

- Results will help inform SHAPE the Future of Aging Plan
- Mailed to 22,000 older adult households in March 2022
- 2,919 total surveys (13% response rate)
 - 33% submitted online | 67% hard copy

Survey Weighting

Results were weighted to reflect County demographics for some groups that were underrepresented in the survey sample.

Example: Hispanics are 9.1% of the 50+ population but only 5.6% of the respondents.

Responses from Hispanics were statistically weighted, so in the results they represent 9.1% of the overall responses.




