The recessed meeting was called to order at 6:10 p.m., with all Members being present, with the exception of Supervisor Gross and Supervisor Hudgins, and with Chairman Connolly presiding.

1. **6 P.M. – PRESENTATION BY THE FAIRFAX COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD** (6:11 p.m.)

Chairman Connolly called upon Daniel G. Storck, Chairman and Mount Vernon District Representative, School Board, to present the School System's annual presentation. Chairman Storck thanked the Board for its support and proceeded with his report which included presentations by the following students:

Discussion ensued, with input from Dr. Jack Dale, Superintendent, Fairfax County Public Schools, regarding the K2 Initiative, Quest, and the College Partnership Program.

Following additional discussion concerning measurements of individual schools, Supervisor Hudgins requested that the School Board provide additional information concerning performance results at specific schools, particularly McNair and Dogwood Elementary Schools.

In addition, Supervisor Hudgins requested:

- An analysis of programs which help in the assistance of performance and their outcome.
- Information concerning how a shift in dollars would impact a school as well as an evaluation of the performance of those programs in the school.

Chairman Connolly introduced Leonard Bumbaca, President of the Fairfax Education Association, and Mr. Edward Stapleton, also of the Association, who gave a presentation.
