

Updates on Carbon-Free Fairfax



Carbon-Free Fairfax is a broad greenhouse gas reduction initiative that enables county residents, businesses, nonprofit organizations, and other key stakeholders to decrease their emissions through education, outreach, and engagement opportunities.

The HomeWise Pilot

Fairfax County Home Wise

The Fairfax County HomeWise program educates, empowers, and enables residents to make changes that reduce energy use, water use, and associated costs in their homes.

Volunteers assist low- and moderate-income residents with physical improvements to their homes and provide support for behavior changes that are proven to conserve resources and money.

Programs Undergoing Redevelopment/Relaunch



The Energy Action Fairfax program is dedicated to providing county residents with information, resources, and assistance to encourage energy-saving activities and behavior at home.



The Green Business Partners program exists to celebrate and support sustainability leadership in the business community within Fairfax County through promotional, educational, networking, and employee engagement activities.

Next Steps for Public Programs

- Funding to support positions to staff and oversee expanded climate and energy-related education and outreach initiatives, including:
 - Carbon-Free Fairfax
 - HomeWise
 - Energy Action Fairfax
 - Green Business Partners
 - Charge Up Fairfax
 - Community partnerships
- To elevate the programs to the next level of service, a consideration item for FY 2022 Carryover that will provide \$207,830 in funding for two positions to support these public programs (CECAP education and outreach) will be needed.
