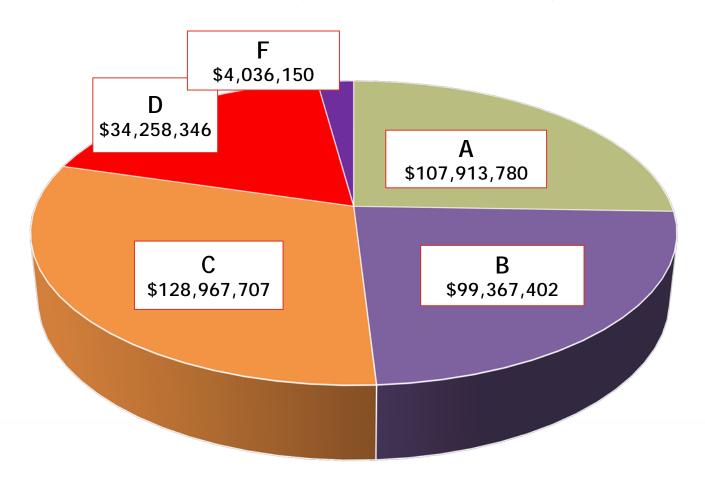

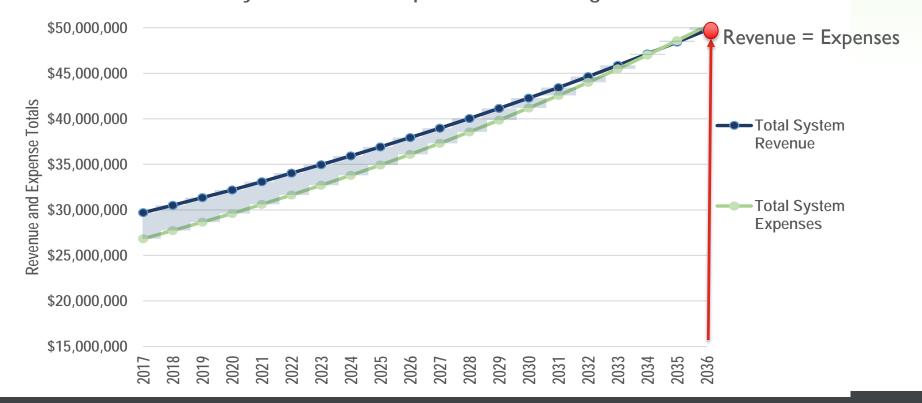






SUSTAINABILITY PLAN

- 20-YEAR PROJECTED SYSTEM FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE Revenues and expenses will converge at a rate of \$150,000 and breakeven by 2035 without further capital investment

Protecting Our County's Cultural Resources

Reuse Building W-35 For Use As Fairfax County

Archaeological & Museum Collections Facility

(Adjacent to Workhouse Arts Center)

- Establish a facility suitable for the long-term housing and protection of the county's historical and archaeological collections.
- 30,000 square foot facility.
- Potential public museum component.
- \$2.32 M in 2016 Park Bond for Scoping/Design/Permitting.
- Additional \$10-\$12 M needed for Construction & Fit Out.









Energy Management

On-Going Efforts

- Athletic Facility LED Lighting
- Building Automation & Controls for HVAC and Lighting
- Active Monitoring via EnergyCap and Audits

- Summer 2019 Explore and consider funding options



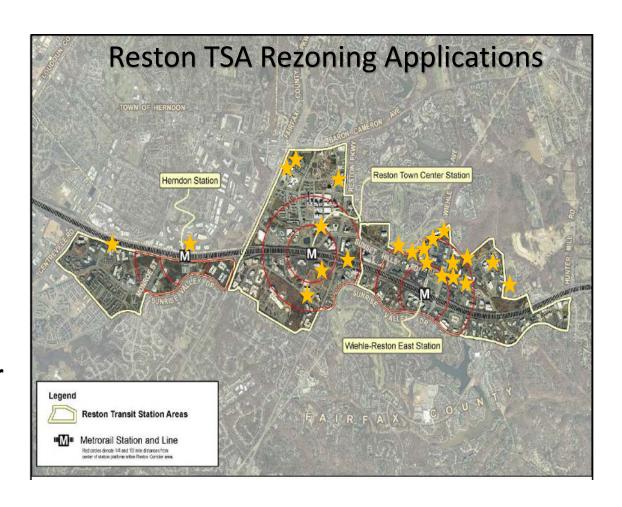






Reston Urban Parks
