




Thanksgiving Wishes from Supervisor Frey

EQAC Annual Public Hearing

When: Monday, November 29, 2010 at 7:30 p.m.

The Fairfax County Environmental Quality Advisory Council (EQAC) is appointed by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors to advise on environmental matters. The public is encouraged to attend EQAC's public hearing to share views on the state of the environment and to identify environmental issues applicable to Fairfax County.

Environmental issues considered by EQAC include water quality, air quality, noise, hazardous materials, solid waste, stream valley protection, deer management, light pollution, visual pollution, and the use and preservation of ecological resources.

Joey Pizzano Memorial Fund

The Joey Pizzano Memorial Fund (JPMF) is a 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to "improving the lives of children with special needs and their families". Since 2001, JPMF Special Kids Special Families and Fairfax County have developed a unique public-private partnership serving individuals with disabilities and their families. This success is exemplified by the promotion of disability awareness, JPMF Splash and joint project to build "Our Special Harbor" Sprayground.

JPMF Splash, their signature water safety program, teaches children with disabilities how to "be safe and have fun in and around the water". In Fairfax County alone, over 5,000 individuals and their families have benefitted from this program in countless ways.

"Our Special Harbor", a fully-accessible, zero-water-depth sprayground, is scheduled to open May 2011 at the Lee District Family Recreation Area. Disabilities will vanish amid the Chesapeake Bay setting as children of ALL abilities can enjoy the water with their families and friends. As a result of their



unique partnership, JPMF is building this unique park while Fairfax County Park Authority will maintain and operate it as a resource for all county residents to enjoy!

Sprayground fundraising campaign is under way! Half way to their goal, JPMF needs to raise another \$500,000 in order to complete the park. For more information on how you can help or donate, please go to www.jpmpf.org/osh
