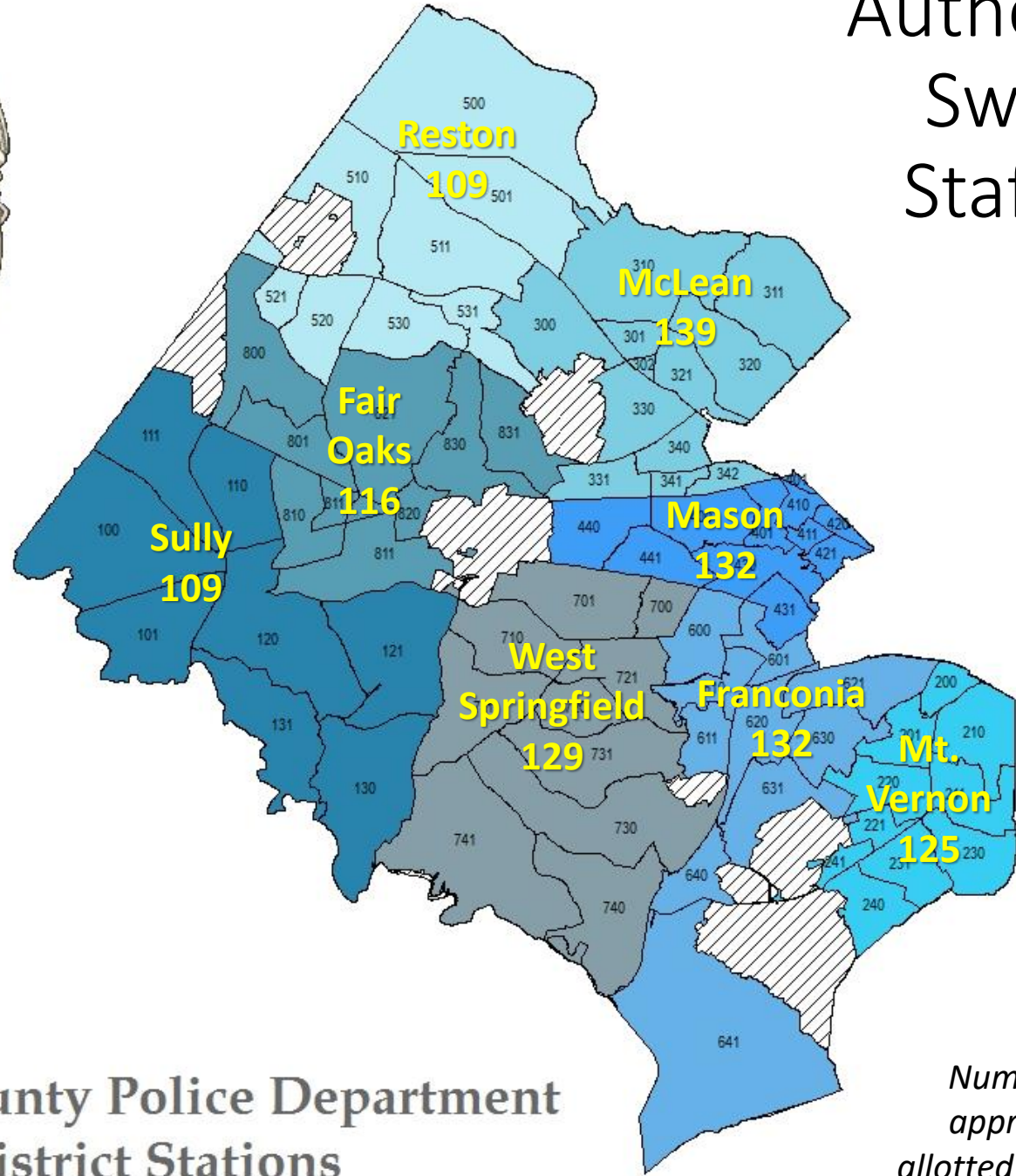

* The homicide squad investigated 16 homicide cases in 2017. Other responsibilities of this squad include attempted kidnapping, malicious wounding, house fires, unattended deaths or deaths with no physician to sign death certificate (often due to natural causes).
