- Staying current with new technology/options
- Exploring next-level approaches for more diversion
- Improve system resiliency & diversity

RFEI Process

- Issued January 2018
- National call for interested partners/processes
- Five general technology types:
 - ✓ Waste Conversion
 - ✓ Sustainable Roads
 - ✓ Organics/Composting
 - ✓ Ash Processing
 - ✓ Diversion/Reuse

Evaluation

- Approx. 20 criteria considered, including:
 - Risk
 - Capital Demands
 - Anticipated Outputs
 - Demonstrated Track-record
 - Required County Investment/Commitment

Results

- Options fall into two categories:

1. Waste Conversion (large scale)
2. Other submissions (small scale): waste diversion, organics, waste processing, etc.

* No submissions received regarding CDD recycling



Sustainable Road Project



Two blends are being used:

40% Ash 60% Glass
25% Ash 75% Recycled
Concrete

Estimated total tonnage for the project:

400-500 tons

Metal Recovery from Ash



Next Steps

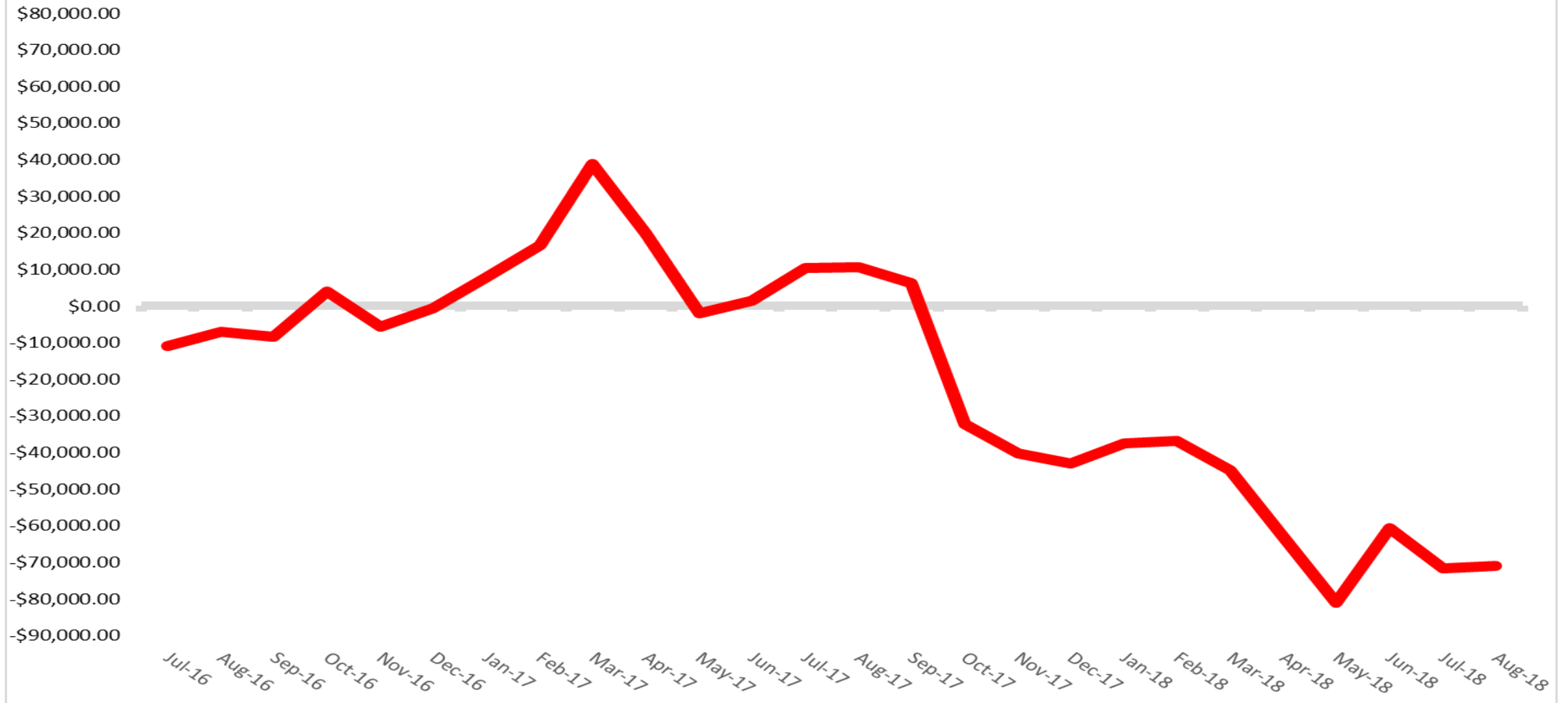
- ✓ Further research on waste conversion options as needed
(Consultant to provide an executive study of the waste conversion submissions)
- ✓ Organics/Composting (pilot already underway)
- ✓ Diversion/Reuse (part of I-66 Transfer Station upgrades)
- ✓ Ash Processing (working with DPMM)



National Sword – How It Affects Fairfax
