# MONDAY JANUARY 28, 1991

Board Package

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The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m. with all members being present, with the exception of Supervisor Alexander, Supervisor Davis, and Supervisor McConnell, and with Chairman Moore presiding.

Supervisor Davis and Supervisor McConnell arrived at 10:10 a.m.

Supervisor Alexander was absent from the entire Board Meeting.

Others present were Richard A. King, Acting County Executive; David T. Stitt, County Attorney; Theodore Austell, III, Executive Assistant to the County Executive; William Howland, Assistant to the County Executive; Viki L. Lester, Deputy Clerk to the Board of Supervisors; and Patti M. Hicks, Deputy Clerk to the Board of Supervisors.

# 2. <u>THOUGHTS FOR SERVICEMEN AND WOMEN FROM FAIRFAX</u> <u>COUNTY INVOLVED IN THE PERSIAN GULF WAR</u> (TAPE 1)

Chairman Moore requested that during the moment of silent meditation the individuals from Fairfax County who are serving in the Middle East and their families be remembered, and thoughts also be directed to the leaders for their continuing strength and wisdom.

3. <u>RECOGNITION OF SUPERVISORS' SUPPORT FOR UNITED</u> <u>STATES</u> (TAPE 1)

Chairman Moore recognized Supervisor Hyland's and Supervisor Pennino's display of flags at their Board seats indicating support for the United States.

4. <u>CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION COMMENDING</u> JOANNE MALONE FOR HER YEARS OF SERVICE ON THE COMMISSION FOR THE DISABLED (TAPE 1)

> Supervisor Hanley moved approval of the presentation of the Certificate of Appreciation presented to Joanne Malone (formerly Providence District Representative), expressing the Board's appreciation for her many years

of dedicated service to the citizens of Fairfax County as a member of the Commission for the Disabled. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of six, Supervisor Davis and Supervisor McConnell not yet having arrived, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# 5. <u>CERTIFICATES OF APPRECIATION CONGRATULATING</u> <u>MADISON HIGH SCHOOL GOLF TEAM FOR WINNING</u> THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP (TAPE 1)

Supervisor Pennino moved approval of the presentation of the Certificates of Appreciation presented to Coach Don Roth and members of the Madison High School Golf Team congratulating the Team for winning the 1990 Virginia State Championship. This motion was jointly seconded by Supervisor Davis and Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of eight. Supervisor Alexander being absent.

- 6. <u>RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING DANIEL SMITH FOR HIS</u> <u>YEARS OF SERVICE ON THE BOARD OF ZONING</u> <u>APPEALS</u> (TAPE 1)
- (BACs)

Supervisor Hyland moved adoption of the Resolution, presented to Mrs. Elizabeth Smith, commending Daniel Smith for his 32 years of service as a member of the Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) and his outstanding efforts as a citizen of Fairfax County. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Pennino and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# BOARD MATTERS

7. <u>PRESENTATION OF A CERTIFICATE OF FRIENDSHIP</u> FROM THE COUNTY OF ESSONNE, FRANCE TO AUDREY MOORE, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FAIRFAX COUNTY (TAPE 1)

> Supervisor Pennino and Supervisor Hyland presented to Chairman Moore, as the Chairman of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, a Certificate of Friendship between Fairfax County and its Sister County of Essonne, France, and a newspaper clipping.

> Chairman Moore relinquished the Chair to Acting Chairman Bulova and asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to display the items in the hallway temporarily until a permanent display site can be found. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Acting Chairman Bulova returned the gavel to Chairman Moore.

Supervisor Hyland noted that some French businesses have agreed to locate in Fairfax County, Virginia.

Additionally, Supervisor Pennino noted that letters have been received from students, including a tumbling group that would like to come as an exchange group. Chairman Moore suggested that Oak View Elementary school be contacted about its tumbling group.

# 8. <u>CLOWNS INTERNATIONAL'S UPCOMING VISIT TO LEEDS</u> <u>CASTLE, ENGLAND HOME OF LORD FAIRFAX</u> (TAPE 1)

Supervisor McConnell brought to the Board's attention the Clowns International's upcoming trip to England. One of the group's meetings in England will be held at Leeds Castle, the home of Lord Fairfax. A representative of the group suggested that a memento of Fairfax County be taken to Leeds Castle. Supervisor McConnell asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to provide Clowns International with an appropriate token from the County. Without objection, it was so ordered.

# 9. <u>10:00 A.M. - PRESENTATION ON THE CLEAN AIR ACT</u> <u>AMENDMENTS OF 1990</u> (TAPES 1-2)

Edgar M. Chase, Director, Air Pollution Control, Fairfax County Health Department, and Barbara A. Hardy, Assistant Director, Air Pollution Control, Fairfax County Health Department, presented to Board Members the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990.

Supervisor Hyland ask unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to determine whether there are any current options available for putting clean fuel vehicles on line (for example, when purchasing replacement vehicles) rather than waiting until 1996 when it will be required and report its findings to the Board. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Following a query by Supervisor McConnell, discussion ensued among Board Members, with input from Mr. Chase, regarding the use of compressed natural gas in vehicle engines.

Following the presentation, Supervisor Pennino moved that the Board:

- Express its appreciation to Richard K. Miller, M.D., M.P.H., Director, Health Administration, Department of Health, and the Health Department staff for the presentation on the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990;
- Refer the Clean Air Act Amendments to County staff for its review and analysis; and

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• Direct staff to propose a program on the implementation of the amendments, to include the time frame for the implementation and the cost to the County.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell.

Supervisor Hyland asked that the motion be amended to include a time limitation of 60 days for the staff to report to the Board, and this was accepted.

The question was called on the motion, as amended, which carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# 10. <u>10:15 A.M. - REPORT ON GENERAL ASSEMBLY ACTIVITIES</u> (TAPES 2-3)

Supervisor Hanley, Chairman, Board's Legislative Subcommittee, briefly outlined the "1991 General Assembly Status Report Number Two" dated January 28, 1991, distributed to Board Members.

#### HOUSE BILL 1273

House Bill 1273, Delegate Gerald Fill's bill, bans the location of drug rehabilitation facilities in drug-free school zones. At the Legislative Subcommittee meeting, the Board agreed to ask for a legal opinion from the Attorney General to ensure the bill's consistency with the federal Fair Housing Act.

Supervisor Davis moved that the Board support House Bill 1273, subject to the Attorney General's opinion on the bill. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland.

Following discussion, for the purpose of clarity, Supervisor Hanley restated Supervisor Davis' motion, as follows: that the Board support House Bill 1273 if it is found to be in compliance with the Fair Housing Act or can be made to be compliant with the Act.

The question was called on the motion, as clarified, which carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

### HOUSE BILL 370, HOUSE BILL 541, SENATE BILL 373 AND SENATE BILL 374

House Bills 370 and 541, and their Senate companions, address the issue of separate circuit court staff and the funding of such staff.

Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board concur in staff recommendation and oppose House Bills 370 and 541, and Senate Bills 373 and 374. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Pennino.

Supervisor Davis moved a substitute motion that the Board not take a position on this legislation at this time. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell.

Following discussion among Board Members regarding the Board's position on this issue in previous years, the substitute motion was restated for the purpose of clarity: that the Board not take a position on this legislation pending the outcome of the study.

The question was called on the substitute motion which <u>FAILED</u> by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Bulova, Supervisor Davis, and Supervisor McConnell voting "AYE," Supervisor Alexander being absent.

The question was then called on the main motion (Supervisor Hanley's), to concur in the staff recommendation for opposition to the bills, which <u>CARRIED</u> by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Bulova, Supervisor Davis, and Supervisor McConnell voting "NAY," Supervisor Alexander being absent.

#### HOUSE BILL 1686

Discussion ensued among Board Members on House Bill 1686, legislation relating to the conduct of advisory referenda in certain counties. It was noted that this legislative matter has been supported by the Board in the past.

Supervisor Davis moved that the Board reiterate approval for this issue and express support for House Bill 1686. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and <u>CARRIED</u> by a recorded vote of seven, Supervisor Pennino voting "NAY," Supervisor Alexander being out of the room.

#### CHESAPEAKE BAY LEGISLATION

Supervisor Hanley reiterated the sense of the Board that legislation that would weaken the Chesapeake Bay Act be opposed and announced her intent to address Chesapeake Bay legislation later in the meeting after Board Members received copies of the bills and were able to review them.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, there was additional consideration of the Chesapeake Bay legislation. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#109.)

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 470 AND SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 214

Discussion ensued among Board Members and Michael H. Long, Assistant County Attorney, on House Joint Resolution 470 and Senate Joint

Resolution 214, legislation to amend Section 2 of Article X of the Constitution of Virginia, allowing the General Assembly to establish, by general law, a limitation on the annual increase in real estate assessments.

Supervisor Davis moved that the Board express support for House Joint Resolution 470 and Senate Joint Resolution 214. This motion was seconded by Chairman Moore.

Following additional discussion among Board Members, the question was called on the motion which <u>CARRIED</u> by a recorded vote of seven, Supervisor Richards voting "NAY," Supervisor Alexander being absent.

#### ADOPTION OF BOARD'S LEGISLATIVE PACKAGE

Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board adopt the staff recommendations as contained in the legislative package, providing that the Chesapeake Bay regulations are considered later in the meeting.

(NOTE: Action was taken later to approve the Board's legislative package following further discussion on other bills. See Page Eight of the Clerk's Board Summary, "Adoption of Legislative Package.")

#### HOUSE BILL 1916

Supervisor Pennino moved that the Board take no position on House Bill 1916, legislation relating to provisions of subdivision ordinances, zoning ordinances and conditional zoning. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell.

Following discussion among Board Members; Mr. Long; Anthony H. Griffin, Deputy County Attorney for Planning and Development; and Shiva K. Pant, Director, Office of Transportation, Supervisor Pennino amended her previous motion and moved to defer the Board's decision on its position on House Bill 1916 until the next Board Meeting. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell.

Chairman Moore relinquished the Chair to Acting Chairman Hyland and moved a substitute motion that the Board support the staff recommendation to oppose House Bill 1916. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Richards.

Supervisor Davis moved a substitute to the substitute motion that the Board endorse House Bill 1916 if the legislation can be made prospective and permissive. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell.

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After further discussion among Board Members, Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board call the question on the substitute to the substitute motion (Supervisor Davis'). This motion was seconded by Supervisor Pennino and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being out of the room.

For the purpose of clarity, Acting Chairman Hyland restated the substitute to the substitute motion (Supervisor Davis'): Endorse House Bill 1916 provided that the legislation could be made prospective and permissive in nature, and other conflicts be resolved.

The question was called on the substitute to the substitute motion (Supervisor Davis') which <u>CARRIED</u> by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Hanley, Supervisor Moore, and Supervisor Richards voting "NAY," Supervisor Alexander being out of the room.

The question was then called on the main motion, as substituted, which <u>CARRIED</u> by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Hanley, Supervisor Moore and Supervisor Richards voting "NAY," Supervisor Alexander being out of the room.

Acting Chairman Hyland returned the gavel to Chairman Moore.

#### LEGISLATION FOR 1992 GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Supervisor Hyland moved that the following two items, which were not included in the Board's 1991 legislative package, be included in the 1992 package:

- Legislation permitting the Board of Equalization (BOE) to have the authority to deny appellants, who come to the BOE challenging their property assessments, the right to introduce income data that was not previously furnished to the County. (This proposal is similar to a rule currently existing in the court system which specifies that information not produced by the appellant to the County cannot be introduced as evidence in court.); and
- Legislation requiring that the additional penalties that can be imposed by judges for drug possession and drug-related activities in school zones be made mandatory.

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This motion was seconded by Supervisor Pennino and carried by a vote eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

### HOUSE BILL 1396

Supervisor Hyland called to the Board's attention House Bill 1396, a bill amending the Code of Virginia relating to the establishment of a board of zoning appeals. It was noted that this item was included in the legislative package.

#### RESOLUTION ON THE DISPLAY OF FLAGS

Supervisor Hyland requested that later in the meeting when the Chesapeake Bay legislation is considered, the Board also address a resolution which references the display of flags at state facilities and lake appropriate action.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, action was taken to adopt a Resolution permitting County employees to display flags. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#32.)

#### SENATE B1LL 682

Supervisor Davis requested that he be recorded in opposition to Senate Bill 682, a bill to amend the Code of Virginia relating to the local income tax.

Supervisor McConnell also requested that she be recorded in opposition to Senate Bill 682.

#### ADOPTION OF LEGISLATIVE PACKAGE

Supervisor Hanley clarified the position the Board had taken earlier to oppose House Bill 1916, unless the bill could be made permissive and prospective, and Supervisor Davis' and Supervisor McConnell's opposition to Senate Bill 682.

Supervisor Hanley then moved that the Board concur in the staff recommendation on the legislative package, including the amendments previously stated on Pages Four through Eight of the Clerk's Board Summary. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Pennino and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

#### ADEQUATE PUBLIC FACILITIES ORDINANCE

Supervisor Davis requested information on adequate public facilities ordinance legislation. It was noted that this legislation was carried over and stricken, and that another bill has been introduced to study the legislation. •

Supervisor Moore stated that Mr. Jeffries, Executive Director, Northern Virginia Soil and Water Conservation District (NVSWCD), had advised her that the members of the NVSWCD passed a resolution of gratitude for the conservation policies and practices of the County of Fairfax.

# 18. <u>ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (EDA) PRESENTATION</u> (TAPL 5)

Supervisor Moore stated that the Economic Development Authority (EDA) will appear before the Board of Supervisors at its February 11, 1991 meeting to make a presentation regarding the use of its money to help business in Fairfax County.

Therefore, Supervisor Moore moved that the Board indicate to the EDA that the it would like to have the EDA present a program that informs the Board of how EDA polices will be helping:

- Tourism;
- Existing businesses in Fairfax County; and
- The attraction of business to Fairfax County with the understanding that one of Fairfax County's great assets is Dulles Airport and the attraction of the international trade similar to the effort given to making better relations with Essonne, France and building business relations. She pointed out that this is a priority in establishing policy for attraction of business.

This motion was seconded by Vice-Chairman Pennino and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

Vice-Chairman Pennino returned the gavel to Chairman Moore.

# 19. AUTHORIZATION FOR STAFF TO PROCEED WITH A PLAN AMENDMENT (TAPE 5)

Following a request from the Planning Commission, Supervisor Davis moved that the Board authorize a Plan Amendment to consider a revision to the development criteria contained in the Policy Plan.

A brief discussion ensued with input from James P. Zook, Director, Office of Comprehensive Planning. ٩.

The second to this motion was inaudible. The motion carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# 20. <u>A-4 - VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION</u> (VDOT) PROJECT FOR ROUTE 7 IMPROVEMENTS FROM SEVEN CORNERS TO BAILEY'S CROSSROADS (MASON DISTRICT) (TAPE 5)

Supervisor Davis called to the Board's attention Action Item <u>A-4</u> - <u>Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) Project for Route 7</u> Improvements from Seven Corners to Bailey's Crossroads (Mason District).

Supervisor Davis stated that at the Board of Supervisors' meeting of December 10, 1990 it considered an item regarding the approval of the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) plans for the widening of Route 7 between Seven Corners and Bailey's Crossroads. He said that two issues were raised at the public hearing and staff subsequently met with the citizens to discuss their concerns. Based on these discussions, Supervisor Davis moved that the Board endorse VDOT's plans for widening Route 7 between Bailey's Crossroads and Seven Corners, as presented at VDOT's October 23, 1990 public hearing, including the provisions for a five-foot sidewalk along the south side of Route 7, subject to the provision that VDOT consider and report to the Board of Supervisors on each of the following actions to address concerns expressed by the citizens at the public hearing:

- Provide a median break at the eastern leg of Glen Carlyn Drive to improve access to the Culmore Shopping Center. This would reduce the number of U-turns made at Glen Carlyn Road;
- Eliminate the right-turn lane from westbound Route 7 into the Waters Edge Condominiums at Lakeside Drive. Also, every effort should be made to preserve the existing landscaping along their property;
- Provide either an extension of the service drive west of Peace Valley Lane or a median break to provide improved access to and from westbound Route 7 for the First Christian Church and the Fairfax Funeral Home. This would reduce the number of U-turns that would have to be made at Patrick Henry Drive;

- .22.
- Maintain the median break and signal at the Route 7 entrance to the Bailey's Crossroads Shopping Center until such time as its proximity to the interchange ramps with Columbia Pike and the Payne Street intersection creates operational Upon closing of this problems. intersection, a signalized entrance to the shopping center should be provided on Columbia Pike to facilitate safe access:
- Continue providing access to the residents at 6413 Leesburg Pike, consider maintaining a service drive in front of their building;
- Allow the placement of underground utilities under the continuous right-turn lane within the Bailev's Crossroads Commercial Revitalization area to minimize land acquisition costs and property impacts. This would allow Fairfax County to complete plans and proceed with burying utilities between Columbia Pike and Glen Carlyn Road. This work is funded as part of the County's Commercial Revitalization Program. Project Number 8910:
- With the increased cost of this project over the original estimates and the present lack of funds for right-of-way acquisition and construction, development of right-of-way and construction schedules should consider segmenting the project into two sections. The eastern end of the project, especially the part within the Bailey's Crossroads Revitilization area, is the first priority, with the Seven Corners end as the lowest priority, since it already has six lanes;
- Shift the curb along the Route 7 frontage of the Culmore Shopping Center by four feet which would reduce the considerable impacts on the shopping center's available parking. This site is an important part of the commercial revitalization in the area and this shift would help in maintaining the economic viability of the

existing use. This shift would not be recommended if this site were to develop prior to the construction of the Route 7 widening project;

- Defer construction of that portion of the project between Patrick Henry Drive and Route 50. Currently this portion of Route 7 has six lanes with left turn bays and service drives. The current problem is the interchange with Route 50 which needs substantial improvements. Any major modifications to this interchange would require the reconstruction of this portion of Route 7 and therefore it should be deferred until such interchange improvements are planned as well; and
- Provide sidewalks and trails along side Glen Carlyn Drive on the eastern side to connect with the existing sidewalks.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

21. INCOME TAX RELIEE (TAPE 5)

Supervisor Davis stated that Congress recently enacted legislation that would allow deferment of the filing of income taxes for members of the armed forces serving in the Persian Gulf. Therefore, Supervisor Davis moved that the Board direct staff to determine how the Board could implement a policy for deferring interest payments and/or penalty payments on property taxes due resulting from individuals being active members of the armed forces. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

## 22. <u>REDISTRICTING PROCESS</u> (TAPES 5-6)

(BACs)

(1:50 p.m.)

Supervisor Davis stated that the Board of Supervisors had held a public hearing regarding the redistricting process. He said that a number of groups had requested the Board to appoint a Commission to come forward with early drafts of redistricting proposals. Therefore, Supervisor Davis moved that the Board:

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- Appoint a Commission to work with the County staff and report back at the earliest possible date on criteria;
- Direct the Commission to report with several different options;
- Compose the Commission as follows:
  - One Member appointed from each Supervisor District;
  - \* One Member from the Black Community who could be the joint recommendation of the Urban League, Countywide Black Citizens, NAACP;
  - One Member from the Hispanic Community;
  - One Member from the Asian Community;
  - One Member from the Federation of Citizens Associations;
  - One Member from the League of Women Voters;
  - One Member from the Fairfax County Chamber of Commerce;
  - One Member from the Republican Committee;
  - One Member from the Democratic Committee; and
  - \* One Member to be appointed by the Chairman.

Supervisor Hanley pointed out that this issue had been tabled until a full Board could be present.

Supervisor Davis moved to bring this issue off the table. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Pennino and carried by a recorded vote of six, Supervisor Hanley and Chairman Moore voting "NAY", Supervisor Alexander being absent. .

Supervisor Davis moved that the Board establish this Commission and make appointments at the Board of Supervisors meeting scheduled for February 11, 1991. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Pennino.

Following discussion, Supervisor Bulova moved to amend the motion to direct the lask Force provide the Board with a number of recommendations with the understanding that the Board is not bound by those recommendations and to also "bring in" additional organizations that might be interested in contributing, and this was accepted.

Chairman Moore relinquished the Chair to Vice-Chairman Pennino and asked that the motion be amended so that the Board votes seriatim on the concept of the Commission and then its composition.

Vice-Chairman Pennino returned the gavel to Chairman Moore.

Supervisor Hanley moved a substitute motion that the Board:

- Defer Supervisor Davis' suggestion on a Task Force;
- Direct staff to report at the Board of Supervisors' Meeting scheduled for February 11, 1991 with the protocols for making information available;
- Direct staff to report with the principles and guidelines that were previously established during the last redistricting so that they can be addressed;
- Once protocols and principles are established, direct staff to report at the next meeting to address the issue of the Commission and its composition.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Richards.

Chairman Moore suggested that once the "figures" are available staff could hold workshops on Saturdays making this information available to anyone who requests it.

Supervisor Hanley amended the substitute motion to include Chairman Moore's suggestion.

Following additional discussion, Supervisor Pennino moved to amend the substitute motion (Supervisor Hanley's) to request the staff to go forward with the request for protocol and that the Board request the Federation to establish an independent group based on the Supervisor Richards' list.

Following discussion, Supervisor Hanley accepted the amendment to the motion provided that the Federation be asked if it would establish an independent group.

The question was called on the substitute motion, and as amended, <u>FAILED</u> by a recorded vole of four, Supervisor Hanley, Supervisor Pennino, Supervisor Richards, and Chairman Moore voting "AYE," Supervisor Alexander being absent.

The question was called on the main motion which carried by a recorded vote of seven, Supervisor Pennino voting "NAY," Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# 23. LEAF COLLECTION DISTRICTS (TAPE 6)

Supervisor Davis moved that the Board direct staff to review the letters that he had received from the Rock Spring Professional Center and the Carlyn Square Homeowners Association requesting exclusion from the leaf collection district. The second to this motion was inaudible. The motion carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor Hanley being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# 24. URBAN MASS TRANSPORTATION ADMINISTRATION (UMTA) GRANT (TAPES 6-8)

Supervisor Richards briefed the Board on the Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) Grant as it related to a western facility.

Supervisor Richards moved that the Board endorse the County staff participation in the joint Loudoun, Herndon, Fairfax, Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) effort to provide park-and-ride facilities on the airport property or nearby properties for the purpose of serving Loudoun commuters. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Pennino.

Chairman Moore relinquished the Chair to Vice-Chairman Pennino and moved an amendment to the motion that it be the objective of Fairfax County in going through this process that the parking at Herndon be reduced to approximately 850 - 1,000 spaces and that it be the goal to have additional parking farther out and particularly on the airport property.

Supervisor Richards stated that without the advice of the professionals she could not agree to a specific number at this time.

Following discussion, with input from Shiva K. Pant, Director, Office of Transportation, Supervisor Moore suggested that the Board endorse the concept and the process and additionally request the assistance of Congressman Frank Wolf, UMTA Administrator Bryan Clymer, and Secretary Milliken in bringing this about.

Supervisor Moore moved a substitute motion that the initial parking at Monroe Street be limited to between 850 - 1,000 spaces. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Davis.

Supervisor Moore reiterated that she was suggesting that the Board vote on a concept and then request the assistance of Congressman Wolf, Mr. Clymer, and Secretary Milliken to bring this about.

# (TAPE 8)

Thomas Davis Rust, Mayor, Town of Herndon, briefly related to the Board the Town's position regarding the UMTA Grant.

Following Mayor Rust's remarks and brief Board discussion, Vice-Chairman Pennino requested, for the purpose of clarity, that Supervisor Richards restate her motion and to include any previously-stated amendments of Supervisor Moore that she had accepted as part of her motion.

Supervisor Richards restated her motion as follows:

- That the Board of Supervisors formally endorse a joint effort by the Counties of Loudoun and Fairfax, the Town of Herndon, and VDOT to:
  - \* Establish a scope of work;
  - \* Seek funds from the CTB to hire a consultant;
  - \* Report to the local governments (Counties of Loudoun and Fairfax and the Town of Herndon) for approval of a site west of the present sites included in the UMTA Grant;
  - \* Seek funds from the CTB, from the surplus Toll revenues, for the construction of such a parking lot; and
  - \* Consider, if the funds are not forthcoming, the second, third, and fourth options for financing:

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+ A Loudoun gas tax;

+ A third UMTA grant specifically for Loudoun County, with assistance from Congressman Wolf, Mr. Clymer; and

+ The Developer proffers issue.

Supervisor Richards stated that when the Toll Road extension is constructed there will be significant amounts of property on master plans that will include changes to industrial and commercial uses and proffers may be obtained. She stated that the financing of the lot is the second part of the issue. The initial effort in the very near future, she stated, is to get underway the scope of work, a request for proposal (RFP), and the request to the CTB. She stated that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors should send a letter to:

- The CTB requesting funding; and
- The Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority (MWAA) requesting that it officially place in writing its willingness to host such a parking lot on airport property.

Supervisor Richards stated that she did <u>NOT</u> accept Supervisor Moore's amendment regarding a specific number of parking spaces.

For the purpose of clarity, Supervisor Moore restated her amendment to Supervisor Richards' motion as follows:

- That the purpose of the study would be to arrive at a goal of reduced parking at Monroe Street, with additional parking beyond; and
- That the Board would seek, rather than adopting as an amendment to the UMTA grant application, assistance from Congressman Wolf, Mr. Clymer, and Secretary Milliken to bring the above to fruition.

Supervisor Richards stated that she could not accept Supervisor Moore's amendment to her motion because it is not yet known where the parking lot in the west will be located.

Supervisor Moore moved an amendment to the motion which includes the entire concept:

- That the purpose of this study would be to reduce the parking at Monroe Street <u>initially</u> to approximately 850 to 1,000 parking spaces;
- That there be parking further west; and
- That the Board would seek, rather than adopting as an amendment to the UMTA grant application, assistance from Congressman Wolf, Mr. Clymer, and Secretary Milliken in bringing the above to fruition.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Davis.

The question was called on the amendment (Supervisor Moore's) to the motion which <u>FAILED</u> by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Davis and Supervisor Moore voting "AYE," Supervisor McConnell being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

Following further Board discussion, the question was called on the main motion (Supervisor Richards') which carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor McConnell being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

Supervisor Richards stated that it was her assumption that staff would set up a "fast-track" for the RFP and scope of work, and that the objective would be to place it in the Dulles Corridor Study as a proposed demonstration project by June 1, 1991.

Vice-Chairman Pennino retained the gavel because Chairman Moore left the Board Room to attend to pressing business in the Board Conference Room.

# 25. <u>TYSONS CORNER TASK FORCE MEETING SCHEDULED</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Richards announced that a meeting has been scheduled for the Tysons Corner Task Force for January 30, 1991. She announced that the "kick-off" meeting for the Task Force would be attended by Supervisor Hanley, Supervisor Pennino, and herself.

# 26. <u>APPOINTMENT TO THE TYSONS CORNER TASK FORCE</u> (TAPE 8)

(APPT)

Supervisor Richards moved the appointment of <u>Ms. Sally Liff</u> to replace Mr. S. Branson Marley, Dranesville District Representative to the Tysons Corner Task Force. She announced that Mr. Marley had moved to North Carolina. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hanley and carried by a vote of six, Supervisor McConnell and Chairman Moore being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# 27. <u>CITIZENS BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE (CBOC)</u> <u>REQUESTED TO CONDUCT AN APPRAISAL OF THE</u> <u>COUNTY'S ASSESSMENT PROCEDURES</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Richards stated that all Board Members receive a great many complaints regarding assessment procedures. For example, when one property owner greatly improves his or her property prior to selling, other property owners in the neighborhood feel that they are being treated unfairly when their assessment is based on an action that is not common to the entire neighborhood.

Supervisor Richards asked unanimous consent that the Board request the Citizens Budget Overview Committee (CBOC) to conduct an appraisal of the County's assessment procedures. Without objection, it was so ordered.

# 28. <u>STAFE REQUESTED TO DETERMINE WHETHER VIDEO</u> <u>TAPES OF BOARD MEETINGS COULD BE OVERLAPPED</u> <u>TO ENSURE THAT ALL PORTIONS OF THE MEETINGS</u> <u>ARE COVERED</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Richards asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to determine whether the cable video tapes of the Board meetings could be overlapped in a manner similar to that by which audio recordings for the meetings are overlapped. She stated that many times during the rebroadcasting of the meetings on Tuesdays and Saturdays on cable television, there are brief video tape changes where portions of critical discussions are not shown. Without objection, it was so ordered.

# 29. <u>CLEARING OF THE COLONIAL PIPELINE EASEMENT</u> THROUGH THE ANNANDALE DISTRICT (TAPL 8)

Supervisor Bulova called to the Board's attention the fact that the Colonial Pipeline Company plans to clear its entire 50-foot easement in the Annandale District from Pickett Road, south of Route 236 to the University Shopping Center on Route 123, a distance of approximately three miles. She stated that the pipeline winds through a number of

subdivisions, including Starlit Ponds, Chestnut Hills West, Somerset Old Creek, Olde Forge, Braddock Green, Somerset South, Briarwood, Kings Park West, and the Park West Townhouses.

Supervisor Bulova stated that because Colonial Pipeline has made no attempt to clear the easement for the past 25 years, beautiful, mature trees have grown within the easement. She stated that the easement runs, in some cases through front yards, right up to the front porch of some dwellings.

While public safety is a first priority, Supervisor Bulova questioned whether it should always be necessary to remove all trees within the easement if:

- The location and species of the tree and the root structure are not of the type that will grow toward and touch the pipeline;
- The tree will not interfere with emergency access; and
- The easement can still be seen by the air or can be patrolled by foot or vehicle.

Supervisor Bulova moved that the Board fully support the following requests that she has previously made to the Colonial Pipeline Company:

- To refrain from clearing until the Company has met individually with each affected homeowner; and
- To try to reach a reasonable settlement regarding the extent of clearing or mitigating measures that can be taken to offset the damage this project will cause.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of five, Supervisor Davis, Supervisor McConnell, and Chairman Moore being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

Supervisor Bulova expressed her appreciation to Richard L. Hoff, Chief, Arborist Branch, Design Review Division, Department of Environmental Management, and Steve Sinclair, Department of Consumer Affairs, for their invaluable assistance with this very difficult matter.

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### 30. <u>STARLIT PONDS - MAINTENANCE OF WET PONDS</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Bulova stated that her office has been trying to assist residents of Starlit Ponds with problems associated with their wet ponds. She said that the homeowners association does not have the \$75,000 it would cost to dredge the ponds. She added that they have explored converting the ponds from wet to dry ponds, but there is a \$275,000 price tag to do this. According to the president of the association, their insurance company is now suggesting that they may begin charging \$100 per house per year to cover the liability of having the wet ponds. This would equate to a cost of \$13,000 per year.

Following discussion among Board Members, Supervisor Bulova asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to assist in finding creative solutions to this problem. Without objection, it was so ordered.

# 31. FOURTH ANNUAL TOWN MEETING SCHEDULED FOR MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland announced that the Fourth Annual Town Meeting for Mount Vernon District has been scheduled for Saturday, February 2, 1991 from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. at the Old Walt Whitman Intermediate School/Mount Vernon High School located at 8333 Richmond Highway. The following individuals are scheduled to respond to citizen concerns:

- Audrey Moore, Chairman, Board of Supervisors;

- Anthony H. Griffin, Deputy County Executive for Planning and Development;

Supervisor Hyland urged all interested persons to attend the meeting.

Upon her return to the Board Room, Vice-Chairman Pennino returned the gavel to Chairman Moore.

- 32. FAIRFAX COUNTY SCHOOL STUDENTS' RIGHT TO RALLY IN SUPPORT OF THE TROOPS IN OPERATION DESERT STORM AND BOARD POLICY REGARDING EMPLOYEES' RIGHT TO DISPLAY THE FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA OR WEAR EMBLEMS THAT SIGNIFY EMPLOYEE'S SUPPORT FOR SERVICE MEN AND WOMEN WHILE ENGAGED IN CONFLICT (TAPE 8)
- (R)
- (P) Supervisor Hyland distributed to Board Members copies of a recent article headlined, "School Calls Off Rally for Troops." As a result of the article, he stated that his office has been inundated with telephone calls from citizens vehemently protesting the alleged action by officials in the Area One School District who, after originally granting support, cancelled Mount Vernon High School students' attempt to make and distribute free to its 1,500 student body buttons reading, "Keep America Free" and "DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America) Supports the Troops in Saudi Arabia."

In light of the events during the past several days, Supervisor Hyland expressed his concern that young people's rights to speak out in support or against the war cannot and should not be abridged.

Accordingly, Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board request the Fairfax County School Board to:

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- Review its current procedures applicable to student rallies and demonstrations, and the right of students to exercise freedom of speech while at school; and
- If found to be necessary, make changes to ensure that students have the chance to make their views known.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Davis.

Supervisor McConnell asked that the motion be amended to include that the Board adopt the following Resolution and Board Policy:

In recognition of the many men and women from Fairfax County who are serving their country in the Persian Gulf and whose actions deserve our full support and prayers;

Be It Resolved that the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors make known that it fully endorses the action of the United States Government and its allies in the Persian Gulf, and such endorsement may be evidenced by the displaying of the Flag of the United States of America on all Fairfax County property; and

Furthermore, by this Resolution, the Board establishes the Policy that all Fairfax County employees shall have the right, while at work, to display the Flag of the United States of America or wear emblems that signify that individual's support for our service men and women while they are engaged in conflict.

This amendment was accepted.

The question was called on the motion, and as amended, carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor Richards being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

33. <u>PARK AUTHORITY REQUESTED TO NOTIFY</u> <u>ADJOINING/ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS</u> <u>DURING MASTER PLANNING PROCESS</u> (TAPE 8)

> Supervisor Hyland called to the Board's attention that recently, the Fairfax County Park Authority began its master planning process for Westgrove Park located on Fort Hunt Road. A resident, whose property abuts the Park, contacted Supervisor Hyland's office to advise him that

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he had not been notified of the Park Authority's intentions to begin the planning process for the site even though the notices were sent to surrounding civic associations, baseball league officials, and other individuals.

Supervisor Hyland stated that while it is not a standard procedure to notify property owners until the process has reached the public hearing phase, he feels that this is a great disservice to the residents who will be most affected by the park development.

Following Board discussion, with input from William C. Beckner, Director, Fairfax County Park Authority, Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board request the Park Authority to review its notice policy and implement procedures for notification of adjoining/adjacent property owners during the <u>initial</u> planning phases of any prospective park development. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova and carried by a vote of five, Supervisor Davis, Supervisor Hanley, and Supervisor Richards being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# 34. <u>COMMENDATION FOR MEMBERS OF FIRE AND</u> <u>RESCUE DEPARTMENT'S EMERGENCY SERVICES</u> <u>PERSONNEL</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland distributed to Board Members copies of a letter that he had received from Mr. Robert Rudich. Mr. Rudich recently experienced a medical emergency when his wife was found comatose in their home. He stated that the personnel who responded to his 911 call had responded professionally and quickly and were extremely compassionate. Mr. Rudich expressed his appreciation to the following personnel for their outstanding performance during his difficult time:

- Lieutenant Richards, Medic 11;
- Sergeant Derricott, Medic 11;
- Sergeant Thompson, Squad T1;
- Technician Williams, Medic 11;
- Technician Schaeffer, Squad 11; and
- Technician Simcoe, Squad 11.

Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board direct the Office of Public Affairs to present the aforementioned individuals with Certificates of Appreciation and that an appropriate letter of transmittal from the Chairman be included in their personnel files. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by a vote of five, Supervisor Hanley, Supervisor Pennino, and Supervisor Richards being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

### 35. <u>SPECIAL THANKS TO BELLEVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland stated that he had received a letter from a constituent describing a community service project that raised \$1,500 to help provide basic necessities, as well as toys, other gifts, and K-Mart gift certificates, for the most needy in the community - homeless families being sheltered in motels.

On behalf of the Board and the citizens of Fairfax County, Supervisor Hyland expressed his appreciation to the Belleview Elementary School Parents-Teachers Association (PTA), parents, students, faculty and staff, and in particular, Tommy Thompson, Principal, for their outstanding efforts.

Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board forward a letter of appreciation, under the Chairman's signature, to Mr. Thompson expressing the entire Board's congratulations on this special effort. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Davis and carried by a vote of five, Supervisor Hanley, Supervisor Pennino, and Supervisor Richards being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

# 36. <u>COMMENDATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC</u> WORKS' STAFE (TAPL 8)

Supervisor Hyland stated that he had received a letter from the residents of Curtis and Braddock Avenues which provides specific, detailed and glowing praise for the staff of the Department of Public Works (DPW), Project Engineering Division, and Utilities, Planning and Design Division. In addition, Supervisor Hyland expressed his appreciation to the Project Foreman and work crew for General Excavation, Incorporated, for their leadership and concern for the residents' welfare.

Supervisor Hyland expressed his appreciation for a job well done to those already expressed in the letter.

Supervisor Hyland asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to place the letter of commendation in each of the individual personnel files for each staff person from DPW involved in the project. Without objection, it was so ordered.

# 37. <u>INFORMATIONAL ITEM REGARDING DAVID M. GRIFFITH</u> AND ASSOCIATES, LIMITED (DMG) (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland said that he received a letter from David M. Griffith and Associates, Limited (DMG), offering a variety of services in the storm water management field.

Supervisor Hyland said that the letter was addressed to <u>Ms.</u> Gerry Hyland and he stated for the record that there has been no biological metamorphosis of the elected representative in the Mount Vernon District.

Supervisor Hyland re-emphasized that minorily male membership on the Board remains at three and he suggested that DMG stands for "Dig My Gender."

#### 38. BUSINESS RECYCLING SYMPOSIUM (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland stated that commercial refuse comprises 55 percent of the waste stream in Fairfax County. He said that in order to further reduce the waste stream and to better educate the business community on the benefits and methods of recycling, the Department of Public Works, in association with the National Wildlife Federation and Northern Virginia Planning District Commission (NVPDC), will be hosting a free one-day business recycling symposium this Wednesday, January 30, 1990 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The symposium will be held at the National Wildlife Federation located at 8925 Leesburg Pike, Vienna. For further information please contact Tanis Skislak, Recycling Coordinator at 246-5436.

Chairman Moore expressed her appreciation to Ms. Skislak for her outstanding staff performance.

## 39. <u>CONGRATULATIONS TO MICHAEL JOHNSON.</u> <u>FAIRFAX COUNTY ARCHAEOLOGIST. FOR</u> <u>RECEIVING NATIONAL RECOGNITION</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland announced that Michael Johnson, Fairfax County's Archaeologist, has just been chosen by the Archaeological Society of Virginia as its Professional Archaeologist of the Year. This honor is given to one outstanding professional for contributions to historical preservation.

Supervisor Hyland noted that Michael has been with the Fairfax County Heritage Resources Branch for more than 12 years and has developed outstanding volunteer and training programs which have led people to change careers to go into archaeological work full time. Because of the expertise gained in this training program, volunteers are sought by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, the National Park Service, and the Mount Vernon Estate, as well as from the private sector. Michael is now being sought after nationally to speak about his suburban archaeological volunteer program.

Supervisor Hyland asked unanimous consent that the Board:

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- Express its gratitude to Michael Johnson for his commitment to preserving Fairfax County's heritage;
- Transmit a letter, under the Chairman's signature, congratulating Mr. Johnson, for receiving this national recognition; and
- Direct staff to place the letter of commendation in his individual personnel file.

Without objection, it was so ordered.

## 40. <u>SAFE DISPOSAL OF FIRE RETARDANT PLYWOOD</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland distributed to each Board Member a copy of a resolution passed on January 23, 1991 by the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens Associations outlining the Council's grave concerns about the safe disposal of fire retardant plywood.

Noting that thousands of attached dwelling units and commercial buildings have been built with fire retardant plywood, Supervisor Hyland stated that it is now known that the chemicals used in treating the fire retardant plywood are not "locked in" and that the treatment industry is unregulated and their formulas are proprietary. He further stated that chemicals can migrate into ground water when disposed of in a debris landfill and that the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) precludes this material from being burned because of its toxicity.

Therefore, because of these concerns, Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board direct staff to:

- Identify ways to safely dispose of fire retardant plywood; and
- Report back to the Board within two weeks with its recommendations.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by a vote of five, Supervisor Hanley, Supervisor Pennino, and Supervisor Richards being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

## 41. <u>ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ADVISORY COUNCIL (EQAC)</u> – <u>RECYCLING REDUCTION</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland called the Board's attention to a resolution recently passed by the Environmental Quality Advisory Council (EQAC) regarding environmental education and practices in Fairfax County's school system. He noted that this resolution offers viable ways of raising the public awareness on environmental issues.

Therefore, Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board:

- Support the EQAC resolution;
- Notify the Fairfax County School Board of its support; and
- Encourage the School Board to consider the options presented by EQAC.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by a vote of six, Supervisor Pennino and Supervisor Richards being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

## 42. <u>POSSIBLE MASS BURN INCINERATOR ASH EMISSION</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hyland stated that he has received telephone inquiries regarding the, "big plume of black smoke coming out of the stack of the mass burn incinerator." He further stated that he was told, upon investigation into the matter, that when the baghouse is being changed there is an approximate five to six minute particle emission. When the black smoke is visible, the baghouse is being changed, which cannot be avoided. He was also reminded that there is constant monitoring of the stack by the State Air Pollution Control Board, and that whenever there is a violation, it is automatically recorded and reported.

Displaying a sample of what is believed to be a stack emission during the night of January 25-26, 1991, Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board direct staff to:

- Investigate these events to determine the site from which the emission originated;
- Analyze the ash to determine what toxics are present;
- Determine how often and how long each event lasted, and how and when it can be rectified;

January 28, 1991

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- Describe the ongoing training and experience of each employee who operates the controls of the Ogden Martin facility; and
- Report back to the Board with this information on <u>February 11, 1991.</u>

This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by a vote five, Supervisor Davis, Supervisor Pennino, and Supervisor Richards being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

John W. diZerega, Director, Department of Public Works, and Joyce M. Doughty, Deputy Director, Solid Waste Division, briefly addressed the Board concerning this matter. Staff stated that following a review of the data, it had been determined that the residue had <u>NOT</u> been emitted from the mass burn incinerator.

Staff was directed to investigate and determine where the residue had been emitted from and report with its findings on February 11, 1991.

43. <u>INTENT TO DEFER PH ON SPECIAL EXCEPTION</u> <u>APPLICATION SE 89-P-079 (ORVAL E. GOODSEL)</u> (PROVIDENCE DISTRICT) (TAPE 8)

> Supervisor Hanley announced her intent, at the appropriate time later in the meeting, to defer indefinitely the public hearing on Special Exception Application SE 89-P-079 due to the Planning Commission's indefinite deferral of its decision on this application.

> (NOTE: Later in the meeting, this public hearing was deferred indefinitely. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#101.)

44. <u>MATERIALS TESTING LABORATORY RECEIVES</u> <u>NATIONAL CERTIFICATION</u> (TAPE 8)

> Supervisor Hanley announced that the Department of Environmental Management's (DEM), Design Review Division, Public Utilities Branch, <u>Materials Testing Laboratory</u> had been designated as the only such county government facility in the United States (U.S.) to be certified by the U.S. Department of Commerce's National Institute of Standards and Technology under its National Voluntary Laboratory Accreditation Program.

> Individual Board Members commended the outstanding performance of the Materials Testing Laboratory.

## 45. <u>ELIMINATION OF FLYOVER PROFFERED BY</u> <u>THE FRIENDSWOOD DEVELOPMENT COMPANY</u> (TAPE 8)

Supervisor Hanley called to the Board's attention a memorandum that she had received regarding the flyover proffered by the Friendswood

Development Company, Springfield District side of Route 50 at Waples Mill Road. She stated that the proffered flyover was to be eliminated and she asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to respond on how the elimination of the flyover will affect Rezoning Application RZ 90-P-040 which has additional items proffered on the opposite side of the road. In addition, she questioned whether there is any action that the Board could take to prevent the elimination of the flyover proffer. Without objection, it was so ordered.

46. <u>CHANGE IN FAIRFAX COUNTY PUBLIC</u> <u>SCHOOLS POLICY ON THE EDUCATION OF</u> <u>EMPLOYEES FOR HIV ISSUES</u> (TAPE 8)

> Supervisor Hanley called to the Board's attention a memorandum dated January 17, 1991 that she had received from the Health Care Advisory Board (HCAB) indicating the change in the Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) policy on the education of the employees for HIV issues. As the designated advisory body, the HCAB recommended that the Board of Supervisors express its concerns to the FCPS regarding the change in education policies.

> Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board express to the FCPS the concerns of the HCAB and request that the School Board provide additional information on the FCPS system current implementation plan for HIV education for its employees. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland.

> Following Board discussion, the question was called on the motion which carried by a vote of five, Supervisor McConnell, Supervisor Pennino, and Supervisor Richards being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

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#### 47. <u>HOUSE BILL 1968 - AFFORDABLE HOUSING BILL</u> (TAPE 9)

With reference to line 45 of the last page of the Affordable Housing Bill which repeals Fairfax County's enabling authority, Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board of Supervisors:

- Oppose House Bill 1968; and
- Seek amendments which would leave Fairfax County's current enabling authority intact.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of five, Supervisor McConnell, Supervisor Richards, and Chairman Moore being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

(NOTE: Earlier in the meeting, there was additional discussion regarding this item. See Clerk's Summary Items CL#12 and 15.)

#### 48. <u>CONCURRENCE WITH VACATION OF RIGHT-OF-WAY</u> FOR AMANDA PLACE (TAPE 9)

Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board of Supervisors concur with Rezoning Application RZ 89-P-002 so that the rezoning, including the proposed vacation of right-of-way for Amanda Place, which is a part of the application in which the Board owns the underlying fee to the title, may proceed. It is noted that this concurrence should not be construed as a favorable recommendation on the rezoning application by the Board of Supervisors, and does not relieve the applicant or owner from compliance with provisions applicable ordinances. the of any regulations, or adopted standards. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Davis and carried by a vote of five. Supervisor McConnell, Supervisor Richards, and Chairman Moore being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

### 49. <u>PLAN AMENDMENT - ADDITIONAL PARCELS</u> (TAPE 9)

Supervisor Hanley referred to previous discussions regarding the Plan Amendment criteria and asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to address the issue of how additional parcels, which are included in the Plan, relate to the existing zoned parcels in that particular area. Without objection, it was so ordered.

## 50. <u>INCREASE IN NUMBER OF TRUSTEES FOR THE</u> HOUSING TRUST FUND (TAPE 9)

Supervisor Davis asked unanimous consent that the Board request the Housing Subcommittee (Supervisor Hanley and Supervisor Hyland) to meet in order to discuss a possible increase in the number of trustees for the Housing Trust Fund. Without objection, it was so ordered.

# 51. <u>STAFF TO BEGIN IMMEDIATELY TO WORK WITH</u> <u>PRC TASK FORCE</u> (TAPE 9)

(APPT)

Referring to the Board's earlier discussion with regard to the PRC Task Force, Supervisor Pennino asked unanimous consent that the Board:

> Direct staff to begin immediately working with the PRC Task Force in order that some action may come forth within a three or four month period; and

 Appoint <u>Ms. Nancy Larson</u> as the Chairman of the PRC Task Force.

Without objection, it was so ordered.

(NOTE: Earlier in the meeting, there was additional discussion regarding this item. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#16.)

52. <u>SALUTE TO J. HAMILTON LAMBERT</u> (TAPE 9)

Supervisor Pennino briefed Board Members on the upcoming "Salute to J. Hamilton Lambert" at the Tysons Sheraton. She announced that the Master of Ceremonies will be Former Governor Baliles. In addition, Supervisor Pennino noted that there will be an open reception, with a cash bar, beginning at 6 p.m., and that persons who wish to only attend the reception may do so without purchasing a dinner ticket.

53. CORRECTION OF THE RECORD TO REFLECT THE NEED FOR A TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF WAPLES MILL ROAD AND HISTORY DRIVE (TAPE 9)

> Supervisor Pennino announced that the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) had agreed to place a four-way stop sign at the intersection of Bronzedale Drive and History Drive.

In addition, Supervisor Pennino moved that the Board direct staff to:

- Correct the record to reflect that the citizens have requested a traffic signal at the intersection of Waples Mill Road and History Drive; and
- Prepare a letter to VDO1 which includes this correction.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hanley and carried by a vote of five, Supervisor Bulova, Supervisor Davis, and Supervisor McConnell being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

## 54. USE OF COUNTY-OWNED PROPERTY BY THE CHANTILLY YOUTH ASSOCIATION (TAPE 9)

Supervisor McConnell stated that she had been contacted by the Chantilly Youth Association (CYA) regarding the use of County-owned property at the Route 50/Stringfellow Road intersection on an interim basis for ball fields. She noted that Chantilly, like other parts of Fairfax County, suffers from a shortage of soccer and ball fields. The parcel in question is approximately 23 acres on which the Chantilly Library and other County facilities will be built. Supervisor McConnell further stated that the CYA is interested in renting part of the 23 acres, on an interim basis, and is willing to contribute materials and labor to develop the facilities.

Therefore, Supervisor McConnell moved that the Board direct staff to evaluate this proposal and report back as expeditiously as possible with its recommendations. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hanley and carried by a vote of five, Supervisor Bulova, Supervisor Davis, and Supervisor Pennino being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander being absent.

#### 55. <u>APPROVAL OF LOT LINE ADJUSTMENTS</u> (TAPE 9)

Noting that certain homeowners have been unable to obtain approval of simple lot line adjustments due to a technicality in the existing provisions of Section 2-405 of the Zoning Ordinance, Supervisor McConnell asked unanimous consent that the Board direct the Zoning Administrator to review this problem and report back to the Board on <u>February 11, 1991</u> with an explanation of this issue. Without objection, it was so ordered.

# 56. <u>SHOW OF SUPPORT FOR VIRGINIA TROOPS IN</u> THE PERSIAN GULE (TAPE 9)

Supervisor McConnell stressed the importance of a show of support by Virginia's elected officials for Virginia's troops stationed in the Persian Gulf. As a precedent for the entire nation, she suggested that it might be appropriate for the Board to request the State of Virginia to cooperate in the design of a little pin which is a cross of two flags, the American flag and the Virginia flag, with a little plaque under it which says, "Your elected official supports you." The military command would be requested to allow the men and women in our Armed Forces, who are from the State of Virginia, to wear this pin while in the Persian Gulf.

Following discussion, Supervisor McConnell asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to examine the costs involved in producing such a pin.

Supervisor Hanley asked that the request be amended to include a review of this suggestion by the Virginia Association of Counties (VACo).

Without objection, the request, as amended, was so ordered.

The Board next considered an Item contained in the Memorandum to the Board dated January 28, 1991 requesting the Board's consideration of an appeal of the Planning Commission's decision to uphold the denial of Site Plan Number 7568-SP-01-2, Ashley House, by the Director of the Department of Environmental Management (DEM). The basis for the Director's denial of this Site Plan was his decision that further review of the Site Plan was not justified as the issue of whether Parcel A-2 may be developed at all under the provisions of the Virginia Condominium Act (Va. Code 55-79.39 to 55-79.103, 1986, and Supp., 1988) has not been satisfactorily addressed.

Following Board discussion, with input from Thomas E. Helf, Attorney, Stauffer and Abraham, representing the appellant, Supervisor Bulova stated that the applicant has not shown that Parcel A-2 is properly withdrawn from the original condominium regime or has otherwise demonstrated that the parcel is developable. These factors, coupled with the fact that the Site Plan showed other ordinance deficiencies, including structures to be built within the recorded floodplain easement held by the Board contributes to her motion to uphold the decision.

Accordingly, Supervisor Bulova moved that the Board uphold the November 15, 1990 decision of the Planning Commission to affirm the decision of the Director of DEM to <u>DENY</u> Site Plan Number 7568-SP-01-2, Ashley House, Annandale District, for the reasons stated in the Staff Report, as well as the reasons stated in her closing remarks.
