## Facility Deficiencies:

- Inefficient building systems and infrastructure that are well beyond their life cycle
- Insufficient power and technological capacity
- Inefficient site lines promoting customer and staff safety and security concerns
- Inefficient layout for customer service
- Inadequate group study rooms
- Inadequate meeting spaces and seating
- Insufficient collection size due to space constraints
