

Emergency Escape and Rescue Openings


Do you know about Fairfax County's egress rules ?

According to the Virginia Property Maintenance Code, means of egress must be provided throughout a dwelling so that:

- A safe, continuous and unobstructed path of travel is provided from any point in the structure to the exterior.
- Stairways, hallways, and all other paths of travel must be free of belongings.
- An emergency escape and rescue opening in the form of a window or a door, which opens directly to the exterior, is required for sleeping areas.
- Emergency escape and rescue openings shall be maintained in accordance with the building code in effect at the time of building construction and can include:
 - A window opening directly to the exterior of the building (Figure 1 on back).
 - A window opening below grade into a window well or areaway (Figures 1 & 2 on back).
 - A door leading directly to the exterior of the building.
 - Basement windows must have a minimum clear opening of 5.7 square feet, requiring a minimum window opening 20 inches wide x 24 inches high, (Figure 3 on back) with the opening of the window no higher than 44 inches above the basement finished floor (Figure 4 on back).
