Senior FBI agents, the head of the Northern Virginia Regional Gang Task Force and representatives from the Loudoun County Gang Response Intervention Team will all make presentations at the Gang Awareness & Intervention meeting.

For the meeting on teen substance abuse, Wolf has invited the head of the nation's Office of Drug Control Policy to speak on the trends in teen substance abuse and what parents should look for if they suspect their children are using drugs or alcohol. He also has invited the president of Mothers Against Drunk Driving to speak and the author of a new book, *Smashed: The Story of a Drunken Girlhood*, the true story of a young woman's desperate battle with alcohol in high school and college.
