## 38.I-7 - PRODUCTION OF THE UPDATED TAX EVADERS CABLE TELEVISION PROGRAM (Tape 6)

Chairman Davis called the Board's attention to <u>Information Item I-7</u> and announced that the staff would proceed to broadcast the updated tax evaders videotape at this time.

#### 39. **REPORT ON THE MAINTENANCE FACILITY AT WEST OX GARAGE** (Tape 6)

- William J. Leidinger, County Executive, briefed the Board on the school bus situation at the West Ox Garage Facility now under Johnson Controls. He reported that the 16-18 percent vehicle out-of-commission rate from last week for the school buses is now down to a rate of 5.6 percent for school buses and 7.4 percent for non-school bus vehicles, with an overall out-of-commission rate of 6.3 percent.
- Following discussion, Supervisor Hyland asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to provide Board Members with a six month status report on the difficulty of the transition of the West Ox Facility to aid the Board in future privatization efforts. Without objection, it was so ordered.
- Following further discussion, Supervisor Dix asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to provide Board Members with weekly reports over the next 90 days, regarding the actual out-of-commission percentages for school buses and for non-school vehicles. Without objection, it was so ordered.
- (NOTE: Later in the meeting, there was another brief discussion of this issue. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#47.)

## 40.<u>OUT-OF-TURN PLAN AMENDMENT IN THE WOODLAWN HISTORIC DISTRICT</u> (Tape 6)

- Chairman Davis reminded the Board of a Special Exception Application SE 93-V-028 that came before the Board regarding the sale of packaged food items such as commonly found in vending machines.
- Chairman Davis relinquished the Chair to Vice-Chairman McConnell and moved that the Board direct staff to schedule a public hearing on Out-of-Turn Comprehensive Plan Amendment in Area IV, MV8 Woodlawn Community Planning Sector, Heritage Resources Sector, to consider including language which permits the sale of limited packaged food items in conjunction with renovations of existing service stations. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.
- Supervisor Hyland informed the Board of a letter he had received from Mr. Frank W. Stearns, the applicant in the case referred to by Chairman Davis, and moved that the Board:
- ■Reconsider its action from the meeting on March 21, 1994 regarding the Mount Vernon Exxon Station, Rezoning Application RZ 93-V-014 and Special Exception Application SEA 93-V-028; and
- Defer Board decision on the application pending action on the Out-of-Turn Plan Amendment.
- This motion was seconded by Supervisor Dix and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.
- Supervisor Hyland further moved that the simultaneous processing of the Site Plan be authorized by the Board with the usual caveats that the applicant is taking full risk if denial of the rezoning application should occur after action on the Out-of-Turn Plan Amendment. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Berger and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.

## 41.<u>AMENDMENT TO THE CODE OF THE COUNTY OF FAIRFAX, CHAPTER 62,</u> <u>SECTION 62-2-6, FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES</u> (Tape 6)

- Supervisor Davis called the Board's attention to another decision made at the meeting of March 21, 1994 regarding Chapter 62, Fire Protection Services. He stated that a portion of that decision dealt with compressed natural gas in a station in the Sully District and precluded some other options in which the Board had previously expressed an interest. Supervisor Davis therefore moved that the Board reconsider that decision. This motion was seconded by Vice-Chairman McConnell and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.
- With a notation that the previous amendments approved by the Board created a problem for the station being constructed in the Sully District, Supervisor Bulova moved that the Board

amend Chapter 62, Section 62-2-6, Subsection F-3602.3 of the Code of the County of Fairfax as follows: delete the fifth and sixth words of the first line "and CNG;" The new section would then read: "F 3602.3 self service; self service LP gas operations in service stations open to the public shall be prohibited." The effect of this change would be to permit the public to refuel their vehicles with compressed natural gas in the same way that many pump their gasoline at service stations today. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.

- Supervisor Bulova informed the Board of concerns raised regarding the addition to Section 3205-8, which delays the building of additional unmanned stations in Fairfax County, self-serve centers that operate through use of a credit card, and asked unanimous consent that this matter be referred to staff for a report on what other jurisdictions are doing this and what their experiences are so that the Board can determine if this is something to pursue in Fairfax County. Without objection, it was so ordered.
- Supervisor Dix asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to include in that report the feasibility of a pilot program in the County related to this matter. Without objection, it was so ordered.

## 42. POTENTIAL HEALTH HAZARDS ASSOCIATED WITH DIMILIN (Tape 6)

Supervisor Davis informed the Board that a citizen had brought to his attention the potential health hazards associated with Dimilin, a chemical pesticide scheduled to be sprayed aerially in Fairfax County to control gypsy moths. Acknowledging that a neighborhood can be removed from the spray area and given information on alternative methods of gypsy moth prevention, Supervisor Davis asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to review this matter. Without objection, it was so ordered.

## 43.<u>COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD'S PREALLOCATION PUBLIC</u> <u>HEARING</u> (Tapes 6-7)

- Supervisor Davis informed the Board that the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) will be holding a Preallocation public hearing on April 22, 1994 at 10 a.m. on transportation funding. He stated that the County Board of Supervisors adopted the County's input for this public hearing at the Board meeting of March 21, 1994, and staff has already forwarded this input to the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) for the record. However, as in the past, it is important that brief testimony on behalf of the Board emphasizing the Board's key requests be provided.
- Supervisor Davis stated that he would be out of town on the date of this hearing and asked unanimous consent that the Board authorize Vice-Chairman McConnell to appear before the CTB to present testimony on behalf of the Board of Supervisors and that Office of Transportation staff prepare brief comments for Vice-Chairman McConnell to present at this hearing. Without objection, it was so ordered.

## 44. WAIVER OF PERMIT FEES FOR FAXFAIR CORPORATION (Tape 7)

Supervisor Davis moved that the Board direct the Director of the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) to defray all DEM permit fees on behalf of the Faxfair Corporation directly associated with the 1994 Fairfax Fair. This motion concerns permit fees only and does not relieve the applicant of the responsibility to secure all necessary permits, required inspections, and otherwise comply with all applicable codes and ordinances. This fee defrayal pertains only to permits the Faxfair Corporation is required to secure and does not include permits for any for-profit organizations participating in the Fairfax County Fair. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.

Vice-Chairman McConnell returned the gavel to Chairman Davis.

## 45.<u>WASHINGTON REGIONAL ALCOHOL PROGRAM "SAFE SENIOR SEASON"</u> (Tape 7)

- Supervisor Dix stated that "Safe Senior Season" is a regional effort to highlight positive graduation substance-free celebration alternatives during prom and graduation season along with beach week. This initiative is sponsored by the Washington Regional Alcohol Program (WRAP). As an extension of Operation Prom Graduation, started over 10 years ago, the campaign has helped to save hundreds of young lives by encouraging responsible, safe behavior.
- Supervisor Dix said that Safe Senior Season involves 144 public and private high schools with more than 50,000 graduating seniors. WRAP provides a special resource guide listing the various alcohol and drug prevention agencies throughout the region, ideas for assemblies, activities, contacts for special presentations and student displays discussing the dangers of using alcohol and other drugs. There will also be radio public service announcements and school public address system announcements with the "no-use" message.
- Supervisor Dix said that this effort is supported by both the Fairfax County Police Department and the Fairfax County Public Schools, and by working together as a community, the collective efforts can make a difference in protecting many young men and women during their time of triumph and celebration.

Therefore, Supervisor Dix moved that the Board:

■Support this effort; and

- ■Direct the appropriate staff to prepare a Proclamation designating April 22-June 30, 1994 as "Safe Senior Season" for presentation on April 22, 1994 at the "Safe Senior Season" kickoff.
- This motion was seconded by Chairman Davis and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.

## 46.<u>REQUEST FOR SIMULTANEOUS PROCESSING FOR A SPECIAL EXCEPTION</u> <u>APPLICATION AND SITE PLAN FOR DULLES CORNER PROPERTIES I</u>

## **<u>LIMITED PARTNERSHIP</u>** (Tape 7)

- Supervisor Dix stated that Dulles Corner Properties I Limited Partnership has filed a Special Exception Application to establish a child care center at Dulles Corner. The application has scheduled Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors for public hearing dates and is currently being reviewed by staff.
- Because of certain contractual obligations of the applicant, Supervisor Dix moved that the Board authorize simultaneous processing to allow the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) to review the Site Plan during the Special Exception process. Supervisor Dix stated that this motion does not relieve the applicant from complying with the provisions of any applicable ordinances, regulations or adopted standards, and it does not prejudice the consideration of the Special Exception Application in any way. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Frey and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.

## 47. PRIVATIZATION OF WEST OX VEHICLE MAINTENANCE FACILITY REVISITED (Tape 8)

- (NOTE: Earlier in the meeting, there was a discussion and Board action regarding this issue. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#39.)
- Supervisor Hyland stated that he had planned to raise issues concerning the privatization of the West Ox Vehicle Maintenance Facility. However, his concerns regarding the Board receiving periodic reports about the transition of the privatization of the West Ox Facility have been addressed by Supervisor Dix in the discussion held earlier in the meeting.

## 48. A SURE-FIRE RECIPE FOR EXPEDITING MEETINGS (Tape 8)

Supervisor Hyland distributed to Board Members a copy of a recently published solution (cartoon) to meetings which drag on indefinitely.

## 49. ARBOR DAY CELEBRATION TO BE HELD AT GRIST MILL PARK ON SATURDAY, APRIL 16, 1994 (Tape 8)

Supervisor Hyland announced that an Arbor Day Celebration would be held at Grist Mill Park on Saturday, April 16, 1994 beginning at 10:00 a.m.

#### 50.<u>OUT-OF-TURN PLAN AMENDMENT TO EXAMINE ALTERNATIVE ALIGNMENTS</u> <u>OF SENECA ROAD</u> (Tape 8)

- Supervisor Berger stated that a number of citizens who live along Seneca Road and the general area it serves in Great Falls are experiencing increasing congestion and delays in attempting to access Georgetown Pike and Route 7. Seneca Road is one of the very few roads in the area so there are no real alternatives to using this road to reach the major arteries. Unfortunately, the traffic is continuing to grow in this part of the County and it is becoming increasingly difficult to exit Seneca Road at Georgetown Pike because of the amount of traffic on both roads.
- Supervisor Berger pointed out that one way of solving this problem could be the realignment and extension of Georgetown Pike to the north and west so that it intersects Route 7 west of its current intersection with Route 7. Another would be the realignment of Seneca Road so that it would also intersect Route 7 west of the current Georgetown Pike intersection. These concepts would allow those residents along Seneca Road who wish to travel west to Herndon Junction or Sterling to completely avoid Georgetown Pike. There may be an opportunity in the near future to have such a road constructed through the development process if in fact it proves to be a viable idea.

Therefore, Supervisor Berger moved that the Board:

- Authorize an Out-of-turn Plan Amendment; and
- ■Direct staff to examine alternative alignments of Seneca Road in the general Route 7/Georgetown Pike area to determine if a realignment should be placed on the Plan.
- This motion was seconded by Chairman Davis and carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor Dix being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.

#### 51.<u>RECONSIDERATION OF ACTION ITEM A-9 - APPROVAL OF TOWN OF CLIFTON</u> <u>MEETING HALL LEASE AGREEMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF</u> <u>CLARIFICATION</u> (Tape 8)

- Supervisor Frey moved to reconsider the motion to approve <u>Action Item A-9 Approval of Town of</u> <u>Clifton Meeting Hall Lease Agreement</u> for the purpose of clarification. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor Dix being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.
- Supervisor Frey moved to amend the motion to approve the Town of Clifton Meeting Hall Lease Agreement by conditioning approval of the Lease Agreement upon the submission by the Town of Clifton to the Board for its approval of a uniform schedule of fees and a list of rules for the use of the facility which would be applicable to all town and County non-profit community activities. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor Dix being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.

## 52.<u>REQUEST FOR WAIVER OF FILING FEES FOR THE CHURCH OF ASCENSION</u> (FORMERLY THE OLD STONE CHURCH) (Tape 8)

- Supervisor Frey stated that the Church of the Ascension (formerly the Old Stone Church) located in the Centreville Historic District has filed an application for rezoning. He explained that this is necessary to allow the church to connect with water and sewer lines which are being constructed. He noted that the church has only 75 members with 15 being children.
- Therefore, Supervisor Frey moved that the Board waive the filing fee for this application. This motion was seconded by Chairman Davis and carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor Dix being out of the room, Supervisor Alexander and Supervisor Hanley being absent.

#### 53.<u>CONCURRENT PROCESSING OF THE SITE PLANS AND OTHER ENGINEERING</u> <u>DOCUMENTS FOR SPECIAL EXCEPTION APPLICATION SE 94-Y-007</u> (Tape 8)

## 60.LAKE BRADDOCK SECONDARY SCHOOL MATH TEACHER, SHARRON BRADS GORRELL RECIPIENT OF 1993 PRESIDENTIAL AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING (Tape 9)

- Supervisor Bulova distributed to Board Members copies of newspaper articles regarding Lake Braddock Secondary School Math Teacher, Sharron Brads Gorrell. She said that this seventh grade teacher was one of 107 teachers nationwide selected to receive the 1993 Presidential Award for Excellence in teaching. Her innovative teaching methods are extremely effective. According to Mrs. Gorrell's Subschool Principal, "This teacher has a way of inspiring kids to want to be mathematicians, to love math and to love going to her class daily."
- Therefore, Supervisor Bulova asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to invite Mrs. Gorrell to appear before the Board to be thanked and recognized for her outstanding contribution. Without objection, it was so ordered.

## 61.BUFFER POLICY FOR ADDITIONS, RETAINING WALLS, POOLS, DETACHED GARAGES, ETCETERA PERTAINING TO THE CHESAPEAKE BAY PRESERVATION ORDINANCE (Tape 9)

- Supervisor McConnell stated that it had recently been called to her attention that the County has a 10-foot buffer policy for additions, retaining walls, pools, detached garages, etcetera as it pertains to the Chesapeake Bay Preservation Ordinance and land in the Resource Protection Area (RPA).
- Supervisor McConnell stated her belief that this policy, as it pertains to pools, is extremely restrictive and costly to homeowners. For example a 750 square foot pool along with its decking exceeds the 2,500 square foot disturbed area when the 10-foot buffer is calculated. As a result, the homeowner is then faced with additional charges for a private engineer to prepare a grading plan for a minimum of \$700. If a pool is in an RPA, the Special Projects Branch, Design Review Division, Department of Environmental Management (DEM) requires a wetland study which costs \$1,600-2,000.
- Supervisor McConnell related her understanding of the policy background is that staff believes that additional ground disturbance will take place during construction and this fact is undisputed. However, Supervisor McConnell stated her belief that the 10-foot buffer all the way around the project is excessive and that an engineer's certification on the grading plan of the entire area to be disturbed for the construction of the project should satisfy the County. She further stated that this could be verified on site by inspectors and that other jurisdictions handle it in this manner.
- Accordingly, Supervisor McConnell asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to return this item to the Board for consideration in the form of a policy amendment which would give the homeowner the option to have an engineer's certification of the total disturbed land area in lieu of the blanket 10-foot buffer policy at the meeting scheduled for April 25, 1994. Without objection, it was so ordered.

## 62.<u>DECLARATION OF APRIL 17-23 AS NATIONAL ORGAN AND TISSUE DONOR</u> <u>AWARENESS WEEK</u> (Tape 9)

- (R)Supervisor McConnell stated that she had received a letter from Charlie Scott, a resident in the Clifton area of the Springfield District, informing her that Congress has declared the week of April 17-23, 1994 as "National Organ and Tissue Donor Awareness Week." In his letter he had stated that seven people die each day because life-saving organs are not available. Mr. Scott was a liver transplant recipient four years ago.
- Supervisor McConnell said that one way to increase the number of people who pledge organs and tissue after they die is to increase the public awareness of how beneficial donations can be to persons in need of organs or tissue. Accordingly, she moved adoption of the following resolution:

- **WHEREAS**, there is a serious shortage of organs for transplantation due to a lack of public awareness;
- WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has declared the week of April 17-23, 1994 "National Organ and Tissue Donor Awareness Week;"
- **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County, Virginia declares April 17-23, 1994 "Fairfax County Organ and Tissue Donor Awareness Week" and calls upon the citizens of said County to discuss lifesaving organ donation with their next of kin.
