Update on FCPS Adult and Community Education Program

FCPS ACE Program

- Established to provide educational opportunities to adults seeking degree completion programs, apprenticeships, and general interest courses
 - Degree completion programs are not impacted by this change
- Course offerings and enrollment have expanded, staff has increased
- Revenue from enrollments has not kept pace with the expenditures

Rationale for Reorganization


- Lingering evidence that the overall program is not self supporting
 - Expenditures exceed revenues in many program areas
 - August 2011 program reviews were done
 - Declining enrollment in some programs
 - High staff and instructor costs
 - Loss of "work performed for others" revenue from other programs lost due to budget constraints

Rationale for Reorganization

- Competition and poor economic climate
- Program offerings are not always supportive of each other or the K-12 mission
- FC Parks and Recreation offer similar programs
- Need to grow the programs that are part of the core mission - Adult ESOL, work readiness

Determining the Structure for Reorganization

- Review of program trends over time
- Analysis of program information supplied by program specialist in August 2011
- Conversations with division leadership about ACE programming
- Examination of state and federal guidelines regarding Adult education requirements
- Identification of programs that could be absorbed by other Fairfax County agencies

 - Grade K-12 Enrichment (behind the wheel)

ACE Staffing and Expectations

- Reduction of 23 central office staff positions
- Part-time instructors
- Cross train all staff to maximize efficiencies and maintain customer service
- Apprenticeship and Adult ESOL must be self supporting through tuition, grant money and operating fund transfer
- Develop better relationship with the community to offer the right mix of classes

Timeline

- December 2011 FCPS Leadership Team presentation and approval of organization structure
- January 2012 Budget situation announced to ACE staff
- February 2012 New organizational structure announced and internal competition for remaining positions begins.
- February 2012 FCPS staff and FCPA staff agree on class offerings for the fall 2012 class schedules.
- March 2012 ACE instructors informed of summer session courses and introduced to FCPA staff in impacted areas.
- April 2012 new ACE staff announced and transition begins.
- May 2012 Reduction in force letters sent to ACE employees.
- June 2012 Fall 2012 class schedules created by ACE and FCPA.
- July 1, 2012 New organization is complete. Final ACE catalog approved for fall session.
- August 2012 Focus groups held with instructors and ACE students to plan offerings and schedule for January 2013.
- September 2012 First budget review for new organization.
- October 2012 Fiscal year 2014 planning begins.
