DRUNK DRIVING IS A PUBLIC HEALTH ISSUE

- The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) considers impaired driving a public health issue
- In 2014, Fairfax County had 740 alcohol-related crashes, resulting in 12 deaths and 476 injuries







PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Mission . . . to improve driver and resident safety in Fairfax County by reducing the incidence of crashes caused by driving under the influence
- VASAP regulatory authority for all local ASAPs in the Commonwealth
 - 24 local programs throughout the state
 - Recognized as "the model" DWI program in the country
- ASAP serves as a probationary agency for impaired driving offenders



LINES OF BUSINESS: ASAP SERVICES

- Alcohol and Drug Education and Case Monitoring for DWI offenders and drug offenders*
- Restoration for Habitual Offender (as formerly determined by the courts and/or DMV), or those who have obtained three DWI convictions within a 10-year period
- Probation
- Ignition Interlock
- S.A.F.E. (Substance Alcohol Focused Education) a program for juvenile offenders












TRENDS AND CHALLENGES


- · Decreasing number of DWI convictions statewide and locally
- Decreasing number of alcohol-related deaths
- Decreasing number of referrals by the courts affecting ASAP revenue
- Legislation decriminalizing marijuana use or sanctioning the use for medical purposes
- Program fees regulated by the Commonwealth not adjusted since 1986
- Courts granting waiver of ASAP fees
- · Repeat offenders sometimes remain on the ASAP caseload for an indefinite time
- Limited technology and data collection tools to analyze outcomes



Ignition Interlock . . .

- Is mandated to ASAPs to administer
- Is required for all first-time offenders seeking a restricted license
- Has significantly increased workload
