- (A) Supervisor Dix, Chairman, Board's Legislative Subcommittee, briefly outlined the 1995 Legislative Program and moved approval of the Fairfax County Legislative Program Draft dated December 2, 1994 as presented to Board Members on December 5, 1994. The second to this motion was inaudible.

Following discussion, Supervisor Hyland moved to amend the motion to recommend legislation to amend Section 15.1-729 which reads: "Members of the Board and the Chairman shall devote full time to the work of the County, and employment by any other entity shall be prohibited," to read as follows:

"Members of the Board and the Chairman shall devote full time to the work of the County."

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova.

Following further discussion, with input from Michael H. Long, Assistant County Attorney, Supervisor Dix asked to amend the amendment by adding the following sentence:

■ "Supplemental employment which does not impede or conflict with the full time commitment is permitted."

And this was accepted.

Following discussion, with additional input from Mr. Long, the question was called on the motion to amend, as amended, which carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

The question was then called on the motion to approve the Fairfax County Legislative Package, as amended, which carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

Supervisor Dix moved approval of the draft Resolution on the Small Claims Court issue as submitted. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hanley and carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

Supervisor Bulova moved that the Board direct staff to draft legislation and advertisement for a public hearing before the Board regarding the requirement of headgear and eye protection for moped users in the County. This motion was seconded by Vice-Chairman McConnell and carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

Following discussion, with input from Susan Mittereder, Legislative Liaison, Office of the County Executive, Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board direct staff to send a letter to Cindy M. Following discussion, Supervisor Alexander moved a substitute motion that the Board defer action on this particular item until review of Governor Allen's overall budget which is scheduled for release on December 19, 1994. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland.

Following additional discussion, Supervisor Frey clarified that the intent of his motion is to endorse Governor Allen's proposal in "concept" only, with no specific budget initiatives or phase-out program, which presumably will be dealt with through the regular Legislative Committee process.

After further discussion, the question was called on the substitute motion which <u>CARRIED</u> by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Berger, Supervisor Frey, Supervisor Dix, and Supervisor Trapnell voting "NAY," Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

The question was then called on the main motion, as substituted, which <u>CARRIED</u> by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Berger, Supervisor Frey, Supervisor Dix, and Supervisor Trapnell voting "NAY," Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, this item was reconsidered. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#98.)

29. HISTORIC CIVIL WAR TRAIL AT WALNEY GLEN (Tapes 3-4)

Supervisor Frey announced that the historic Civil War trail at Walney Glen has been completed by the developer and appropriate signage is in place; however, a question has arisen regarding who is responsible for maintaining the trail, even though it is built on County property.

Accordingly, Supervisor Frey asked unanimous consent that the Board direct the Deputy County Executive for Planning and Development to determine appropriate responsibility for this historic trail. Without objection, it was so ordered.

30. **PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING DECEMBER 5, 1994 AS "LORRAINE WOLLART DAY"** (Tape 4)

Supervisor Frey announced that Lorraine Wollart, Washington Times Reporter, is transferring within the newspaper, and he moved approval of the Proclamation

designating December 5, 1994, as "Lorraine Wollart Day" in Fairfax County. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hanley and carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

31. <u>NO BOARD MATTERS FOR DRANESVILLE DISTRICT SUPERVISOR</u> <u>ERNEST BERGER</u> (Tape 4)

Dranesville District Supervisor Ernest Berger announced that he had no Board Matters to present today.

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32. <u>SPECIAL EXCEPTION APPLICATION SE 94-H-058 (BELL ATLANTIC VIDEO</u> <u>SERVICES)</u> (Tape 5)

Supervisor Dix said that the Planning Commission public hearing for Special Exception Application SE 94-H-058 (Bell Atlantic Video Services) is scheduled for March 1, 1995.

Supervisor Dix moved that the Board:

- Direct staff to schedule a public hearing to be held before the Board on March 13, 1995; and
- Authorize the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) to concurrently process the Site Plan (or Site Plan Waiver) during the Special Exception process.

Supervisor Dix stated that this motion does not relieve the applicant from complying with the provisions of any applicable ordinances, regulations or adopted standards, and it does not prejudice the consideration of the Special Exception Application in any way. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova and carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

33.REQUEST FOR SIMULTANEOUS PROCESSING FOR REZONING
APPLICATION RZ 94-H-011 AND THE PRELIMINARY PLAN (Tape 5)

Supervisor Dix said that Pulte Home Corporation has filed a Rezoning Application (RZ 94-H-011) for a residential use (PDH-5) near the intersection of Fox Mill Road and Pinecrest Road. The application is currently being reviewed by the staff and has a scheduled Planning Commission public hearing date of January 11, 1995.

Supervisor Dix moved that the Board authorize the Director of the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) to accept the Preliminary Plan for concurrent processing with the rezoning request. This motion does not relieve the applicant from complying with the provisions of any applicable ordinances, regulations or adopted

standards, and it does not prejudice the consideration of the Special Exception Application in any way. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Alexander and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Berger being out of the room, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

34. <u>**RENEWAL OF AGRICULTURAL AND FORESTAL DISTRICTS (A&F)**</u> (Tape 5)

Supervisor Dix stated that he had received a visit from a constituent regarding the difficulty in renewing an Agricultural and Forestal District (A&F). Therefore, Supervisor Dix asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to review the process of renewing A&F Districts to determine if there are ways to streamline the process. Without objection, it was so ordered.

35. <u>**REQUEST FOR REVIEW OF PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX AND DECAL**</u> <u>**POLICY** (Tape 5)</u>

Supervisor Dix said that his office has received several telephone calls from constituents who have been issued tickets by the Police for having an expired 1994 County decal on their vehicles. All of these residents had paid their personal property taxes and purchased their new decals prior to October 5, 1994. Apparently there has been some confusion as to when the 1994 decal expired and when the 1995 decal had to be displayed on the vehicles. He said that it's his understanding that approximately three years ago the Fairfax County decals did have an expiration date on the back of the sticker. He expressed the opinion that including this information on the decal would reduce the confusion that currently exists. He added that some of the confusion has resulted from some major changes in the personal property tax and decal policies this year.

Therefore, Supervisor Dix moved that the Board:

- Direct staff to review this Policy matter;
- Direct staff to include the expiration date on the back of the County decal as soon as practicable;
- Declare a moratorium on the issuance of tickets related to the decal until January 1, 1995; and
- Direct the County Executive to contact the other jurisdictions in the regional compact and request their concurrence in this moratorium.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Trapnell.

Supervisor Hyland asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to request the

Commonwealth's Attorney to set aside these fines. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Following discussion with input from David P. Bobzien, County Attorney; James P. McDonald, Deputy County Executive for Management and Budget; and Kevin C. Greenlief, Acting-Supervisor, Office of Assessments, the question was called on the motion which carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

Following further discussion, Supervisor Berger moved that the Board refer the following issue to the Legislative Subcommittee for review:

■ Families who have two vehicles and cannot afford to pay the personal property taxes and to purchase both decals simultaneously, then the County will not issue a decal for only one vehicle.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Trapnell and carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

36. <u>REQUEST RECONSIDERATION OF ZONING ORDINANCE GOVERNING</u> <u>SIGN CONTROL OVERLAY DISTRICTS</u> (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hyland said that within Sign Control Overlay Districts, Paragraph Two of Section 12-204 of the Zoning Ordinance states that individual enterprises which are not located within or on the same lot as a shopping center can have a freestanding sign only if the enterprise is located on a primary highway. A primary highway is elsewhere defined as a road that has a route number of less than 600.

Supervisor Hyland noted that while this language provided a necessary function when many of the County's secondary roads had not developed as mainstreams to commercial areas, it seems that it is overly restrictive, especially in view of upcoming businesses and enterprises which require signage to identify their existence.

Supervisor Hyland said that these regulations were developed some time ago and that many of the major roadways, not defined as "primary highways," have become significant commercial areas of the County. Therefore, he moved that the Board direct staff to review the issue of whether it would be appropriate to amend the Zoning Ordinance provisions to permit individual enterprises which are located on major thoroughfares such as Backlick or Braddock Roads within a Sign Control Overlay District to have freestanding signage similar to what is permitted for individual enterprises located on primary highways which is a single freestanding sign that does not exceed 40 square feet in size.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Alexander and carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor Dix and Supervisor Frey being out of the room, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

37. <u>HIGHWAY OVERLAY DISTRICT ZONING FOR ROUTE 1 - ACCOTINK AND</u> <u>LORTON</u> (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hyland reminded Board Members that the purpose of a Highway Corridor District is to protect and promote the health, safety and general welfare of the public by preventing or reducing traffic congestion and/or dangers by placing limitations on certain auto-oriented, fast food services and quick turn-over uses.

Supervisor Hyland said that the Mount Vernon and Lee Districts have such an ordinance which covers U.S. Route 1, north of Fort Belvoir to the City of Alexandria. He said that the Highway Corridor Overlay District should be widened to include the Route 1 area of Accotink and Lorton.

Therefore, Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board direct staff to:

- Review the establishment of a Highway Corridor Overlay District for the Route 1 area of Accotink and Lorton; and
- Report with recommendations within 60 days.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Alexander and carried by a vote of seven, Supervisor Dix and Supervisor Frey being out of the room, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

38.DEDICATION OF LORTON VIRGINIA RAIL EXPRESS (VRE) TRAIN
STATION (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hyland said that on Saturday, December 3, 1994, there was a ribbon cutting ceremony for the opening of the Virginia Rail Express' (VRE) newest station in Lorton. The weather was perfect, the celebration was perfect and so many people were overjoyed to finally have commuter rail become a reality.

On behalf of the citizens of Mount Vernon, Supervisor Hyland expressed his appreciation to the many dedicated people on staff who worked above and beyond the call of duty to get it accomplished. He noted that it was a herculean team effort that involved 150 people and organizations (listed in his Board Matter item).

Supervisor Hyland asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to prepare a letter to be placed in the file of Tom Biesiadny, Office of Transportation, commending him for his work on this project. Without objection, it was so ordered.

39. <u>TOWN MEETING ON FUTURE OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA (D.C.)</u> <u>PRISON IN LORTON - REQUEST FOR INFORMATION</u> (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hyland noted that the District of Columbia (D.C.) has been a subject of

considerable controversy and debate for a long time. Presently there are two legislative proposals being considered, one from Congressman Wolf to close the prison and move it out of Lorton, and the second, from Congressman Moran's suggestion that it be federalized. To develop consensus in the Lorton community as to the future of the prison and the federal legislation certain to be introduced in the new Congress, Supervisor Hyland will hold a town meeting at the Lorton Fire Station on December 15, 1994 at 7:30 p.m. to discuss this issue.

Supervisor Hyland stated that there are a number of issues and questions presented by the proposed legislation to include the following:

- If the D.C. prison were to be relocated out of Lorton, what would happen to the 3,000 acres known as the Lorton Reservation, particularly with reference to:
 - Reversion of the land to the Commonwealth of Virginia;
 - The future of the mass burn facility;
 - The future of the ash landfill;
 - The future of existing inter-jurisdictional agreements covering solid waste;
 - The future of the sewer agreement recently negotiated with D.C.;
 - The ultimate use and disposition of the property including sale or alternative uses; and
 - The impact on the Plan for the 3,000 acres and the surrounding area.
- If the D.C. prison were to be federalized, all of the questions listed above need to be addressed as well as the following:
 - Would the existing federal law restricting expansion of the prison apply after federalization;
 - Would existing agreements between Fairfax County and D.C. be abrogated with a federal take-over; and

• Would the Plan apply to the 3,000 acres if the land is controlled by the Federal government?

Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board direct staff to:

- Review the two legislative proposals for relocating or federalizing the D.C. prison in Lorton; and
- Prepare a response to the questions and issues raised herein no later than December 14, 1994 to make this information available for the town meeting.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hanley and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Frey being out of the room, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

40. INTENT TO DEFER THE BOARD DECISION ON PROPOSED AREA PLANS REVIEW (APR) ITEM 94-IV-3LP, BOUNDARY CHANGE BETWEEN THE LORTON-SOUTH ROUTE 1 AND MASON NECK COMMUNITY PLANNING SECTORS (MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT) (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hyland announced his intent later in the meeting, at the appropriate time, to defer Board decision on Area Plans Review (APR) Item 94-IV-3LP.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, this Board decision was deferred until **December 12, 1994 at 3:00 p.m.** See Clerk's Summary Item CL#73.)

41. <u>DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY (DEQ) REGULATIONS</u> (Tape 5)

(NOTE: Earlier in the meeting during adoption of the 1995 Legislative Program, this subject was discussed. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#7.)

Supervisor Hanley referred to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Regulations and reiterated that the City of Fairfax letter was the most appropriate example for the County to follow in terms of writing a letter regarding the DEQ Regulations.

Therefore, Supervisor Hanley asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to write a letter in the vein of the letter written by the Mayor of the City of Fairfax. Without objection, it was so ordered.

42. <u>CONCURRENT PROCESSING FOR SPECIAL EXCEPTION APPLICATION</u> <u>SE 94-P-042 FOR THE SILVER DINER</u> (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board direct staff to concurrently process the Site Plan with the remainder of the Special Exception Application (SE 94-P-042) for the Silver Diner. This motion does not relieve the applicant of complying with the provisions of any applicable ordinances, regulations or adopted standards and it does not prejudice the

consideration of the application in any way. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Berger and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Frey being out of the room, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

43. <u>REQUEST FOR WAIVER OF THE PUBLIC STREET CONNECTION</u> <u>REQUIREMENT FOR A PORTION OF SANDBURG STREET</u> (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hanley said that as part of the Plan review process, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and the County Office of Transportation have recommended the connection of Sandburg Street in the vicinity of the Pritchard's Corner project. Those recommendations, coupled with the Public Facilities Manual (PFM) encouraging interparcel access, have placed the Director of the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) in the position of recommending a public street connection on Sandburg Street. She said that the developer and the citizens in the area have expressed the desire that Sandburg Street not be connected because such a connection would change the character of the neighborhood and cause cut-through traffic to occur.

Therefore, Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board direct the Director of DEM to waive the public street connection requirement for the portion of Sandburg Street shown on Preliminary Plan Number 9071-P-01-Pritchard's Corner This motion was seconded by Supervisor Alexander and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Frey being out of the room, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

44. **FAIRFAX CONNECTOR SUPPLEMENTAL HOLIDAY SERVICE** (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hanley called to the Board's attention a memorandum regarding the Fairfax Connector Supplemental Holiday Service. She said that four additional Sundays between Thanksgiving and Christmas have been added at no additional charge. She said that the added service applies to Route 401 which runs between Tysons and Springfield Mall.

45. <u>FISCAL IMPACT OF METRORAIL ON THE COMMONWEALTH OF</u> <u>VIRGINIA</u> (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hanley commended to the Board the Executive Summary prepared by KPMG Peat Marwick - <u>Fiscal Impact of Metrorail on the Commonwealth of Virginia</u> showing the revenue to the Commonwealth of Virginia because of Metrorail in Virginia.

46. **PROPOSAL TO ABOLISH THE FEDERAL PROGRAM THAT PROVIDES INCENTIVES FOR THE PRIVATE SECTOR TO PRESERVE HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF FEDERALLY SUBSIDIZED HOUSING UNITS** (Tape 5)

Supervisor Hanley said that she has just learned that the Federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB) is about to propose abolishing the Federal program that provides incentives for the private sector to preserve hundreds of thousands of federally subsidized housing units.

Supervisor Hanley pointed out that this recommendation, if implemented, would not only cause widespread displacement and homelessness, but it would break faith with the numerous builders and lending institutions who have relied upon the program to invest hundreds of millions of dollars in renovating and preserving those units.

Supervisor Hanley distributed to Board Members the background information on this disastrous proposal by OMB, and noted that time is extremely short--less than two weeks--for the initial OMB proposal to be opposed before it is forwarded to the President for inclusion in the Fiscal Year (FY) 1996 budget.

Therefore, Supervisor Hanley moved that the Board:

- Immediately send a letter to Secretary Cisneros and the Fairfax County Congressional delegation outlining the devastating effect the OMB recommendation could have on Fairfax County residents and businesses; and
- Request them to express their opposition to the OMB proposal as expeditiously as possible.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Alexander and carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

47. MODIFICATION OF ROUTE 7 IN THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN (Tape 6)

Supervisor Trapnell stated that the widening of Route 7 to eight lanes between Bailey's Crossroads and Seven Corners has been on the County's Comprehensive Plan for several years. The plans for this project which have been developed by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) show that this widening will create significant impacts on adjacent properties. As a result, this project will be extremely costly to construct and disruptive to the community.

Supervisor Trapnell said that development applications are being received along Route 7 in this area. The staff has indicated that the development review policies require that the Board request that right-of-way be provided for these improvements since they are shown on the Plan. However, the landowners often cannot provide the required right-of-way due to the size of their site or the nature of their application.

Supervisor Trapnell concluded that the only practical solution to this matter is the removal of the designation of Route 7 as an eight-lane improvement from the Plan. To retain the possibility of providing some more modest level of improvements where the impacts are not so severe, she suggested that staff examine this matter in the context of an Out-of-Turn Plan Amendment.

Supervisor Trapnell moved that the Board direct staff to prepare:

- An Out-of-Turn Plan Amendment to delete the widening of Route 7 to eight lanes between Bailey's Crossroads and Seven Corners; and
- Alternative recommendations for possible inclusion in the amended Plan for Route 7 in this area.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova.

Following discussion, with input from Shiva K. Pant, Director, Office of Transportation, the question was called on the motion which carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

48. INTENT TO DEFER PUBLIC HEARING ON REZONING APPLICATION RZ 94-L-035 (OAKWOOD VAN DORN ASSOCIATES) (LEE DISTRICT) (Tape 6)

Supervisor Alexander moved to defer the public hearing on Rezoning Application RZ 94-L-035 (Oakwood Van Dorn Associates) until **December 12, 1994 at 5:00 p.m.** This motion was seconded by Supervisor Dix and carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, this public hearing was formally deferred. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#64.)

49. INTENT TO DEFER PUBLIC HEARING ON OUT-OF-TURN PLAN <u>AMENDMENT S94-CW-T1 - TO CONSIDER PROVIDING PERMANENT</u> <u>ACCESS BETWEEN ROLLING ROAD AND FULLERTON ROAD (LEE AND</u> <u>SPRINGFIELD DISTRICTS)</u> (Tape 6)

Supervisor Alexander moved to defer the public hearing on Out-Of-Turn Plan Amendment S94-CW-T1, to consider providing permanent access between Rolling Road and Fullerton Road until **December 12, 1994 at 4:30 p.m.** This motion was seconded by Vice-Chairman McConnell.

Following discussion, with input from William O. Howland, Jr., Assistant to the County Executive, Supervisor Alexander withdrew his motion and announced his intention to have this public hearing and others formally deferred at the appropriate time.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, this public hearing was formally deferred. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#70.)

50. <u>DEPARTURE OF LEE DISTRICT SUPERVISOR JOSEPH ALEXANDER</u> (Tape 6)

Supervisor Alexander announced that he would be departing the meeting at 5:30 p.m. today to attend to personal business.

51. <u>NO BOARD MATTERS FOR VICE-CHAIRMAN ELAINE MCCONNELL</u> (Tape 6)

Vice-Chairman McConnell, Springfield District Supervisor, announced that she had no Board Matters to present today.

52. <u>NO BOARD MATTERS FOR BRADDOCK DISTRICT SUPERVISOR SHARON</u> <u>BULOVA</u> (Tape 6)

Braddock District Supervisor Sharon Bulova announced that she had no Board Matters to present today.

53. <u>LOCATION OF MOBILE AND LAND BASED TELECOMMUNICATIONS</u> <u>FACILITIES</u> (Tape 6)

On behalf of Chairman Davis, Vice-Chairman McConnell presented his written Board Matter regarding the location of mobile and land based telecommunications facilities. She stated that on December 7, 1992 the Board passed an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance and the Comprehensive Plan entitled "Mobile and Land Based Telecommunications Facilities" to address the increasing number of requests the County had been receiving for the installation of radio dispatch, paging, and cellular telephone facilities. Further, the Division of Communications had expressed a continuing need to provide a dependable communication system for emergency services such as police and fire and rescue. These government services require similar facilities and antennas to those of private providers.

As a result of meetings held between the public and private sectors on the proposed amendment, staff recommended approval and the Board approved the amendment. While the amendment was to have eased the requirements to locate mobile and land based equipment on government (County) property, Vice-Chairman McConnell stated that this had not been the case.

Recent applicants for the location of telecommunications equipment have experienced many problems as they moved through the process. Often times the applications have been withdrawn or denied. However, this was not the intent of the amendment.

Therefore, Vice-Chairman McConnell, on behalf of Chairman Davis, relinquished the Chair to Acting-Chairman Alexander and moved that the Board direct staff to send the appropriate letter to the Chairman of the:

- Planning Commission;
- School Board; and
- Park Authority

reiterating the Board's policy as it relates to the location of these telecommunications facilities by:

- Reminding them of the need for these facilities from a private provider standpoint, and more importantly from a public safety standpoint; and
- Indicating the Board's strong desire to assist applicants in locating their facilities in Fairfax County.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova.

Following discussion, the question was called on the motion which carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

Acting-Chairman Alexander returned the gavel to Vice-Chairman McConnell.

54. **<u>RECESS/EXECUTIVE SESSION</u>** (Tape 6)

At 1:40 p.m., Supervisor Dix moved that the Board recess and go into Executive Session for discussion or consideration of matters enumerated in <u>Virginia Code</u> Section 2.1-344 and listed in the Agenda as well as for discussion of actual and probable litigation and other specific legal matters requiring the provision of legal counsel, as well as:

- Correspondence from Local 689, Amalgamated Transit Union regarding arrangements under Section 13(C) of the Urban Mass Transportation Act (UMTA) of 1964;
- Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request from Fredrick H. Goldbecker dated November 22, 1994; and
- Police enforcement of state law regarding signs in state right-of-way.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland.

Following a query to David P. Bobzien, County Attorney, the question was called on the motion which carried by a vote of nine, Chairman Davis not yet having arrived.

Supervisor Alexander moved that the employment of Daniel P. Boyle as Director of the Fairfax County Department of Animal Control be terminated effective immediately. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Frey and carried by unanimous vote.
