Adopt Executive Recommendations

- Staff/fund for public assistance caseload growth
- Staff to address domestic violence and court services needs
- Additionally fund special education graduates
- Adjust SACC fee scale and increase registration fees

HSC Concerns

Proposed FY 2016 reductions:

- Will cut into core services
- Will have damaging consequences
- Will have a significant adverse impact on the health of our community

Restore Funding

Healthy Families Fairfax Program (\$1,871,715)

- Early intervention program
- Evidence-based accountability
- Innovative public-private partnership
- Saves public funding through multiple service delivery systems - over a child and mother's lifetime.

Restore Funding

Contracted legal services for persons with disabilities (\$51,017)

 Provides needed services at a cost savings to taxpayers

 Enrolls disabled in SSDI and federal health care

Other Concerns

- Eliminates local rent relief program (\$275,000)
- Fails to expand services to Fairfax County veterans through Veteran Treatment Docket
- Eliminates \$1.8M+ to the Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board

Other Concerns

- Reduces locally run and faith-based volunteers provided parenting education (\$0.3 million)
- Cuts "Unspecified" personnel totaling over \$1.4 M+

Other Recommendations

Alternate budget reductions or revenue strategies?

- County's partnership with Inova Health Systems
 - Important partner in economic development partnership coalitions to strengthen our economy
- Public input on our community priorities
 - Service delivery approaches that involve both the public sector, private and nonprofit sector partnerships

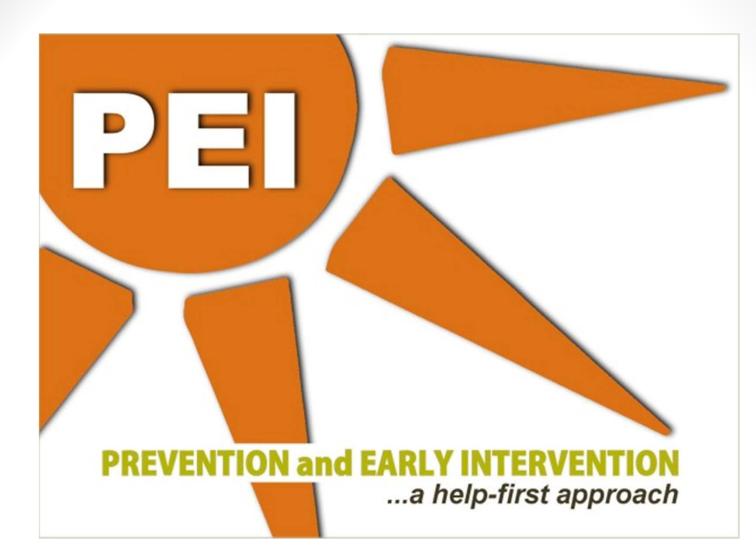
