### **Fairfax County Weights and Measures Object Loan**

The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors has secured the loan of the original 1744 weights and measures for grain and corn, to be debuted on exhibit at the Fairfax County Government Center in January 2016. Owned by the Alexandria-Washington Masonic Lodge No. 22, these items will be on display during the 275<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration year.

Stamped "The County of Fairfax, 1744," the weights and measures were used to stop the buying and selling of "false weights" of corn, grain, salt, and wine.


Gifted to the county by the King of England in 1744 and, according to the University of Virginia, these weights and measures are the only complete set of standardized weights and measures from England that still exist in the United States.

We here at the Historic Records Center strongly encourage you to visit the Fairfax County Government Center to see these incredible objects, as they would have played an integral role in the operation of the county's economy. Fairfax County Court would have used the weights and measures frequently, as the court oversaw imports and exports at the various county warehouses.

The Smithsonian Museum of American History has displayed the smaller pieces of the weights and measures, such as for wine, in the past. Below are images of these fantastic objects (credit to the Smithsonian for the images; objects owned by Alexandria-Washington Lodge No. 22):

2017 will bring a full year of celebration in honor of Fairfax County's 275th anniversary!


#### **SAVE THE DATE:**
