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The meeting was called to order at 7:33 p.m. by Chairperson Kratovil.

Chairperson Kratovil notified the Commission that Commissioner Belkowitz requested to participate in the meeting remotely.

Commissioner Gulakowski made the motion to approve that Chairperson Kratovil's decision to approve Commissioner Belkowitz's request to participate from a remote location was in conformance with the Consumer Protection Commission's Remote Participation Policy. Commissioner Kirk seconded the motion. The motion was approved, 8-0-0.

Chairperson Kratovil made the motion that Commissioner Belkowitz's voice could be heard by all persons at the primary meeting location. Commissioner Kirk seconded the motion. The motion was approved, 8-0-0. Commissioner Belkowitz participated remotely from Fairfax Station due to being out of town on a family matter.

Minutes

Chairperson Kratovil moved to accept the February 20, 2024, minutes. Commissioner Gulakowski seconded the motion. The minutes were adopted unanimously, 9-0-0.

New Business

1. Communications Policy and Regulation Division Presentation. Rick Ellrod, Director, Communications Policy and Regulation Division (CPRD) provided an overview the CPRD's mission; consumer assistance; inspections; cable franchise negotiations; public, educational, and governmental (PEG) channels; the institutional network (I-Net); cable operator compliance; outreach; policy monitoring; and rate regulation.

A discussion ensued on shorter franchise contract agreements, current landscape on traditional cable vs. video streaming, PEG grants, term clauses, educational outreach events, customer service compliance, inspection of aerial construction sites, source of revenue, pricing regulation, equipment fees, and outreach to consumers on CPRD's services and resources.

Report of the Director

Director Makely stated National Consumer Protection Week (NCPW) was a success with 12 in person and virtual outreach events with over 400 attendees—including Fairfax County Consumer Affairs Day, which took place on March 7, 2024.

Director Makely stated a debriefing exercise was done by Consumer Affairs staff to discuss the National Consumer Protection Week on what worked, what did not work, and ways the event can be improved upon next year. Director Makely welcomed the Commissioners to provide feedback or suggestions about the event.

Director Makely informed the Commission that the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) voted on March 14, 2024, to require cable and satellite TV pricing transparency; its new "all-in" pricing rules will address consumers' confusion on hidden fees in cable and satellite TV billing. Director Makely stated staff will work on a communications campaign with the Board of Supervisors (BOS) to provide answers to questions received from residents. Director Makely met with the BOS in closed session and gained approval to join a coalition to file future comments with the FCC.

Director Makely advised that for the April 16, 2024, Consumer Protection Commission (CPC) meeting, staff will request authorization to advertise a public hearing to be held on May 21, 2024, 7:30 p.m. on proposed amendments to Fairfax County Code Section 84.1-6-3, rates, fares, and charges established.

Old Business

There was no old business before the Commission.

Commissioner Matters

Commissioner Rosier complimented DCCS staff efforts during NCPW.

Commissioner Gasimov had no matters to bring before the Commission.

Commissioner Kirk advised he is delighted that CPRD is reviewing FCC rulings and legislations so that what happened to the taxicab industry does not happen to the cable industry.

Commissioner Kharat had no matters to bring before the Commission.

Commissioner Roark had no matters to bring before the Commission.

Commissioner Gulakowski stated that he watched staff presentations on Fairfax County Consumer Affairs Day on Channel 16. He attended Supervisor Walkinshaw's Braddock District meeting and shared the duties of the CPC.

Commissioner Svab had no matters to bring before the Commission.

Commissioner Belkowitz had no matters to bring before the Commission.

Commissioner Kratovil had several issues to bring before the Commission.

- 1. Next CPC meeting is scheduled for April 16, 2024, at 7:30 p.m. Both the Consumer Protection Commission Community Engagement Committee and the Consumer Protection Commission Financial Scams and Fraud Committee will also meet on that date and time.
- 2. NCPW was a success with Consumer Affairs receiving two proclamations from the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors. Director Makely advised one proclamation was to proclaim March 3-9, 2024, as Consumer Protection Week, and the other proclamation was to proclaim March 2024 as Alternative Dispute Resolution Month.
- 3. Concerns about the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau's credit reporting and credit freezes, and the way consumer data is made available.

Chairperson Kratovil made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioners Gulakowski and Kirk seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:58 p.m.

Good News If You're Installing an Electric Vehicle Charging Station

March 19, 2024

The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors authorized an 18-month extension for an exemption of all electrical and building permit fees for electric vehicle charging stations (EVCS). The current exemption, which was scheduled to expire on May 1, 2024, has been extended through October 31, 2025.

The exemption supports the county's climate goal for a carbon-free Fairfax — "a future for Fairfax County that is healthy, sustainable, and economically prosperous without local greenhouse gas emissions"—as well as the Environment Community Outcome Area of the Countywide Strategic Plan. Eliminating the permit fees for EVCS may encourage the use of electric vehicles, which is an important step toward 2050.

A permit is still required for any new installation of EVCS, in accordance with the Uniform Statewide Building Code, and the permit holder is subject to the re-inspection fee. No permit is required if you are plugging a stand-alone charging station into an existing outlet. In addition, EVCS must comply with zoning requirements (for detailed information, see the memorandum "Applicable Zoning Provisions for Electric Vehicle Charging Spaces.")

A new GIS application was created to let the public see the distribution of Electric Vehicle Charging Station (EVCS) permits across Fairfax County for the first 12 months of the trial period. This application overlays the location of LDS Commercial and Residential Electrical Permits for EVCS against the Fairfax County Vulnerability Index Map to show equity impacts.

Fairfax County invests in electric vehicles to meet climate goal

FAIRFAX COUNTY, Va. (<u>DC News Now</u>) — The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors extended a previous permit exemption for electric vehicle charging stations until Oct. 2025, as part of the county's broader plan to reach climate goals.

An announcement on Tuesday by the Land Development Services said this exemption applies to all electrical and building permit fees for electric vehicle charging stations. It was previously set to expire on May 1.

When the Board of Supervisors first approved the fee waiver in Oct. 2022, staff were set to report back after the 18-month trial period on the "effectiveness of eliminating permit fees in incentivizing installation of EVC equipment."

A report presented on Jan. 30 stated that 896 permits were issued for the installation of EVC equipment since the exemption was granted, the vast majority of which were residential.

Without the exemption, the average permit fee for residential installations is \$127 and for commercial installations is \$421.

Although the installation of new electric vehicle charging stations still requires a permit, "no permit is required if you are plugging a stand-alone charging station into an existing outlet," according to the statement.

This exemption promotes the use of electrical vehicles in the county, which helps the community to meet its goals of carbon neutrality by 2050.

"One of the most important steps that can be taken to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Fairfax County is to transition to electric vehicles," the staff report to the Board of Supervisors said.

The county has taken several steps towards reducing emissions in the county, including expanding a community program called Charge Up Fairfax, which helps community associations access electric vehicle charging.

This shift toward green energy through embracing electric vehicles isn't just being embraced in Fairfax County.

The state attempted to provide rebates for electric vehicle purchases, similar to the Clean Vehicle Tax Credit offered by the Federal Government.

The bill passed at the beginning of 2021, but it was unable to secure funding through the appropriations process due to pushback from Republican lawmakers.
