The meeting was called to order at 7:31 p.m. by Chairperson Kratovil.

Minutes

Chairperson Kratovil moved to accept the January 21, 2025, meeting minutes. Commissioner Gulakowski seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously, 7-0-0, with Commissioner Kirk not present for the vote.

Report of the Director

Director Makely discussed the FY 2026 advertised budget presentation by County Executive Bryan Hill, which highlighted a challenging fiscal year. Topics discussed include budget adoption timeline, a potential real estate and transient occupancy tax increase, agency budget reductions, and elimination of certain county positions.

Director Makely provided an update on the proposed dissolution of the Tenant-Landlord Commission. A public hearing is scheduled for March 18, 2025. Director Makely assured the Commission that tenant-landlord services would continue to be provided by Consumer Affairs. Director Makely highlighted events planned for National Consumer Protection Week (March 3 - 7, 2025), which include a proclamation at the Board of Supervisors meeting on Tuesday, March 4, 2025, in honor of Fairfax County Consumer Affairs Day on March 6, 2025.

Old Business

There was no old business before the Commission.

New Business

1. Silver Shield Taskforce Presentation

Chairperson Kratovil introduced Melissa Smarr and Allison Clifford of the Fairfax County Silver Shield Taskforce. An overview of the Board of Supervisors initiative focused on:

- Silver Shield Implementation
- Spectrum of Scams
- Strategy, Partners, Services and Prevention
- Tips for Staying Safe and Secure
- Fairfax County OneFairfax and Strategic Plan

A discussion ensued about the Silver Shield initiative's budget and funding, structure, and other outreach initiatives.

The Commission praised Silver Shield's outreach efforts and asked about presentation topics, audience size, and public inquiries. Melissa Smarr explained that the initiative typically focuses on the top five scams of the current year; however, communities can request specific presentations.

A discussion ensued on communication strategies. Allison Clifford touched on the importance of inperson connections, county publications, mailers, and partnerships. She further stated that having a full-time dedicated position would significantly enhance the initiative's effectiveness.

Commissioner Matters

Commissioner Kirk spoke on a home improvement issue with Dominion Energy. He requested Consumer Affairs assistance on this matter.

Commissioner Rosier requested clarification on the topic of unemployment insurance and whether an individual would file through the county, state, or federal government for unemployment benefits. Staff provided information.

Chairperson Kratovil expressed appreciation to Silver Shield presenters for an informative and timely presentation. Chairperson Kratovil expressed an interest in reviewing the original board initiative, and aligning objectives between the Community Engagement Committee (CPC-CEC) and Financial Scams and Fraud Committee (CPC-FSFC).

Commissioner Kharat had no matters to bring towards the Commission.

Commissioner Springer had no matters to bring towards the Commission.

Commissioner Svab had no matters to bring towards the Commission.

Commissioner Gasimov inquired about including the Silver Shield initiative in the Consumer Affairs Branch. Director Makely stated that there have been no prior discussions on the same and noted the pros and cons of centralizing the initiative under one department. Director Makely provided the Fairfax County Digital Equity Coordination Team as an example of a crossdepartment decentralized initiative like the Silver Shield Taskforce.

Commissioner Gulakowski emphasized the need to set objectives for the CPC-CEC and CPC-FSFC, review input from previous committee meetings, and identify necessary action items.

Chairperson Kratovil adjourned the meeting without objection at 9:24 p.m.
