaye was then paged to 1F05 to check the injured Inmate. Inmate McKenna told nurse Kassaye that she is okay and that she is refusing medical treatment. Forensic staff was also paged on scene to talk to the Inmate at the door and Inmate McKenna told the forensic staff that her finger is okay and that it is an old wound opening up again. Nurse Kassaye advised me that the Inmate came in with that injury. Post 37, Sgt. Timothy was notified of the incident at post 27/1F. All actions taken were for the safety and security of the ADC.

Supervisor's Comments:

Inmate McKenna alleged that her finger was injured while her sheet and blanket were being removed from obstructing the opening of her food slot. Nurse Kassaye responded to 1 F 05 and offered treatment. Inmate McKeena refused his treatment. Dr. Martin of the Forensic staff then made the decision to place Inmate McKeena on R/I. Inmate McKeena hesitantly cooperated and handed over all of her other unauthorized items. Inmate McKeena was given a Suicide Prevention Smock and a Suicide Prevention Blanket. Inmate McKenna is to remain in 1F 05 pending forensics. An Injury Investigation has been completed.

**Class I and/or
Class II Charges:**

On the above date and approximate time Inmate McKenna, Natasha #1054527 housed in 1F_05 began demanding to use the phone and for her pin number which she was given. Inmate McKeena then began banging on the door and demanding to get out and I informed her I have no future court date for her in the computer system. Inmate McKenna then covered her window with pieces of ripped out pages from the Inmate handbook. Inmate McKenna would not take down the papers off of the window and would not respond to any of my questions. I then opened the food slot to get a visual and to speak with Inmate McKenna. Inmate McKenna then took her blanket and sheets trying to cover the food slot opening so we could not see inside. I was able to pull her green blanket out through the food slot. Then PFC Xu went to pull the sheet out and Inmate McKeena grabbed a hold of the other end of the sheet and began pulling. PFC Xu pulled on the sheet two more times and Inmate McKeena released the sheet. Inmate McKenna then stated "look what you did to my finger" while holding her left index finger which was bleeding. I then notified Sgt. Timothy of the behavior of Inmate McKenna.

Inmate McKenna then began tying the other bed sheet to the outside of the food slot in an attempt to close the food slot. Sgt. Timothy and Ms. Martin from the forensics department came to interview Inmate McKenna. Based on Ms. Martin's interview she determined that Inmate McKenna to placed on restricted issue status per forensics. Sgt. Timothy and I spoke with Inmate McKenna for about 20 minutes and gained her cooperation. I then had Inmate McKeena put the other sheet out through the food slot as well as her red shirt and blue shorts. By this time she had already removed the paper covering her window on the cell door. I then gave her a suicide smock and blanket for her safety per forensics. Nurse Kassaye responded to 1 F 05 to check Inmate McKenna's left index finger. Nurse Kassaye said that he remembered Inmate McKenna from the other day and that the injury on her finger was already there when she entered the jail. Nurse Kassay then offered Inmate McKenna treatment in which she refused.

INCIDENT: Irrational Inmate / Use of Force

**Class I and/or
Class II Charges:**

On the above date and approximate time Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) put her mattress in front of the door. Information was passed on from D Squad that Inmate McKenna did the same thing last night but eventually took the mattress down. I instructed the inmate to remove the mattress from the door, but inmate McKenna did not follow directions to pull the mattress down when I ordered her to do so. I called Post 26 and asked PFC Viola to assist MDS Hedrick and I to remove the mattress from in front of the door. I cracked the door and PFC Viola and MDS Hedrick pulled the mattress out of the cell completely. As we attempted to close the door, Inmate McKenna stuck her arms through the open door. Inmate McKenna was able to get her entire body out of the door and began trying to scratch and bite us. MDS Hedrick and PFC Viola took her to the ground into a seated position by pushing down on her shoulders. I then pulled her legs straight out while PFC Viola had control of her upper body and we laid her down on her back. Inmate McKenna was actively attempting to pull her hands free, attempting to bite us, and making odd growling types of noises. MDS Hedrick struck Inmate McKenna in the face with his open left hand to stop her from trying to bite and scratch him. Inmate McKenna continued to actively fight us by attempting to bite and scratch us. PFC Viola delivered a strike to her chest area with the side of his right hand, but could not get her rolled onto her stomach in order to hand cuff her behind her back.

I took control of her feet by holding her ankles with my hands, PFC Viola had control of her arms and MDS Hedrick was in front of the inmate, attempting to control her waist. I then let go of her left ankle and radioed to CB1 for back up to Post 27. Once the call was made, I regained control of her left ankle and awaited backup. When back up arrived and assisted with controlling inmate McKenna, I then stepped out as the over Deputies took control of the inmate. The backup Deputies restrained the inmate and placed her in the restraint chair. After she was placed into the chair, I helped secure the shoulder straps by sliding the straps into the lock at the back of the chair. I then helped control her right hand while PFC Barb removed the handcuff from her wrist. I assisted in tightening the wrist strap around her right wrist. Once her right wrist was secured to the restraint chair, I assisted in controlling her left hand while PFC Barb removed the handcuff from her left wrist. I assisted in tightening the restraint chair strap on her left. Once the inmate was secured in the restraint chair, the straps were then checked by Medical.

All actions taken for the safety and security of Inmate McKenna.

Supervisor's Comments:

Inmate McKenna was actively trying to bite and scratch the deputies that were involved in controlling her. A Use of Force Investigation will be conducted due to amount of force that was needed to control and place inmate McKenna in the restraint chair.

Class II Charges:**

On the above date and approximate time a back-up call was made to post 27. I was on post 5 and responded to see if any assistance was needed. When I entered post 27 I saw Deputy Hedrick holding onto the inmate's body. Deputy Viola and Lt. Holmes were trying to control her head to keep from being bitten by the inmate. Deputy Shifflett had partial control of her legs. I then helped with the control of her legs by stepping on the back of her right knee. When a rip hobble was brought to us, we moved it into position around her knees and secured it.

Sgt. Timothy then coordinated her move to a restraint chair. I controlled her legs and then released them as another Deputy secured them in the chair using the chair leg straps. While the legs were being dealt with, I assumed control of her right arm. Her arms, which were in handcuffs, were pulled up to the right side of her body. This allowed us to place the right wrist into the chair strap and restrain it. Deputy Barb worked the key into the cuffs to release them. Once the cuffs were removed, her right arm was pulled out from behind her and restrained into the chair and then her left arm was restrained into the chair. Other deputies assisting further restrained the inmate in the chair.

On the above date and approximate time, I responded to a deputy assistance call on post 27. Upon arriving on scene, I witnessed Deputies Thompson, Viola and Hedrick struggling with a female inmate on the floor outside 1F05. I immediately attempted to control the inmates head but she was vigorously shaking her head left and right trying to bite me. I was able to stabilize her head against the floor while hand and leg restraints were applied. After she was restrained, I assisted in placing the inmate in the restraint chair by holding a towel over her mouth pulling back on both sides of the towel to keep her head against the restraint chair and to prevent her from biting staff, which she was actively trying do. During this time her nose was not covered allowing her to breath. Another deputy placed a spit net over her head and I continued to control her head with the towel because she was making multiple attempts to lean forward out of the chair. Deputies were able to place her in the restraint chair without incident. After Nurse Kassaye checked the straps, I assisted in transporting inmate McKenna to FR2 where the straps were checked again and a fresh spit net was placed on her head. Upon exiting, I returned to Post 42. All actions were taken for the safety and security of the ADC.

**Class I and/or
Class II Charges:**

On the above date location and approximate time Deputy Thompson informed me that PFC Viola and herself were going to remove a mattress from an inmate in 1F5. Deputy Thompson and I were assigned to Post 27 for this shift. Our pass on from the previous shift was that this inmate has been placing her mattress on her cell door covering the window so we couldn't see inside of her cell. I followed Deputy Thompson and PFC Viola to assist in removing the mattress covering the window. Our intentions were to quickly open the door enough to remove the mattress.

Deputy Thompson opened the door and PFC Viola and I grabbed the mattress and pulled to remove it. Inmate McKenna had ahold of the mattress as if she was attached to it. Her body broke the outside barrier of her cell-door. We attempted to force her back into her cell by pushing her body back. Inmate McKenna resisted immediately with all her force. Her body went toward the ground with her lying on her back outside of her cell where she was violently attempting to bite, claw and kick us in an enraged out of control state of mind.

Inmate McKenna did not respond to our commands repeatedly for her to stop resisting and attempting to bite. I attempted to keep her head back as she was biting PFC Viola's jacket sleeve of his left arm. I could not keep her from biting by pushing on her head so I applied an open hand strike to her forehead area, it did not stop her attempts to bite us. I kept repeating don't let her bite you. I then struck inmate McKenna several more times in the forehead area with an open hand to stop her from attempting to bite at myself and PFC Viola. Inmate McKenna did not stop and as I was trying to restrain her and keep her from biting, she scratched me in the face and forearms. Deputy Thompson called for back up. When assistance arrived I had my arms around her right thigh and both of my hands holding her right hand, then several deputies took over and eventually placed inmate McKenna in the restraint chair.

**Class I and/or
Class II Charges:**

On the above date and approximate time while working post 26 1C, I was called over to post 27 1F by PFC Thompson to assist with removing a mattress from the cell of inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) because she was using the mattress to block her cell window. MDS Hedrick, PFC Thompson and I approached the cell and when PFC Thompson opened the cell door, I quickly grabbed the mattress with both hands and removed it. While doing this, inmate McKenna was able to exit the cell. As she exited, she was very aggressive forcing her way out as PFC Thompson attempted to secure the cell door. As inmate McKenna exited, she attempted to grab and scratch at me. In response, I attempted to push her back into the cell, at which time inmate McKenna fell to the floor. While on the floor, she was very combative and attempted to hit and scratch MDS Hedrick and myself and attempted to bite and spit on us.

Due to her behavior, I secured her head with both of my hands pinning it to the floor to prevent her from spitting which she was also attempting to do. As I was holding her head, she was attempting to kick and hit both PFC Thompson and MDS Hedrick. PFC Thompson and MDS Hedrick were attempting to turn inmate McKenna over on her stomach in order to apply hand restraints. Throughout this whole process, commands were giving to her to stop resisting and comply with the directives for her to turn over on her stomach. In the process of trying to control inmate McKenna she was being actively assaultive and did try numerous times to bite and spit on me.

I did not notice it at the time, but later it was apparent that inmate McKenna had scratched MDS Hedrick many times on his arms as well as on his face. While wrestling and attempting to control the inmate I delivered one closed fist strike to her sternum area with my right hand while she was on her back in order to prevent her from striking me in my face or scratching me because she was actively flailing her arms and attempting to strike me.

Due to the aggressiveness of inmate McKenna, a backup call was placed for assistance in order to aid in the situation. Once backup arrived I then assisted in holding inmate McKenna's head steady and placed a spit net over her head, and secured it. I assisted in placing her in the restraint chair by placing both of my hands just below her shoulders and pushed her into the chair in order to tighten the waist restraint. While in the restraint chair, inmate McKenna continued her assaultive behavior attempting to use her feet and toe nails trying to scratch at my legs. After the waist restraint was secured, I used three knuckle strikes with my right hand to her right elbow in order to cause her to loosen her hand, which she had balled up in a fist so that her right wrist could be securely fastened in the restraint chair. Once her hand was restrained, I stepped back from the scene and allowed other deputies to complete the restraining process. All actions were taken for the safety and security of the ADC.

INCIDENT: Supplement to Report #48005

Class I and/or Class II Charges: None

On the above date and approximate time when I arrived to Post 27, I noticed that several deputies had an inmate on the floor in front of 1F05 cell. The deputies were ordering her to stop resisting, stop kicking, stop trying to bite, and for her to place her hands behind her back. Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) was not complying to any of the deputies orders. I noticed that Inmate McKenna's right arm was not controlled by anyone, so I grabbed control of her right arm and secured it against the floor to prevent her from striking anyone.

Inmate McKenna continued to struggle and kick while several of us deputies were attempting to secure her left arm and both of her feet. I noticed that Inmate McKenna was attempting to bite the deputy that was to my right. With an open palm, I struck Inmate McKenna's right jaw stopping her from biting the deputy. I then maintained control of her head by pressing her head down against the floor so that she was not able to move her head side to side.

The other deputies around me were constantly communicating as to how to stop her from kicking, how to have her place her hands behind her back, who was going to put the rip hobble on and to get the restraint chair. Once we all had control of inmate McKenna, wrist restraints were applied, the rip hobble was secured to her legs eliminating her from kicking and to stop her from attempting to roll around. Another deputy applied a Spit Net. She then began to bang her head on the floor. We all continued to hold her legs, arms and head preventing her from moving. Once the order was given we lifted Inmate McKenna into the restraint chair. Once she was in the chair, I secured her head by turning her face to her left and maintained pressure against the right side of her face by pushing her head back against the padded area of the restraint chair. She tried to turn her head to her right attempting to spit and bite at the deputies through the Spit Net. I continued to hold her head back by maintaining pressure as she continually tried to turn head and bite at us through the Spit Net until the deputies were able to remove the wrist restraints, secure her arms, legs and shoulders. While I maintained pressure against Inmate McKenna's face I observed that she continued to breath forcefully through the Spit Net while trying to open and close her mouth.

During this entire incident Inmate McKenna never stopped resisting and did not follow and orders given by any of us deputies

Class II Charges:**

On the above date and approximate time I responded to a "Deputy needs assistance" call to post 27. When I arrived on scene, I noticed two or three deputies trying to control Inmate McKenna on the floor just outside of 1F05. At that time, Inmate McKenna was positioned face down on the floor and appeared to be actively resisting by flailing around while the deputies were trying to control her. I quickly ran over to the deputies and immediately took control of Inmate McKenna's left arm while she was lying on the floor face down. I then used both of my hands and took a more firm grasp of Inmate McKenna's left forearm and placed her arm/hand to the "small" of her back. At that time she began to try and grab at my hands and tried to pull away from my grasp. I then used my body weight to keep her left arm pinned in that position until her legs were under control. Once her legs were under control, I placed hand restraints on her left wrist. I then told the deputy who had control of her right arm to place her right arm behind her back. I then placed her right arm in hand restraints and then double locked them. I kept her hands pinned behind her back until the other deputies were ready to assist Inmate McKenna to her feet and place her in the restraint chair. She continued to actively resist by squirming around and trying to pull away from our control.

I assisted Inmate McKenna to her feet by picking her up by her left upper arm and with the assistance of other deputies. We immediately attempted to sit her in the restraint chair in which she continuously struggled with us. During this time I maintained my position to her left side. Once Inmate McKenna's right arm was secured to the chair I was told that her left arm was coming free from the handcuff and from behind her back. I again took control of her left arm and placed it flat on the armrest of the restraint chair and underneath the nylon strap. I then secured the strap and announced "left arm secure." I then assisted with the securement of the shoulder straps. Nurse Kassaye responded and checked all of the restraints for proper fit.

Inmate McKenna was then taken to Female Receiving in the restraint chair and placed in FR2. Nurse Kassaye responded to that location and checked Inmate McKenna's restraints once again.

Class II Charges:**

On above date and approximate time I responded to Post 27 following a request for immediate deputy back-up via the radio. I was assigned to Post 22 (Property) and left from my office to assist. When I arrived at Post 27, I saw MDS Hedrick, PFC Thompson, and PFC Viola struggling to gain control of inmate McKenna, Natasha (#1054527). I immediately came to the aid of my fellow deputies in an effort to restrain inmate McKenna. My first action was to help control her left arm because she was face up. At this time she was actively trying to bite and spit on all deputies present. I was giving directives to all involved that we need to turn her over (stomach down) so we can properly restrain her. I maintained control of the left side (to include her left arm) until we turned her over, which I then transitioned to her right arm. Due to not having protective gloves on at this point, I had MDS Reeves properly relieve me so I could retrieve appropriate gear. I noticed that there was blood on her hands and that some scabs or sores were bleeding slightly. I thoroughly washed my hands before returning to assist with this incident.

At this point inmate McKenna was restrained and I assisted with lifting inmate McKenna up off of the ground and into the Restraint Chair. She attempted to stand up and prevent us from placing her into the nylon restraints. With the assistance of Sgt. Timothy, I was able to place the nylon waist strap securely across her hips. Inmate McKenna was attempting to kick, grab, spit, bite, and even head-butt deputies as we were restraining her. As all restraints were being securely fastened, I oversaw the actions to provide any necessary assistance due the small amount of space to operate. I assisted with tightening/securing of all nylon straps. It started with having her legs secured into the chair, followed by her arms, and then followed by her shoulders to completely restrain her. I double checked that all necessary adjustments were made on all straps to ensure proper fit. Nurse Kassaye evaluated the tightness of all restraints and verified that inmate McKenna was properly secured.

Once inmate McKenna was completely restrained, seen by medical, and all gear was collected I cleared the scene. No further actions were taken by me in this incident. All actions were taken for the Safety and Security of the ADC.

I took control of Inmate McKenna's right leg as all deputies began to turn her over in an effort to place her in hand restraints. As we turned her face down Inmate McKenna continued to tense her body. Inmate McKenna continued to jerk her arms and legs with so much force that I had to place my right foot with all of my body weight pressing down on her legs to control them. After a struggle, we were able to place her in hand restraints and a rip hobble around her legs above the knees. A spit net was also utilized at this time due to Inmate McKenna attempting to spit on deputies.

I then assisted with placing Inmate McKenna in the restraint chair. Inmate McKenna continued to twist and thrash her body around in an effort to prevent us from placing her in the restraint chair. My assistance consisted with gaining control of, and placing Inmate McKenna's legs and hands in the webbed restraints of the chair. During all interactions with Inmate McKenna, she continuously tried to bite and scratch all deputies involved.

On the above date and approximate time, SERT was activated by 2nd Lt. Hunt. The mission was to place Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) back into the restraint chair because she had freed her right arm. Inmate McKenna was already known for her irrational behavior (report # 47924) and was involved in a use of force this morning, pending investigation.

A briefing was conducted in the SERT office and all pertinent details were discussed to properly prepare all operators for the mission. Precautions were that the inmate is a spitter, biter, scratcher, kicker, and possible bio hazard.

The following assignments were given to the operators on scene:

- Team Leader – SGT Timothy (Legs)
- 1- MDS Meeks (Head)
- 2- PFC Shifflett (Right Arm)
- 3- PFC Kim (Right Arm)
- 4- PFC Barb (Left Arm)
- 5- MDS Reeves (Camera)

SGT Timothy made a call to CB1 advising to stop all inmate movement in Female Receiving. He then escorted the team from the SERT office over to FR 2. We observed Inmate McKenna's right arm was out of the restraint and she was shaking violently to free herself from the restraint chair. The team stacked up in the hall as SGT Timothy opened the cell door. MDS Meeks quickly secured her head with a towel on the mouth and chin area to prevent the inmate from spitting and biting the team. But inmate McKenna opened her mouth as wide as she could and bit the towel. PFC Shifflett and I secured her right arm but she continued to resist. PFC Barb ordered the inmate to stop the resisting but she resisted even more. We took control of her right arm and secured it on the arm rest, but the nylon restraint wouldn't stay secured. The decision was made to move her from the current restraint chair to another.

To give us more room to operate, we moved the inmate to the female changing room (F11). As we prepared to take her out of the restraint chair, inmate McKenna got even more violent. She tried to spit at us and grab hold of our hands whenever we tried to unsecure her. Multiple orders were given to stop the resisting but she didn't comply. At one point, the inmate appeared passed out for about few seconds but regained consciousness and started to act violent again.

With her head still secured by MDS Meeks, SGT. Timothy and I unsecured her left arm and placed it on the small of her back and PFC Barb placed the hand restraint on it. PFC Shifflett and MDS Reeves then unsecured her right arm and placed in on the small of her back and PFC Barb placed the hand restraints. PFC Shifflett and I then placed the leg restraints on her and unsecured her legs from the restraint chair. MDS Reeves unsecured her waist and shoulder from the restraint chair and we lifted the inmate up from one restraint chair to the other.

On the above date and approximate time, I was advised of an exposure incident involving MDS Hedrick #0670. MDS Hedrick was interviewed by me in the squad conference room and filled out the appropriate paper work for exposures. MDS Hedrick sustained multiple deep scratches to both forearms and one to the left side of his face. This occurred during a use of force with Inmate McKenna, Natasha #1054527 at post 27 (1F) where the inmate used her fingernails to inflict these injuries. Inmate McKenna had blood on her hands during the use of force. This is the reason for considering this to be an exposure event.

With this information, I contacted the on call Infection Control Practitioner Dr. Ambardar with IDP. Dr. Ambardar advised me that this is to be considered a low risk exposure. However, proper testing should proceed.

I attempted to receive consent to collect a blood sample from Inmate McKenna. Due to Inmate McKenna's irrational behavior, this was unsuccessful. This was discussed with Lt. Perkins and it was decided to pursue a court order to obtain a blood sample from Inmate McKenna for testing. I contacted Fairfax County General District Judge McDonough, through which a court order was successfully obtained.

After returning to the ADC with the court order in hand, D-Squad supervisors and Medical staff performed the blood draw from the source, inmate McKenna in FR-2. I then submitted the blood samples and appropriate paperwork to the Fairfax Hospital Lab for analysis.

2/1/2015

The following morning I followed up with Dr. Ambardar with IDP. She advised me that the results for Inmate McKenna had already returned to her. I then notified all appropriate parties of the findings. Due to the results MDS Hedrick was advised that his blood draw was no longer required.

2/4/2015

Dr. Ambardar faxed lab results to me to be included in with the exposure paperwork.

All actions were taken for the safety and security of the ADC.

On the above date and approximate time Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) put her mattress in front of the door. Information was passed on from D Squad that Inmate McKenna did the same thing last night but eventually took the mattress down. I instructed the inmate to remove the mattress from the door, but inmate McKenna did not follow directions to pull the mattress down when I ordered her to do so. I called Post 26 and asked PFC Viola to assist MDS Hedrick and I to remove the mattress from in front of the door. I cracked the door and PFC Viola and MDS Hedrick pulled the mattress out of the cell completely. As we attempted to close the door, Inmate McKenna stuck her arms through the open door. Inmate McKenna was able to get her entire body out of the door and began trying to scratch and bite us. MDS Hedrick and PFC Viola took her to the ground into a seated position by pushing down on her shoulders. I then pulled her legs straight out while PFC Viola had control of her upper body and we laid her down on her back. Inmate McKenna was actively attempting to pull her hands free, attempting to bite us, and making odd growling types of noises. MDS Hedrick struck Inmate McKenna in the face with his open left hand to stop her from trying to bite and scratch him. Inmate McKenna continued to actively fight us by attempting to bite and scratch us. PFC Viola delivered a strike to her chest area with the side of his right hand, but could not get her rolled onto her stomach in order to hand cuff her behind her back.

I took control of her feet by holding her ankles with my hands, PFC Viola had control of her arms and MDS Hedrick was in front of the inmate, attempting to control her waist. I then let go of her left ankle and radioed to CB1 for back up to Post 27. Once the call was made, I regained control of her left ankle and awaited backup. When back up arrived and assisted with controlling inmate McKenna, I then stepped out as the over Deputies took control of the inmate. The backup Deputies restrained the inmate and placed her in the restraint chair. After she was placed into the chair, I helped secure the shoulder straps by sliding the straps into the lock at the back of the chair. I then helped control her right hand while PFC Barb removed the handcuff from her wrist. I assisted in tightening the wrist strap around her right wrist. Once her right wrist was secured to the restraint chair, I assisted in controlling her left hand while PFC Barb removed the handcuff from her left wrist. I assisted in tightening the restraint chair strap on her left. Once the inmate was secured in the restraint chair, the straps were then checked by Medical.

All actions taken for the safety and security of Inmate McKenna.

Deputy Thompson and I were assigned to Post 27 for this shift. Our pass on from the previous shift was that this inmate has been placing her mattress on her cell door covering the window so we couldn't see inside of her cell. I followed Deputy Thompson and PFC Viola to assist in removing the mattress covering the window. Our intentions were to quickly open the door enough to remove the mattress.

Deputy Thompson opened the door and PFC Viola and I grabbed the mattress and pulled to remove it. Inmate McKenna had ahold of the mattress as if she was attached to it. Her body broke the outside barrier of her cell door. We attempted to force her back into her cell by pushing her body back. Inmate McKenna resisted immediately with all her force. Her body went toward the ground with her lying on her back outside of her cell where she was violently attempting to bite, claw and kick us in an enraged out of control state of mind.

Inmate McKenna did not respond to our commands repeatedly for her to stop resisting and attempting to bite. I attempted to keep her head back as she was biting PFC Viola's jacket sleeve of his left arm. I could not keep her from biting by pushing on her head so I applied an open hand strike to her forehead area, it did not stop her attempts to bite us. I kept repeating don't let her bite you. I then struck inmate McKenna several more times in the forehead area with an open hand to stop her from attempting to bite at myself and PFC Viola. Inmate McKenna did not stop and as I was trying to restrain her and keep her from biting, she scratched me in the face and forearms. Deputy Thompson called for back up. When assistance arrived I had my arms around her right thigh and both of my hands holding her right hand, then several deputies took over and eventually placed inmate McKenna in the restraint chair.

On the above date and approximate time while working post 26 1C, I was called over to post 27 1F by PFC Thompson to assist with removing a mattress from the cell of inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) because she was using the mattress to block her cell window. MDS Hedrick, PFC Thompson and I approached the cell and when PFC Thompson opened the cell door, I quickly grabbed the mattress with both hands and removed it. While doing this, inmate McKenna was able to exit the cell. As she exited, she was very aggressive forcing her way out as PFC Thompson attempted to secure the cell door. As inmate McKenna exited, she attempted to grab and scratch at me. In response, I attempted to push her back into the cell, at which time inmate McKenna fell to the floor. While on the floor, she was very combative and attempted to hit and scratch MDS Hedrick and myself and attempted to bite and spit on us.

Due to her behavior, I secured her head with both of my hands pinning it to the floor to prevent her from spitting which she was also attempting to do. As I was holding her head, she was attempting to kick and hit both PFC Thompson and MDS Hedrick. PFC Thompson and MDS Hedrick were attempting to turn inmate McKenna over on her stomach in order to apply hand restraints. Throughout this whole process, commands were giving to her to stop resisting and comply with the directives for her to turn over on her stomach. In the process of trying to control inmate McKenna she was being actively assaultive and did try numerous times to bite and spit on me.

I did not notice it at the time, but later it was apparent that inmate McKenna had scratched MDS Hedrick many times on his arms as well as on his face. While wrestling and attempting to control the inmate I delivered one closed fist strike to her sternum area with my right hand while she was on her back in order to prevent her from striking me in my face or scratching me because she was actively flailing her arms and attempting to strike me.

Due to the aggressiveness of inmate McKenna, a backup call was placed for assistance in order to aid in the situation. Once backup arrived I then assisted in holding inmate McKenna's head steady and placed a spit net over her head, and secured it. I assisted in placing her in the restraint chair by placing both of my hands just below her shoulders and pushed her into the chair in order to tighten the waist restraint. While in the restraint chair, inmate McKenna continued her assaultive behavior attempting to use her feet and toe nails trying to scratch at my legs. After the waist restraint was secured, I used three knuckle strikes with my right hand to her right elbow in order to cause her to loosen her hand, which she had balled up in a fist so that her right wrist could be securely fastened in the restraint chair. Once her hand was restrained, I stepped back from the scene and allowed other deputies to complete the restraining process. All actions were taken for the safety and security of the ADC.

On the above date and approximate time when I arrived to Post 27, I noticed that several deputies had an inmate on the floor in front of 1F05 cell. The deputies were ordering her to stop resisting, stop kicking, stop trying to bite, and for her to place her hands behind her back. Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) was not complying to any of the deputies orders. I noticed that Inmate McKenna's right arm was not controlled by anyone, so I grabbed control of her right arm and secured it against the floor to prevent her from striking anyone.

Inmate McKenna continued to struggle and kick while several of us deputies were attempting to secure her left arm and both of her feet. I noticed that Inmate McKenna was attempting to bite the deputy that was to my right. With an open palm, I struck Inmate McKenna's right jaw stopping her from biting the deputy. I then maintained control of her head by pressing her head down against the floor so that she was not able to move her head side to side.

The other deputies around me were constantly communicating as to how to stop her from kicking, how to have her place her hands behind her back, who was going to put the rip hobble on and to get the restraint chair. Once we all had control of inmate McKenna, wrist restraints were applied, the rip hobble was secured to her legs eliminating her from kicking and to stop her from attempting to roll around. Another deputy applied a Spit Net. She then began to bang her head on the floor. We all continued to hold her legs, arms and head preventing her from moving. Once the order was given we lifted Inmate McKenna into the restraint chair. Once she was in the chair, I secured her head by turning her face to her left and maintained pressure against the right side of her face by pushing her head back against the padded area of the restraint chair. She tried to turn her head to her right attempting to spit and bite at the deputies through the Spit Net. I continued to hold her head back by maintaining pressure as she continually tried to turn head and bite at us through the Spit Net until the deputies were able to remove the wrist restraints, secure her arms, legs and shoulders. While I maintained pressure against Inmate McKenna's face I observed that she continued to breath forcefully through the Spit Net while trying to open and close her mouth.

During this entire incident Inmate McKenna never stopped resisting and did not follow and orders given by any of us deputies

When I arrived on scene, I noticed two or three deputies trying to control Inmate McKenna on the floor just outside of 1F05. At that time, Inmate McKenna was positioned face down on the floor and appeared to be actively resisting by flailing around while the deputies were trying to control her. I quickly ran over to the deputies and immediately took control of Inmate McKenna's left arm while she was lying on the floor face down. I then used both of my hands and took a more firm grasp of Inmate McKenna's left forearm and placed her arm/hand to the "small" of her back. At that time she began to try and grab at my hands and tried to pull away from my grasp. I then used my body weight to keep her left arm pinned in that position until her legs were under control. Once her legs were under control, I placed hand restraints on her left wrist. I then told the deputy who had control of her right arm to place her right arm behind her back. I then placed her right arm in hand restraints and then double locked them. I kept her hands pinned behind her back until the other deputies were ready to assist Inmate McKenna to her feet and place her in the restraint chair. She continued to actively resist by squirming around and trying to pull away from our control.

I assisted Inmate McKenna to her feet by picking her up by her left upper arm and with the assistance of other deputies. We immediately attempted to sit her in the restraint chair in which she continuously struggled with us. During this time I maintained my position to her left side. Once Inmate McKenna's right arm was secured to the chair I was told that her left arm was coming free from the handcuff and from behind her back. I again took control of her left arm and placed it flat on the armrest of the restraint chair and underneath the nylon strap. I then secured the strap and announced "left arm secure." On above date and approximate time I responded to Post 27 following a request for immediate deputy back-up via the radio. I was assigned to Post 22 (Property) and left from my office to assist. When I arrived at Post 27, I saw MDS Hedrick, PFC Thompson, and PFC Viola struggling to gain control of inmate McKenna, Natasha (#1054527). I immediately came to the aid of my fellow deputies in an effort to restrain inmate McKenna. My first action was to help control her left arm because she was face up. At this time she was actively trying to bite and spit on all deputies present. I was giving directives to all involved that we need to turn her over (stomach down) so we can properly restrain her. I maintained control of the left side (to include her left arm) until we turned her over, which I then transitioned to her right arm. Due to not having protective gloves on at this point, I had MDS Reeves properly relieve me so I could retrieve appropriate gear. I noticed that there was blood on her hands and that some scabs or sores were bleeding slightly. I thoroughly washed my hands before returning to assist with this incident.

At this point inmate McKenna was restrained and I assisted with lifting inmate McKenna up off of the ground and into the Restraint Chair. She attempted to stand up and prevent us from placing her into the nylon restraints. With the assistance of Sgt. Timothy, I was able to place the nylon waist strap securely across her hips. Inmate McKenna was attempting to kick, grab, spit, bite, and even head-butt deputies as we were restraining her. As all restraints were being securely fastened, I oversaw the actions to provide any necessary assistance due the small amount of space to operate. I assisted with tightening/securing of all nylon straps. It started with having her legs secured into the chair, followed by her arms, and then followed by her shoulders to completely restrain her. I double checked that all necessary adjustments were made on all straps to ensure proper fit. Nurse Kassaye evaluated the tightness of all restraints and verified that inmate McKenna was properly secured.

Once inmate McKenna was completely restrained, seen by medical, and all gear was collected I cleared the scene. No further actions were taken by me in this incident. All actions were taken for the Safety and Security of the ADC.

I responded to Post 27 to assist where I observed multiple deputies attempting to restrain Inmate McKenna (1054527). At this time Inmate McKenna was on her back. I began to assist MDS Steinbach with controlling Inmate McKenna's legs. I took control of Inmate McKenna's right leg as all deputies began to turn her over in an effort to place her in hand restraints. As we turned her face down Inmate McKenna continued to tense her body. Inmate McKenna continued to jerk her arms and legs with so much force that I had to place my right foot with all of my body weight pressing down on her legs to control them. After a struggle, we were able to place her in hand restraints and a rip hobble around her legs above the knees. A spit net was also utilized at this time due to Inmate McKenna attempting to spit on deputies.

I then assisted with placing Inmate McKenna in the restraint chair. Inmate McKenna continued to twist and thrash her body around in an effort to prevent us from placing her in the restraint chair. My assistance consisted with gaining control of, and placing Inmate McKenna's legs and hands in the webbed restraints of the chair. During all interactions with Inmate McKenna, she continuously tried to bite and scratch all deputies involved.

On the above date and approximate time, SERT was activated by 2nd Lt. Hunt. The mission was to place Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) back into the restraint chair because she had freed her right arm. Inmate McKenna was already known for her irrational behavior (report # 47924) and was involved in a use of force this morning, pending investigation.

A briefing was conducted in the SERT office and all pertinent details were discussed to properly prepare all operators for the mission. Precautions were that the inmate is a spitter, biter, scratcher, kicker, and possible bio hazard.

The following assignments were given to the operators on scene:

Team Leader – SGT Timothy (Legs)

- 1- MDS Meeks (Head)
- 2- PFC Shifflett (Right Arm)
- 3- PFC Kim (Right Arm)
- 4- PFC Barb (Left Arm)
- 5- MDS Reeves (Camera)

SGT Timothy made a call to CB1 advising to stop all inmate movement in Female Receiving. He then escorted the team from the SERT office over to FR 2. We observed Inmate McKenna's right arm was out of the restraint and she was shaking violently to free herself from the restraint chair. The team stacked up in the hall as SGT Timothy opened the cell door. MDS Meeks quickly secured her head with a towel on the mouth and chin area to prevent the inmate from spitting and biting the team. But inmate McKenna opened her mouth as wide as she could and bit the towel. PFC Shifflett and I secured her right arm but she continued to resist. PFC Barb ordered the inmate to stop the resisting but she resisted even more. We took control of her right arm and secured it on the arm rest, but the nylon restraint wouldn't stay secured. The decision was made to move her from the current restraint chair to another.

To give us more room to operate, we moved the inmate to the female changing room (F11). As we prepared to take her out of the restraint chair, inmate McKenna got even more violent. She tried to spit at us and grab hold of our hands whenever we tried to unsecure her. Multiple orders were given to stop the resisting but she didn't comply. At one point, the inmate appeared passed out for about few seconds but regained consciousness and started to act violent again.

With her head still secured by MDS Meeks, SGT. Timothy and I unsecured her left arm and placed it on the small of her back and PFC Barb placed the hand restraint on it. PFC Shifflett and MDS Reeves then unsecured her right arm and placed in on the small of her back and PFC Barb placed the hand restraints. PFC Shifflett and I then placed the leg restraints on her and unsecured her legs from the restraint chair. MDS Reeves unsecured her waist and shoulder from the restraint chair and we lifted the inmate up from one restraint chair to the other.

On the above date and approximate time, I was advised of an exposure incident involving MDS Hedrick #0670. MDS Hedrick was interviewed by me in the squad conference room and filled out the appropriate paper work for exposures. MDS Hedrick sustained multiple deep scratches to both forearms and one to the left side of his face. This occurred during a use of force with Inmate McKenna, Natasha #1054527 at post 27 (1F) where the inmate used her fingernails to inflict these injuries. Inmate McKenna had blood on her hands during the use of force. This is the reason for considering this to be an exposure event.

With this information, I contacted the on call Infection Control Practitioner Dr. Ambardar with IDP. Dr. Ambardar advised me that this is to be considered a low risk exposure. However, proper testing should proceed.

I attempted to receive consent to collect a blood sample from Inmate McKenna. Due to Inmate McKenna's irrational behavior, this was unsuccessful. This was discussed with Lt. Perkins and it was decided to pursue a court order to obtain a blood sample from Inmate McKenna for testing. I contacted Fairfax County General District Judge McDonough, through which a court order was successfully obtained.

After returning to the ADC with the court order in hand, D-Squad supervisors and Medical staff performed the blood draw from the source, inmate McKenna in FR-2. I then submitted the blood samples and appropriate paperwork to the Fairfax Hospital Lab for analysis.

2/1/2015

The following morning I followed up with Dr. Ambardar with IDP. She advised me that the results for Inmate McKenna had already returned to her. I then notified all appropriate parties of the findings. Due to the results MDS Hedrick was advised that his blood draw was no longer required.

2/4/2015

Dr. Ambardar faxed lab results to me to be included in with the exposure paperwork.

All actions were taken for the safety and security of the ADC.

Supervisor's Comments:

Workman's Comp claim to Corvel was submitted on the behalf of MDS Hedrick, although he required no medical treatment. All forms to include this report will be forwarded to Lt. Smith for review.

INCIDENT: SERT Activation - Cell Extraction

**Class I and/or
Class II Charges:**

On the above date and approximate time SERT was activated by Lt. Perkins to extract Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) from FR02 and move her to the transportation van so that Transportation could take her to Alexandria. Inmate McKenna had created a biohazard in her cell with urine and she was spreading urine out from under the door to her cell. She was refusing to follow orders and had been combative with deputies over the last several days causing an injury to a deputy. She is considered by Mental Health Staff to be seriously mentally ill.

The team assembled in the SERT Office at 1000 hrs and assignments were given out as follows:

- Door - 2nd Lt. Miller
- Shield - PFC J. Perryman
- #2 - PFC Henry
- #3 - MDS McPartlin
- #4 MDS Krstulovic
- #5/Taser - Lt. Salzman (Team Leader)

At approximately 1035hrs 2nd Lt Miller responded to Post 4 and was able to convince Inmate McKenna to put her hands through the food slot and be handcuffed. She was secured to the door handle with a Ripp Hobble Restraint. 2nd Lt. Miller notified the team, who were finishing suiting up in protective gear (Tyvek suits, helmets, gas masks). The team responded to Post 4 and attempted to remove Inmate McKenna from the cell while she was restrained through to door. As the door opened Inmate McKenna was standing up and attempting to pull her hands back through the food slot. She refused orders to stop resisting and to get on her knees. PFC Perryman used the shield to pin her to the door so that team members could attempt to place leg restraints on her. Inmate McKenna actively refused attempts to put leg restraints on her by pulling her legs away and kicking. The team tried to place her in a kneeling position but she resisted. Team members were able to grab her legs and pull them out from under her, placing her on the ground on her side. She continued to actively resist, pulling and kicking with her legs and pulling her arms, throughout this process. After several minutes team members were able to gain control of her legs and place leg restraints, double locked, on her. The application of leg restraints did little to stop her from pulling her legs, kicking, and contorting her whole body in an attempt to resist.

Using a combination of leg restraints and two deputies, MDS Krstulovic and MDS McPartlin, the team was able to control her legs enough to now attempt to place her in hand restraints connected to a leather waist chain. First, the Ripp Hobble Restraint that was securing Inmate McKenna through the food slot was removed. 2nd Lt. Miller passed of control of her arms to PFC Henry and PFC Perryman, who was also maintaining control of her head. Throughout this entire process Inmate McKenna continued to resist. I ordered her to "stop resisting" several times and she did not comply. 2nd Lt. Miller and PFC Henry, with the assistance of the other team members were able to remove her hands, one at a time, and place them in the restraints that were connected to the leather waist chain. This was done over the period of several minutes as Inmate McKenna continued to resist and attempt to pull her hands always from deputies and place them under her body. She also continued to move her legs and use the leverage gained by planting her legs to

twist and contort her body despite the fact that her legs were in leg restraints and being held down by two deputies.

Once Inmate McKenna's wrists were secured to the leather belt it became apparent that due to her current level of resistance, we would not be able to move her using that as a restraint option. The leather belt was on the last notch and she was able to pull her hands up to shoulder height. She was continuing to twist her body and try to pull her hands out of the restraints. She was also continuing to attempt to kick the deputies holding her feet.

At this point 2nd Lt. Miller and PFC Henry transitioned both of Inmate McKenna's hands from the leather waist belt hand restraints to handcuffs behind her back. During this process Inmate McKenna continued to struggle against the deputies trying to pull her hands under her body and away from the deputies. She also continued to try to pull her legs and feet free. PFC Perryman maintained control of Inmate McKenna's head during this process. I explained to Inmate McKenna that we were going to place her in hand restraints and ordered her to put her hands behind her back when they came free from the waist belt. Inmate McKenna did not comply and continued to resist. 2nd Lt. Miller and PFC Henry needed assistance from PFC Perryman and I in order to secure both of Inmate McKenna's hands behind her back in hand restraints, double locked. The Ripp Hobble, which had been secured around her ankles in order to try to prevent her from kicking, was then attached to the hand restraints. While still on the ground, a Spit Net spit hood was placed over Inmate McKenna's head in order to prevent her from spitting when we tried to sit her up.

Despite being restrained with hand restraints behind her back, leg restraints, and a Ripp Hobble around her ankles and attached to her handcuffs, Inmate McKenna continued to actively resist, twisting and contorting her body, tensing up, and trying to kick out her feet. The team lifted Inmate McKenna off the ground and attempted to place her in the medical transport chair. Inmate McKenna was jerking her head from side to side, and continuing to twist and contort her body. I ordered her several times to sit in the chair and stop resisting. Inmate McKenna did not comply. At this point we made the decision to use the restraint chair to move Inmate McKenna from Female Receiving to the transport van due to her continued level of resistance.

The team lifted Inmate McKenna and attempted to place her in the restraint chair. I ordered her to slide back and sit in the chair. She did not comply. Inmate McKenna continued to twist and contort her body and lock her legs out so that she could not be secured in the chair. When Inmate McKenna did bend her knees, which she did multiple times, it was only to then kick her feet out at the deputies. At this point I told Inmate McKenna that, if she did not comply with our orders and sit in the chair I would deploy the Taser. Inmate McKenna continued to resist. I removed the cartridge from the Taser and deployed one drive stun to Inmate McKenna's right quad. After the drive stun was complete, 5 seconds, I again ordered Inmate McKenna to slide back into the chair and allow the deputies to secure her feet, giving her time to comply which she did not. MDS McPartlin and MDS Krstulovic then attempted to force Inmate McKenna's feet into a position where she could be secured in the chair. Inmate McKenna continued to lock her legs out and refuse orders. I then placed a cartridge in the Taser and deployed the Taser again to the same spot, this time deploying the darts into Inmate McKenna's right quad. After this second deployment, I again gave Inmate McKenna a chance to comply and she again refused. She continued to actively resist and attempt to kick the deputies. Due to her level of resistance we were not able to get her into a position where we could safely transport her to receiving.

After allowing Inmate McKenna time to comply and/or recover from the previous Taser deployment and still being unable to gain her compliance and put her into a secure position, with the darts still in her right quad, I placed the Taser against Inmate McKenna's right

triceps. I announced that I was going to deploy the Taser again, this time with a spread between where the darts were and where the Taser was so that we would be able to gain neuromuscular incapacitation. I deployed the Taser and it cycled for 5 seconds. I announced to the team members when the Taser was going to be finished cycling so that they would be able to take control of Inmate McKenna as soon as the cycle completed which is when the body is most likely to relax. When the 5 seconds was up, Inmate McKenna's body did relax and the deputies were able to move her legs into a position where they could attempt to secure them to the chair. I ordered Inmate McKenna to slide back in the chair and stop resisting. Before MDS McPartlin and MDS Krstulovic were able to secure her legs Inmate McKenna began kicking her feet at them. She was able to lock her legs back out and get herself back into a position where we were unable to secure her safely in the chair. I allowed for enough time to go by so that Inmate McKenna could recover from the Taser deployment and to give her opportunity to comply. MDS McPartlin and MDS Krstulovic continued attempting to move her legs into position without success. I then deployed the Taser again to the same spot in her right arm with the darts still in her right quad. At the end of the 5 second deployment Inmate McKenna's body relaxed again and MDS McPartlin and MDS Krstulovic were able to put her legs into position to be secure to the chair. Inmate McKenna continued to resist, attempting to straighten her legs, but was unable to lock them out before the deputies secured her legs to the restraint chair. We were then able to slide her into position so that the waist belt could be secured enough to hold her into the chair.

With Inmate McKenna secured in hand restraints behind her back, waist belt on restraint chair, leg restraints and Ripp Hobble on ankles, and the nylon leg restraints of the restraint chair secured, she continued to attempt to resist. She was trying to turn and twist her body and move her feet. As a result of Inmate McKenna's continued resistance Nurse Lamin, who was on scene, was unable to get her vital signs at this point. Nurse Lamin decided to attempt to get Inmate McKenna's vital signs in male receiving so that Inmate McKenna would have a few minutes to calm down first.

We transported Inmate McKenna from Post 4 to the Sallyport via the elevator. During the trip from Post 4 to the Sallyport Inmate McKenna stopped struggling and was quiet. She was secured to the restraint chair by the waist belt and the leg restraints. Her feet were secured together by leg restraints and a Ripp Hobble. Her hands were secured with handcuffs behind her back. She was still wearing the mesh spit hood.

Once in the Sallyport Nurse Lamin attempted to get vital signs from inmate McKenna. At this point Nurse Lamin was unable to get a pulse from Inmate McKenna and asked for rescue to be called. We immediately removed Inmate McKenna from the restraint chair and placed her on the ground on top of her suicide smock. All restraints were removed and Nurse Lamin began chest compressions. Deputy Trader took over CPR from Nurse Lamin and Sgt. Mason arrived with the AED. Deputy Trader, Sgt. Mason and 2nd Lt. Miller administered chest compressions and rescue breaths to Inmate McKenna while simultaneously following the instructions of the AED until rescue arrived on scene and took over.

I observed and logged rescue personnel arriving in the Sallyport and taking over CPR on Inmate McKenna at 1124 hours. I observed Sgt. Ngo entering the ambulance to ride with Inmate McKenna to the hospital. On the above date and approximate time, PFC S. Williams and I escorted Nurse Lamin to the Sallyport to check Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) after being extracted from FR-02 by SERT and prior to her being transported to Alexandria City Jail. While Nurse Lamin was checking Inmate McKenna, I heard Nurse Lamin request for someone to retrieve the AED. PFC Williams and I responded to the MED-2 Office at Post 2 and obtained the AED.

After obtaining the AED, I responded back to the Sallyport and found PFC Trader performing CPR (approximately 30 chest compressions and 2 rescue breaths) on Inmate McKenna, however there were no signs that Inmate McKenna was responding to CPR. I applied the pads of the AED to Inmate McKenna, with the right pad being placed on the upper right of her chest and the left pad on the lower left. I advised the SERT members that the AED was analyzing and all team members removed their hands from Inmate McKenna. The AED analyzed and advised that no shock was advised. At that time, PFC Trader informed me that his upper lip was bleeding and that he had become a biohazard. I took over in administering CPR to Inmate McKenna. I began giving chest compressions and 2nd Lieutenant Miller attempted to give rescue breaths. We had performed two cycles of chest compressions and rescue breaths when 2nd Lieutenant Miller advised that he felt as though the rescue breaths were not able to be given successfully. I advised 2nd Lieutenant Miller that we would discontinue rescue breaths and continue with chest compressions until relieved by the responding rescue units. After approximately two minutes, the AED again analyzed Inmate McKenna, and again it stated that no shock was advised.

I continued to perform chest compressions on Inmate McKenna for approximately three to four minutes until rescue arrived on scene and I was relieved by a rescue unit. Inmate McKenna was then transported to Fairfax Hospital, via rescue with Sgt. Ngo as the transporting supervisor. All actions taken to ensure the safety and security of Inmate McKenna.

This morning at approximately 0800, I was informed by our Records Section that the Transportation Section would be tasked with transporting Inmate McKenna, Natasha from the Fairfax ADC to the Alexandria ADC. Due to her combative and uncooperative behavior, the Sheriff's Office SERT team would be responsible for safely applying the restraints necessary for transport, move her to the transport van, and place her in a designated compartment in the van. The Transportation deputies would only be responsible for driving the transport van to the Alexandria Sheriff's Office, where the Alexandria Sheriff's Office emergency response team would be responsible for removing her from the van. Deputies Winn and Habibi were tasked with this assignment. At approximately 11:15, I witnessed Inmate McKenna, Natasha wearing a spit net and covered by a green blanket. She was seated in a restraint chair and being escorted through the receiving area by members of the FCSO SERT. She was not being combative at the time and was silent. I spoke with 1st Lt. Salzman about the way that she was currently being restrained, and he inquired whether or not anything about her restraints needed to be changed for transport. Lt. Salzman told me that she was handcuffed behind her back, and her legs were secured with leg restraints. A Ripp-hobble was being utilized to attach to both the hand and leg restraints. We determined that she could safely be transported in the van compartment utilizing this method of restraint, and that there was no reason to switch to any other method. We all then escorted Inmate McKenna out to the Sallyport, where Deputies Winn and Habibi were waiting with transport van #6668. The van was positioned in a parking space just to the left of GE73. At this point, Deputies Trader and Lucas had arrived in the Sallyport after returning from an unrelated transport. Lt. Salzman stated to me that he wanted 2 or 3 SERT members to accompany Deputies Winn and Habibi to Alexandria. After giving it some thought, I asked Lt. Salzman if it would be a better idea to turn this into a complete SERT operation, remove Deputies Winn and Habibi from the transport, and have designated SERT team members conduct the transport. He agreed, and I notified Deputies Winn and Habibi to stand down from conducting the transport. Knowing that my part in this operation had ended, I stepped back and became an observer. Shortly after, I heard Nurse Lamin state that someone needed to get an AED because Inmate McKenna was having a medical emergency. I saw Deputy S. Williams run back into the receiving area, and SERT members began to make preparations to move Inmate McKenna from the restraint chair to the ground. Once Inmate McKenna was lying on the ground, I heard Nurse Lamin state that she needed CPR. I witnessed Deputy Trader move in to start giving chest compressions. Deputy Williams arrived back on scene with the AED, and the shock pads were applied to her body. I heard the machine run through it's diagnostic evaluation, and I heard it state that "no shock was advised". Deputy Trader resumed CPR on Inmate McKenna for approximately 5 minutes, until he was relieved by Sgt. Mason, who took over performing CPR. Approximately 2 minutes after that, Fairfax County Fire and Rescue arrived in the Sallyport. I said to 1st. Lt. Perkins that since Deputies Winn and Lucas were already in the Sallyport wearing full protective gear, they could escort the ambulance to Fairfax Hospital until they could be relieved by deputies from the squad. 1st Lt. Perkins agreed and the Deputies Winn and Lucas escorted Fairfax Fire and Rescue as they departed the Sallyport with Inmate McKenna.

On the above date and approximate time, I returned from a juvenile transport from DC and was in the Sallyport at the Fairfax County ADC. I observed Fairfax County SERT members escorting Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) out of the Fairfax County ADC through door GE73. Inmate McKenna was in the process of being transported to the Alexandria ADC. Inmate McKenna was in a restraint chair and was positioned behind a transport vehicle. Nurse Lamin was on scene and monitoring Inmate McKenna during the SERT activation. Nurse Lamin stated that Inmate McKenna was not breathing and was in cardiac arrest. Nurse Lamin called a medical emergency and an ADC deputy went to retrieve an AED. I went to my assigned cruiser (4426) to get a portable CPR face shield. The SERT Team members removed Inmate McKenna from the restraint chair and placed her on the ground in front of GE73 to provide medical attention. The ADC deputies immediately activated the AED and placed the pads in the appropriate areas. Nurse Lamin started to do chest compressions while the AED was being applied, however, I felt like I needed to relieve her and so I offered my assistance to take over chest compressions so she could monitor Inmate McKenna's vital signs, in which she accepted. I completed approximately 2 to 3 cycles of CPR (30 compressions/2 breaths) before the AED announced it was analyzing. The AED stated "No Shock Advised" and I continued CPR. I completed approximately 4 to 5 cycles of CPR when the AED announced it was analyzing again. While I stood clear of the body, someone told me my lip was bleeding. Because I was a blood biohazard, SGT Mason took over CPR when the AED stated "No Shock Advised". Approximately 2 minutes later, Fairfax City Fire and Rescure arrived in the Fairfax County ADC Sallyport and began to provide medical attention to Inmate McKenna. All actions were taken for the safety and security for the ADC and Fairfax County citizens.

I was advised by 1st Lt Salzman, that a female in FR-2 needed to be removed from the cell so that she could be transported to Alexandria for their charges. The Inmate had been involved in 2 incidents over the weekend with staff and one of the staff had been injured. Inmate McKenna was currently housed in FR-2 in a smock. Her cell was filled with urine and the conditions required staff in protective clothing. SERT was to remove her from the cell and transport her to the Sallyport to be taken to Alexandria. I was tasked with opening the door so SERT could remove her from the cell. At approximately 1020 I talked to her and told her we were going to take her to Alexandria and I was going to need her to cooperate with us. She acknowledged me and said Ok. Several minutes passed by and around 1030 I opened the food slot and asked her to place her arms out the food slot so that I could place hand restraints on her. I applied hand restraints on her arms whilst they were secured to the outside door handle by a ripp hobble. I believe the hand cuffs were double locked. Her demeanor began to change and she attempted to draw her arms back into the food slot while simultaneously unsecure the ripp hobble from the hand restraints. I grabbed the slack in the hobble and prevented her from drawing her arms through the food slot. Deputy Davilla assisted me by holding the hobble while I notified Lt Salzman of the situation. Almost as I was notifying him did SERT arrive. The team then formed up on the door and at that moment McKenna was told to cooperate and follow the orders given to her. When I was opened door she began to struggle even though she was restrained to the door handle she was brought to floor on her knees. The hand restraints were unsecured from the ripp hobble and she rolled to her stomach. The original idea was to put her in the transport belt that had a cuff on either side of the belt. After telling her to stop resisting attempts were made to remove the hand restraints that were in front of her and under her stomach. We finally exchanged the hand restraints with the transport belt restraints. It was immediately noticed that this was not enough to restrict her constant thrashing movements. I was not completely aware of what was occurring to the legs as I was concentrating on her hands and head. I observed one SERT member had her head by the chin and was trying to control her movements which were constant. Numerous times she was told to relax and remain calm but she never did. The team then rolled her to her side toward the FR-2 door where one restraint from the transport belt was removed and a hand restraint applied and double locked. Her arm was held and she was then rolled the other way. The other restraint was removed and we double locked them. I was told that the legs were secure and it appeared that all was ready to place her in the regular medical chair. But she was constantly attempting to kick anyone and she was hard to control her due to her thrashing about with her arms and legs. The ripp hobble was secured to her hands and the leg restraints from behind while she sat in the chair. We attempted to put her on the medical chair but immediately realized that we could not control her from still kicking. The medical chair was removed and the regular restraint chair was brought out to put her in it. She was still constantly being told to stop resisting but this was met with continued resistance. She was placed in the restraint chair and the waist belt to the chair was able to be applied with her arms behind her. A Spit Net spit hood was put on her head to prevent her from spitting on anyone. At this time she was sitting on the restraint chair upright with her arms behind her back. I do not remember when the ripp hobble was removed but she had her legs extended and was still thrashing them even though the deputies were trying to keep them under control. The legs were in leg restraints but she was still showing strength enough that the deputies were struggling to control them and they could not secure them to the restraint chair. Lt Salzman ordered her to cease struggling or he would deploy the taser. The first time I remember him using the taser was when he placed it on her right leg thigh and activated it. I saw the blast doors of the taser fall off after deploying. I saw no cooperation from her and she maintained her legs still thrashing with little chance of them being secured to the chair. Lt Salzman again told her that he would deploy the taser and he administered a drive stun with the previous darts still in the original leg deployment. The

On the above date at approximately 0815 hours while working Post 4/Female Receiving, I was informed by PFC Pillon and PFC Habibi of the Transportation Section that Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) was going to be transported to the Alexandria Jail with the assistance of Sheriff's Emergency Response Team (SERT) this morning. At approximately 0830 hours, I was informed by PFC Wilson of the Booking Desk that Inmate McKenna is "B&B to Alexandria" and that SERT will be performing an extraction to assist with the transport. At approximately 0900 hours, 1st Lt. Salzman and Sgt. Thompson spoke with Inmate McKenna through the FR2 cell window, informed her that she was being transported to Alexandria, and answered a few of Inmate McKenna's questions, which I was unable to hear. Prior to departing Post 4, 1st Lt. Salzman told Sgt. Thompson that SERT will assist in moving Inmate McKenna around 1000 this morning. At approximately 1010 hours, 1st Lt. Salzman called Post 4 from the SERT Office phone and inquired as to the current conditions of Inmate McKenna's cell. I informed 1st Lt. Salzman that Inmate McKenna had urinated near the cell door and she might have had feces in the back of the cell. I further explained that I had already had a female inmate workforce member mop up urine outside of FR2 this morning and that Inmate McKenna might have since urinated more near the cell entrance. 1st Lt. Salzman and I then briefly discussed squad pass-on regarding the incident that occurred over the weekend with a different squad (reference report numbers: 48010, 47924, and 47921).

At approximately 1025 hours, 2nd Lt. Miller arrived on Post 4 and requested to have a set of Post 4 keys. I provided 2nd Lt. Miller the post keys that I had on my belt clip. 2nd Lt. Miller advised that he was going to get Inmate McKenna in hand restraints and asked if I or 2nd Lt. Parrish had a set of cuffs for him to utilize. 2nd Lt. Parrish provided 2nd Lt. Miller with the cuffs from his duty belt. I then searched the post desk filing cabinet for additional restraint resources and advised both lieutenants that the post did not have leg restraints. I gave 2nd Lt. Miller a Ripp Hobble and a Spit Net from the filing cabinet to aid in Inmate McKenna's removal. 2nd Lt. Miller, 2nd Lt. Parrish, Deputy Davila-Ortiz, and I then responded to FR2 where 2nd Lt. Miller then engaged Inmate McKenna in conversation and explained that she was going to be transported to Alexandria and requested her cooperation.

2nd Lt. Miller attached the Ripp Hobble to the cell door handle and connected the Ripp Hobble to the hinged hand restraints. 2nd Lt. Miller then opened the food slot to FR2 and requested Inmate McKenna to place her hands out of the food slot so that he could apply hand restraints. Inmate McKenna complied. 2nd Lt. Miller applied the hand restraints on Inmate McKenna without incident. I then witnessed Inmate McKenna pulling her hands in the direction of her body. Inmate McKenna was able to slide the cuffs from the small part of her wrist to the base of her palms at which point her skin around her hand started to wrinkle from the force she was applying. I then synched the hand restraints approximately two more clicks to tighten the restraints, attempting to prevent Inmate McKenna from escaping from the cuffs. I ordered Inmate McKenna to stop pulling on the hand restraints. 2nd Lt. Miller then adjusted Inmate McKenna's wrists to an appropriate angle so that the cuffs were more efficiently placed on her wrists and then double locked the restraints. Inmate McKenna then continued to pull, using her body weight, on the cuffs such that the cuffs crossed the threshold of the food slot and entered the cell. Inmate McKenna then started to manipulate the Ripp Hobble's clasp as if trying to unhook the Ripp Hobble from the double-locked hand restraints. I then grabbed the Ripp Hobble and pulled, attempting to tighten the slack on the Ripp Hobble and to avoid Inmate McKenna from unhooking the restraints. 2nd Lt. I went out in the sally port and found multiple SERT deputies in full white bio hazard suits and wearing breathing apparatus. Deputy Taggart was recording the scene with the camera. A black female was laying on some sort of tarp on the sally port cement floor. She was naked, wearing a mask and had an ambu type bag on her face. It did not appear that anyone was working on her. Nurse Lamin was standing beside her with her blood pressure tower and was preparing to leave the scene for Rescue. Fire and Rescue was everywhere and were doing something with the inmate but it seemed to be only picking up stuff. No staff was doing anything to the inmate and Nurse Lamin told me she was going back inside the jail. I followed her back to the booking desk. She then told me of how combative the inmate had been and I had heard one of the deputies outside saying something about the inmate having been tased four times. Nurse Lamin then told me she had been called to check the inmate who was being moved to be put in a car for a ride back to Alexandria jail. Nurse Lamin said she could not find a pulse on the inmate and told the Deputies to lay her down on the ground where CPR could be performed. Nurse Lamin also said that she had told the deputies to call Rescue which they did and they arrived in a very short time. Nurse Lamin told me she had been doing chest compressions until she got too tired and was relieved by Fire and Rescue on the scene.

Before the squad was about to put her in the van, I checked the vital signs but was unable to get the reading and noted that her lips and hands were blue. I requested that the inmate be laid on the floor. I requested CB1 to call 911, medical emergency and I started CPR. Within no time, the paramedic arrived on the scene and took over. All necessary information was given to squad supervisor.

On the above date and approximate time while working Post 24, I was informed that SERT was going to be activated to extract Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) from FR-02 so she could be transported to Alexandria City Sheriff's Office. I then responded to the SERT office and was briefed by 1st Lt. Salzman on whom we were going to extract. A history of Inmate McKenna was given by 1st Lt. Salzman which explained that Inmate McKenna is being held for Alexandria on assault charges, but also recently assaulted MDS Hedrick from C Squad while in our custody. This information determined the use of SERT as the safest manner to remove Inmate McKenna from FR-02 and apply restraints prior to her being transported.

After 1st Lt. Salzman briefed us we then responded up to FR-02 after being told by 2nd Lt. Miller that he had Inmate McKenna in hand restraints with the ripp hobble applied to the cell door. The extraction team left the SERT office and responded to Female Receiving and appeared that Inmate McKenna was restrained and secured to the cell door. The extraction team then lined up in order in front of FR-02 door, and since 2nd Lt. Miller already built had a good relation with Inmate McKenna he gave all verbal communication and commands. Once 2nd Lt. Miller was given the ok from the extraction team he then opened the cell door. Inmate McKenna appeared to follow all verbal commands to stand and not move. Once we attempted to apply leg restraints Inmate McKenna then became very agitated and began to kick out and resist after all verbal commands were given to her to stop. Inmate McKenna was then pinned against the cell door while we attempted to apply leg restraints. Inmate McKenna continued to actively resist by kicking her legs. With the assistance of MDS Krustolovic, I grabbed Inmate McKenna's left leg and gently placed her on the floor. While on the floor MDS Krustolovic and I then applied leg restraints. Inmate McKenna continued to kick even after being restrained, so a ripp hobble was applied to her legs.

MDS Krustolovic and I continued to apply some pressure to Inmate McKenna's thighs and feet area while the remaining team members continued trying to gain control of her arms and hands. During the entire time that I was controlling Inmate McKenna's legs I continued to hear verbal commands for Inmate McKenna to stop resisting.

After getting Inmate McKenna's hands restrained the entire team then attempted in placing Inmate McKenna in a wheelchair. Even while Inmate McKenna's hands and legs were restrained she continued to be combative and resisted and appeared to be not sitting properly in the wheelchair for us to move her safely. It was then decided by the Team leader to get the restraint chair and place her into it safely. Once the restraint chair was available Inmate McKenna was then lifted up and placed into the restraint chair. Inmate McKenna continued actively resisting and was very unresponsive to any verbal commands. MDS Krustolovic and I attempted to place the leg straps around her legs to stop her from kicking. Several attempts were made in pushing her legs down and restraining her. Inmate McKenna continued locking her legs and kicking at us as we attempted to restrain her legs in the restraint chair. After several failed attempts in trying to apply the leg straps and the other team members having the same problems getting the waist restraint on. I then heard 1st Lt. Salzman give specific warnings that the Taser would be deployed if Inmate McKenna continued to be combative. I then saw the Taser being deployed as a drive stun without the darts to assist in getting Inmate McKenna in stopping her aggressive combative actions. Once the cycle of the Taser completed which was approximately 5 seconds Inmate McKenna's leg relaxed just long enough for MDS Krustolovic and I to get her right leg strap on. Inmate McKenna still continued to kick with her left leg as I attempted to apply the strap, and I then heard the Taser being deployed and saw darts deployed to Inmate McKenna's right leg. I finally got the right leg strap on and Inmate McKenna was then checked by Nurse Lamin and Nurse Abebe prior to going down to receiving. On the way down to receiving in the elevator I noticed that Inmate McKenna was still breathing from visually seeing Inmate McKenna's chest

On the above date and approximate time, SERT was activated for a cell extraction. SERT responded to Female Receiving (Post 4) to extract Inmate McKenna, Natasha (1054527) from FR2 so that she could be transported to the Alexandria Jail.

I was assigned to the first position in the stack (Shield). When we arrived on post, 2nd Lt. Miller had already applied hand restraints to the inmate which were secured to the cell door with a ripp-hobble. Lt. Miller ordered Inmate McKenna to kneel down inside the cell. To this order, she did not comply but continued to react irrationally by attempting to pull back into the cell and yell incoherently. Lt. Miller made several more attempts to gain the inmate's voluntary compliance with no success. With SERT standing by, ready to safely remove the inmate from FR2, Lt. Miller opened the cell door.

SERT entered the cell and with minimal force, I pinned the inmate against the cell door with the shield. At this time, Inmate McKenna became more agitated physically and verbally. She began to contort her body in an attempt to get out from our control so much to the extent of throwing herself to the floor. I transitioned to the floor with her in order to remain in control of her movement. At this time, with the inmate pinned to the floor (face-up) with the shield, PFC Henry took control of the inmate's right arm as MDS McPartlin and MDS Krustulovic took control of the inmate's legs. Lt. Miller remained in control of the inmate's left arm.

At this point, the inmate needed to be placed on her belly to prevent her from harming herself and the team. Also, she needed to be placed in proper restraints for her transportation. The hand restraints were removed by Lt. Miller at which time we rolled the inmate along her right side and onto her belly. Throughout this time, Inmate McKenna continued to thrust and contort her body in an attempt to free herself from our control. She also continued to yell nonsensically and move her hands in a way as to try and scratch or grab PFC Henry and Lt. Miller.

Once safely on her belly, I discarded the shield and took control of the inmate's head with my hands on either side of her head keeping her face pointed at the floor. This was done to keep her from spitting and/or biting us. With the other SERT members remaining in control of their assignments, MDS McPartlin and MDS Krustulovic applied leg restraints while Lt. Miller attempted to apply a restraint belt to the inmate. It was discovered that Inmate McKenna was physically too small in the torso for the belt to take effect. She could easily, with her hands restrained to the belt, maneuver the belt up to her chest and therefore be able to attack with her hands. Lt. Miller then removed the belt and applied standard hand restraints and secured them at the inmate's back.

With her hands secure and her feet in restraints, the inmate was still attempting to kick her feet out of the control of the two Master Deputies holding them. Therefore, a ripp-hobble was applied around her ankles to keep them together and the hook-end was fastened to the hand restraints. Following this, SERT attempted to place the inmate in a wheel chair. We found that the inmate would thrust her pelvis forward in an attempt to throw herself out of the chair. We then safely lowered the inmate back to the floor. Due to its application of a waist restraint, SERT decided to utilize the Restraint Chair.

We lifted Inmate McKenna from the floor, placed her in the chair, and applied a spit hood. Still thrusting forward and attempting to

could reset and run another analysis, Rescue arrived in the sally port. At this time, PFC Henry and I were ordered to return to the SERT office and suit up to follow rescue to the hospital.

At approximately, 1159 hours we arrived at the hospital where Inmate McKenna was taken to ER3. Other personnel present were Sgt. Ngo, MDS McPartlin, PFC Winn, PFC Lucas, Deputy Orellana, and Officer Lee (FCPD, 329401). We all remained in the hall outside of ER3 while Sgt. Ngo entered the room with medical staff and rescue. Soon thereafter, all personnel were ordered back to the ADC with the exception of PFC Henry, myself, and Officer Lee. Officer Lee would soon inform us that CIB would be arriving. At approximately 1400 hours, Sgt. Ngo relieved PFC Henry and I of duty and we returned to the ADC. All actions were taken for the safety and security of the ADC.

On the above date and approximate time I was assigned to position 2 as a member of SERT for a cell extraction on Inmate McKenna, Natasha J (1054527). The mission was to extract and place the inmate in restraints and secure her in a transport vehicle to be transported to Alexandria Jail. As position number 2 my role was to place the inmate in hand restraints. After the team was suited, equipment and positions were assigned we exited the SERT office and made our way to female receiving. I was behind PFC. Perryman who was assigned to position 1(Shield), and behind me in the stack was MDS. McPartlin and MDS. Krustulovic; who were assigned to leg restraints. Upon arrival into female receiving I observed Team leader 2nd Lt. Miller at the cell door of FR02 applying hand restraints attached to a ripp hobble that was secured to the door handle of the cell. As the team approached the cell of inmate McKenna, she pulled her hands back into the cell causing LT. Miller's hand to be pinched by the ripp hobble to the open edge of the food slot. Lt. Miller was able to free his hand and continued to issue commands to the inmate to comply so that she could be transported. Inmate continued to refuse and scream profusely. In the meantime we all stacked to the left of the door and prepared to make entry into the cell.

Team leader Lt. Miller opened the cell door and said the go word "whiskey". Due to the Inmate being ripp hobbled to the door handle we attempted to pin the inmate to the inside of the door utilizing the shield. Inmate McKenna was still in a standing position making it difficult to successful pin and control her movements. Inmate McKenna was combative from the initial contact with the shield; she forcefully pushed herself around to the outside of the cell door and placed her body in between the wall and the open cell door. As the team went to attempt to pin her in that location, she swung back around to the inside of the cell door in the open hallway. The team was ordered to gain control of the inmate's legs and place her on the floor. MDS. McPartlin and MDS. Krustulovic took control of the inmate's legs, as PFC. Perryman and myself pinned the inmate to the floor.

Inmate McKenna was laying on her back face up to PFC. Perryman and me. I assisted PFC. Perryman in holding the shield across the inmate's upper body while leg restraints were applied by MDS. McPartlin and MDS. Krustulovic. Once inmate's legs were restrained we were directed to unsecure the ripp hobble from the hand restraints so that the inmate could be turned face over to apply a waist chain for transport. I observed the inmate grasping onto the ripp hobble and attempting to pull herself up. I tried to pull the inmate's hands open and away from the ripp hobble. The inmate attempted to grasp and scratch at my hand. With unsuccessful attempts to open the inmate's hands and release her grasp of the ripp hobble, I applied approximately three closed fist strikes to the inmate's knuckles, causing her to release her grasp, to which allowed me to release the clip of the ripp hobble. Inmate's hands subsequently fell under the shield and became pinned by it.

I then assisted in rolling the inmate over into a face down position. PFC. Perryman then discarded the shield and maintained control of the inmates head and upper body movement. I maintained control of the inmate's midsection and hips while LT. Miller fed a waist belt under the inmate. Once the waist belt was strapped and secured, I pulled the inmate's arms from under herself to the left side of her body. I secured the inmate's left wrist into the hand restraint that was attached to the waist belt on the left side. Once restraint was applied and double locked, I unsecured the preexisting hand restraints that were applied earlier. Lt. Miller gained control of the inmate's right arm and I assisted in pulling it to the right side of her body. I then applied the hand restraint attached to the right side of the waist belt and double locked it.

Once both hands were successfully secured the inmate continued to forcefully resist and move around causing us to continue to readjust positions and attempt to keep the inmate down. At one time during the struggle I noticed that the inmate urinated on the floor

We arrived on scene and stacked for entry into the FR cell. I had difficulty seeing the front of the stack. Inmate McKenna appeared to be at the front of the cell door. I observed a ripp hobble on the cell door handle. 2nd LT. Miller opened the cell and inmate McKenna immediately began resisting. Her hands were restrained through the food slot, but she would not allow us to restrain her. She was standing at the door, hands in the food slot. She began to resist and PFC Perryman used the shield to pin her. The ripp hobble restraint was taken off the door handle in an attempt to better restrain her. McKenna was moved to the floor. She continued kicking and moving her torso up and down and left to right. This made restraining her extremely difficult. I attempted to restrain her legs by putting pressure on her calves with my knee and hands. MDS McPartlin attempted to place leg restraints on her feet. McKenna resisted by kicking and moving her legs and torso. I used more pressure to her legs and ankles. MDS McPartlin was able to restrain her feet. Several commands to stop resisting were given to her. The leg restraints were double locked. Even with restraints on her feet she kept kicking and moving her legs and torso.

1st Lt Salzman, 2nd Lt. Miller, PFC Henry and PFC Perryman were attempting to gain control of her upper torso and hands. The team struggled to place a leather waist restraint around her waist. We lifted her legs and upper torso to place the belt around her. She was kicking and moving her torso up and down resisting any attempts to restrain her. 1st Lt. Salzman advised McKenna to comply with the lawful orders. McKenna was able to move around with the leather belt. It was decided to place her in hand restraints. She continued to resist. The ripp Hobbles were used to help restrain her hands and to keep her kicking to a minimum. We were attempting to place her in a medical transport chair. She continued to kick and resist using her upper torso. 1st Lt Salzman suggested a restraint chair.

A restraint chair was moved to our location. The team attempted to place her in the restraint chair. She resisted by becoming rigid. And she began kicking at MDS McPartlin and me. 1st Lt Salzman warned her about complying with our lawful commands or the taser would be deployed. She did not comply and 1st Lt Salzman deployed a drive stun at her right thigh. Once the effects wore off after 5 seconds she continued to resist. She began to kick and continue to move her torso. MDS McPartlin and I are still at the feet and legs. She was ordered to stop resisting again or she will be tased. She subsequently was tased with darts deployed in the right thigh in attempt to gain compliance. We struggled to place her in the restraint chair. She kicked and locked her legs out. 1st LT Salzman ordered her to relax her legs. McKenna continued to resist. She was tased again to place her body and legs in the restraint chair. She continued to resist by kicking and moving her torso but it gave the team a small window to move her body in the restraint chair. But MDS McPartlin and I were not able to secure her legs and feet in the restraint chair. She continued to resist. 1st Lt Salzman allowed enough time for her to comply with our orders. 1st Lt Salzman deployed the taser to gain compliance, this allowed us enough time to secure her legs and feet. It was enough to place her in the chair and hold her feet in place. This was the only option to transport her. Nurse Lamin was standing by and she came over to check her vitals. At some point Nurse Lamin stated McKenna could move. McKenna was transported in the restraint chair to the sallyport. We arrived in the sallyport and 2nd Lt Miller requested Nurse Lamin check McKenna's vitals. Nurse Lamin checked her right arm with a blood pressure cuff. She uttered something and moved on to the left. Nurse Lamin noticed something wrong. We began to loosen the restraints to the chair and move McKenna to the ground. Nurse Lamin ordered rescue be called. Nurse Lamin stated there was no pulse. Nurse Lamin started chest compressions. Deputy Trader took over CPR. AED was brought to the scene by Sgt. Mason. 2nd Lt Miller administered rescue breaths until rescue arrived.

At approximately 1010 hours, I arrived at Post 4 to ensure that the Post 4 Deputies (Deputy Chesky and Deputy Davila-Ortiz) were advised that Inmate McKenna was about to be transported to Alexandria Adult Detention Center. I informed them that the cell extraction would be handled by the Sheriff's Emergency Response Team (SERT). Deputy Chesky and Deputy Davila-Ortiz stated that they had been notified. I reviewed and initialed Inmate McKenna's Special Housing Observation Log. I requested that her personal property items be removed from Property to be handed over to SERT.

2nd Lt. Miller arrived on Post 4 at approximately 1020 hours and started to build a rapport with Inmate McKenna. After he had built a rapport with Inmate McKenna, he requested a key set and advised Deputy Chesky, Deputy Davila-Ortiz and me (2nd Lt. Parrish) that he was going to attempt to place Inmate McKenna in hand restraints. We approached Inmate McKenna's cell (FR2). 2nd Lt. Miller requested that Inmate McKenna place her hands through the food slot when opened in order for him to secure her hands in hand restraints for transport to Alexandria Adult Detention Center.

2nd Lt. Miller requested a set of hand restraints, so I handed him mine. He then used a Ripp Hobble Restraint, securing the strap through the door handle and clipped the metal clasp onto the restraints. When he opened the food slot, Inmate McKenna placed her hands out through the slot and 2nd Lt. Miller secured the hand restraints around Inmate McKenna's wrists. Once the restraints were applied, Inmate McKenna's composure changed and she attempted to pull her hands back through the slot. She was pulling with enough force that it appeared she would pull her wrists out of the restraints. 2nd Lt. Miller and I assured Inmate McKenna that we were not going to harm her but we needed to apply the hand restraints. Inmate McKenna calmed down and she placed her hands out enough for Deputy Chesky to adjust the restraints. When they were adjusted, I double locked them.

Immediately, Inmate McKenna's composure changed again. She quickly lowered her buttocks to the ground, raised her feet up against the door, pushed back against it while pulling her hands back in her cell. Once she broke the threshold (food slot), she attempted to remove that metal clasp from the hand restraints. Without inflicting pain to her wrists, Deputy Davila-Ortiz was able to provide enough resistance on the Ripp Hobble that would not allow her to remove the metal clasp from the hand restraints. Inmate McKenna stated that "you said you wouldn't hurt me" as she continued to pull with her body and feet against the door in an attempt to remove the restraints. I attempted to calm inmate McKenna down by reassuring her that we would not harm her. Inmate McKenna would not calm down and she was focused on removing the hand restraints and clasp.

2nd Lt. Miller made contact with SERT via radio and advised the team that Inmate McKenna's hands were secured in hand restraints. SERT arrived on post and made their position in the hallway by FR2 door. 2nd Lt. Miller opened the cell door and SERT entered FR2 cell to extract Inmate McKenna. I observed Inmate McKenna be escorted out of FR2 and placed on the floor. I observed SERT place a spit net on Inmate McKenna. I observed the Ripp Hobble be removed from the door and placed on Inmate McKenna's legs. I observed SERT attempt to place Inmate McKenna in a medical transport chair. The attempt was unsuccessful due to Inmate McKenna not following instructions given by SERT and her continuous movements of twisting, turning and stiffening up her body.

SERT requested to use the restraint chair instead of the medical chair. PFC Plimpton retrieved the restraint chair and rolled the restraint chair to the hallway near FR2. The medical chair was removed from the area. SERT attempted to place Inmate McKenna into the restraint chair. During this process, Inmate McKenna would not comply with instructions given by SERT. Inmate McKenna constantly attempted to break free from control by manipulating her body, twisting, pulling, moving and kicking. Inmate McKenna displayed continuous active resistance. I observed SERT utilize the taser on Inmate McKenna four times during the process of placing Inmate McKenna into the restraint chair. The SERT operation was captured on video. Inmate McKenna was secured in a restraint chair, checked by medical staff (Nurse Lamin and Nurse Abebe) and moved from female receiving. I observed Inmate McKenna continue to move as SERT escorted her out of FRB door by restraint chair to elevator one. I did not follow and remained on Post 4.

Class II Charges:**

On the above date and approximate time, I was instructed by Lt. Perkins to escort Inmate McKenna to the hospital via ambulance. I responded to the Sallyport and attempted to get on the ambulance but was instructed by a paramedic to wait until they moved the ambulance to the outside of SP2 door. Once the ambulance was moved outside of the SP2 door, I got in the back of it where I observed Inmate McKenna lying unconscious on a stretcher with a device hooked up to her chest and a ventilator to her mouth. I identified Lt. Jon Brantley, by his name tag, and five other members of the rescue squad who were surrounding the inmate to render medical treatment to her. At this time, I heard the paramedics talking amongst each other saying the inmate had no pulse and the device on the inmate's chest was pumping her chest down and up. The following are the details of what I observed since the ambulance departed the ADC until I got relieved from duty at the hospital.

At 1137 hours the ambulance departed the ADC for Fairfax Hospital.

At 1140 hours I heard Lt. Brantley say the inmate's pulse had come back and they stopped the device on her chest from pumping. I then relayed this information to CB1.

At 1145 hours I heard the paramedics say the inmate lost her pulse again and they started the device on her chest again.

At 1148 hours, right before we arrived at the emergency room, the paramedic had detected a pulse on her again. Once the ambulance stopped, the inmate was wheeled straight to Trauma Room 3 where a team of hospital staff, including Dr. Forgash and fifteen other members, hooked up new ventilator tubes to the inmate's mouth, nose and IV's to her arms.

At 1212 hours I heard the doctor say the inmate had lost her pulse again and the team started CPR on her with a nurse performing chest compressions.

At 1217 hours the hospital staff detected a pulse on the inmate again. The CPR stopped.

At 1220 hours a medical tech took a chest X-Ray of the inmate. I was told to step outside of the room for a few seconds while the X-Ray was taken.

At 1228 hours I heard the inmate had lost her pulse again and a nurse started chest compressions again.

At 1237 hours the hospital staff detected a pulse on the inmate again.

At 1255 hours I heard Dr. Forgash say that the hospital staff will try to bring the inmate's temperature down to about 94-96 degrees to cut down the demand of oxygen level in her brain for some testing to be done and she would not be responsive for 24-48 hours.
