

ORDER

On April 22, 2020, the Supreme Court of Virginia extended the judicial emergency through May 17, 2020. In light of this extension, the Court directs the Commonwealth Attorney's Office to advise the Court by April 29, 2020 of any misdemeanor or felony case which are now set for trial during the period of the judicial emergency and which, in the Commonwealth Attorney's opinion, may present statutory or constitutional speedy trial issues. This submission should be in the form of a formal pleading identifying the following information for each case:

The Commonwealth Attorney's Office shall provide a copy of its submission to each defense counsel whose case is included in the filing. It is the Court's intention to place such matters on its speedy trial docket and set a briefing schedule for the parties to file their respective positions.
