

Fee Exemption for Installation of Electric Vehicle Charging Equipment

Background

- On October 11, 2022, the Board of Supervisors (Board) eliminated Building Permit fees for the installation of Electric Vehicle Charging (EVC) equipment for a trial period of 18 months.
- Without an amendment to the Land Development Services Fee Schedule, permit fees for EVC installations will resume on May 1st.
- Data has been collected for EVC related permits issued during the first 12 months of the trial period.




EVC Equipment Installed

- Data collection period October 31, 2022 October 30, 2023.
- 38 commercial permits and 858 residential permits issued.
- Data does not reflect the number of chargers installed with each permit.
- Data does not include installations in new parking structures which receive a more general type of electrical permit that doesn't specify EVC equipment on the permit application.




EVC Equipment Installed

Commercial EVC Permits Issued by Supervisor District








Residential EVC Permits Issued by Vulnerability Index Group

Lost Revenue

Permit Type	Residential	Commercial	Total
Number of Permits	811	38	896
Fees	\$108,962	\$16,005	\$124,967
Average Fee	\$127	\$421	\$139

- Assuming continuance of the fee exemption, lost revenue likely will rise in the coming years from increases in the number of installations.
- The lost revenue will be large enough that it will need to be offset by increases in other LDS fees.



Board Guidance Needed

- Without an amendment to the Land Development Services Fee Schedule, fees for EVC instillations will resume on May 1, 2024.
- Staff is requesting Board guidance today on whether to continue to exempt EVC installations from Building Permit fees.
- Staff recommends that the Board let the fee exemption expire.
- If the Board wishes to extend the trial period or make the fee exemption permanent, an authorization item will be prepared for the March 5, 2024, Board meeting with a public hearing on March 19, 2024.
