<sup>2</sup> FY 2009 Natural Resources Conservation Funds represents federal grant revenue associated with Project FX4000, Dam Safety Projects, Royal Lake (Dam Site 4), as approved by the Board of Supervisors on September 10, 2007. An amount of \$528,406 was received in FY 2009 and \$1,504,091 is anticipated in future years.

<sup>3</sup> Miscellaneous revenue represents revenue received for the sale of plans.

<sup>4</sup> Capital projects are budgeted based on the total project costs. Most projects span multiple years, from design to construction completion. Therefore, funding for capital projects is carried forward each fiscal year, and ending balances fluctuate, reflecting the carryover of these funds.
