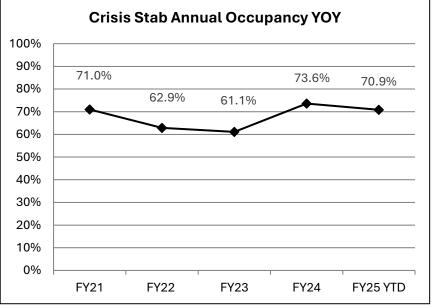
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YOY CSU Trends - March FY25



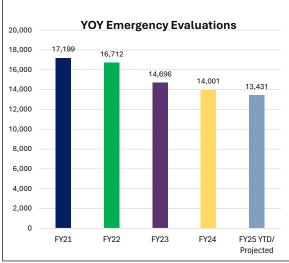




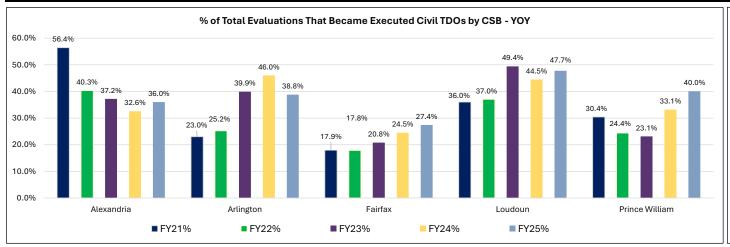


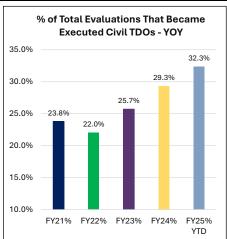

FY25 vs. FY24 TDO Admissions by CSB - March FY25



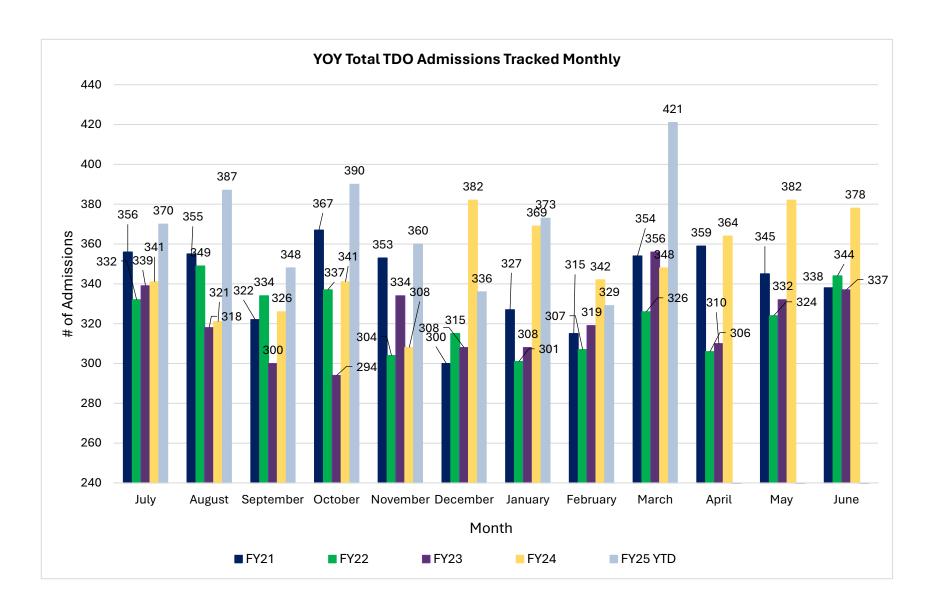
FY25 vs. FY24 TDO Admissions by CSB per 100K - March FY25

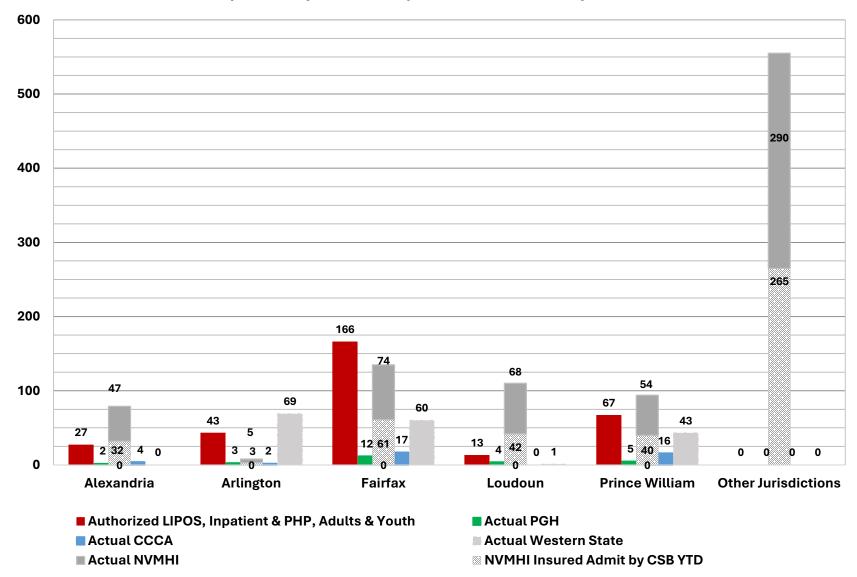

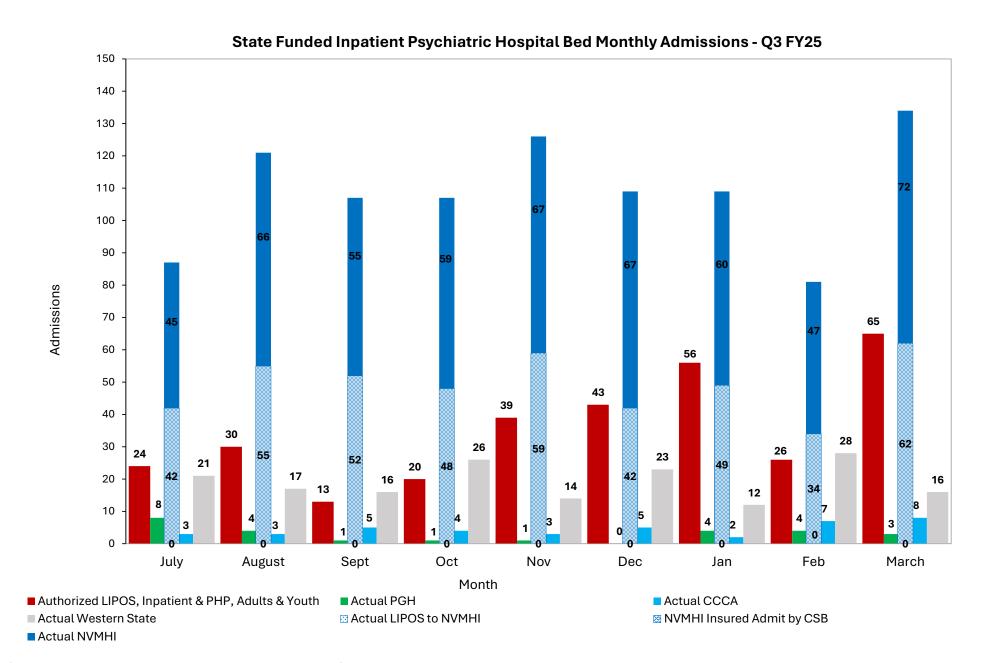

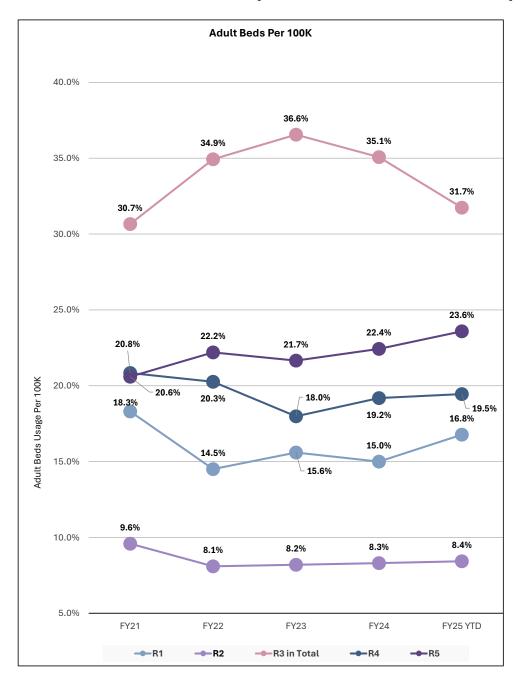
Comparison by Region of Adult Bed Use, Per 100K and Actual -March FY25

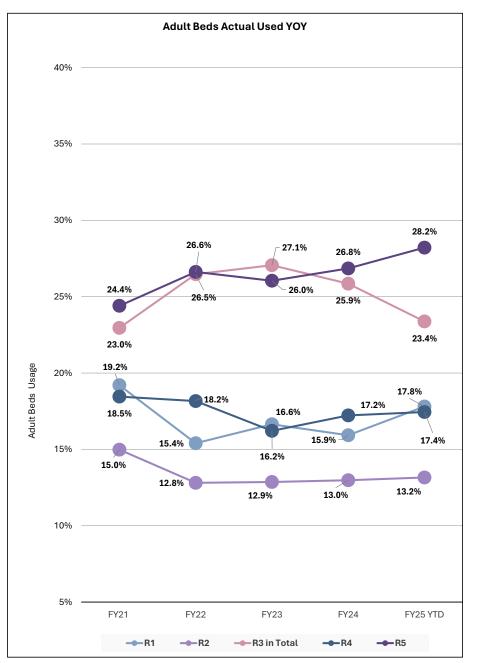


Adult and Older Adult State Facility Bed Use, Actual and Per 100K - March FY25



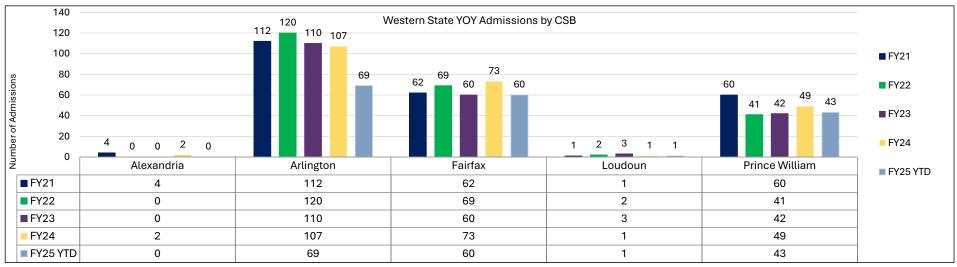
YOY Comparison of Adult State Hospital Bed Use by Region - March FY25

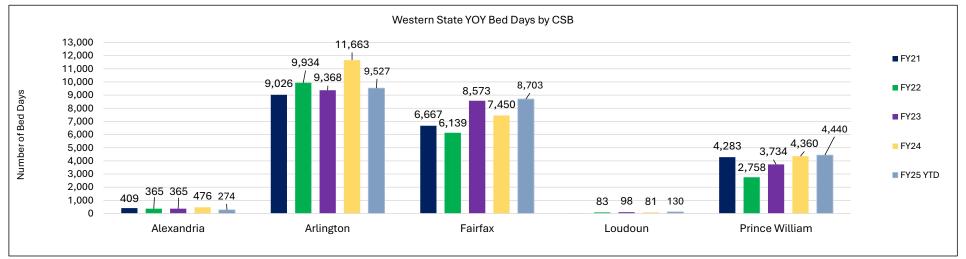

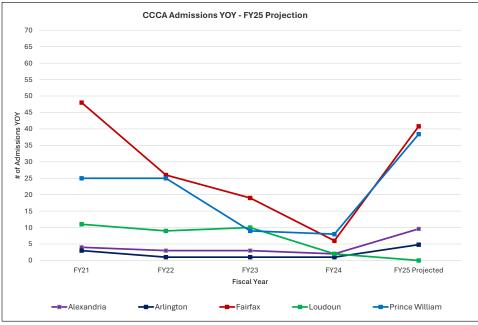


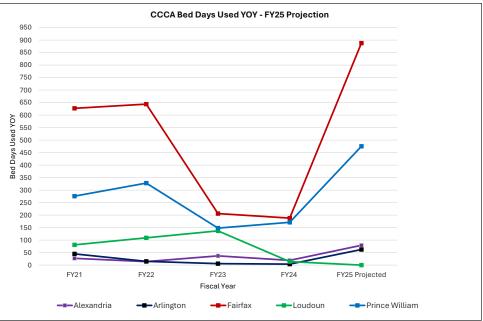


Commonwealth Center for Children and Adolescents (CCCA) Hospitalizations for Youth per 100K and YOY - Q3 FY25









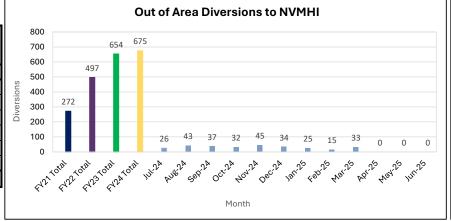

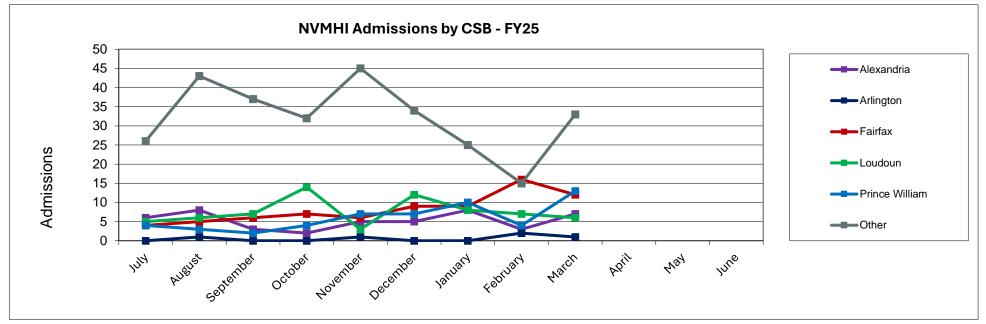




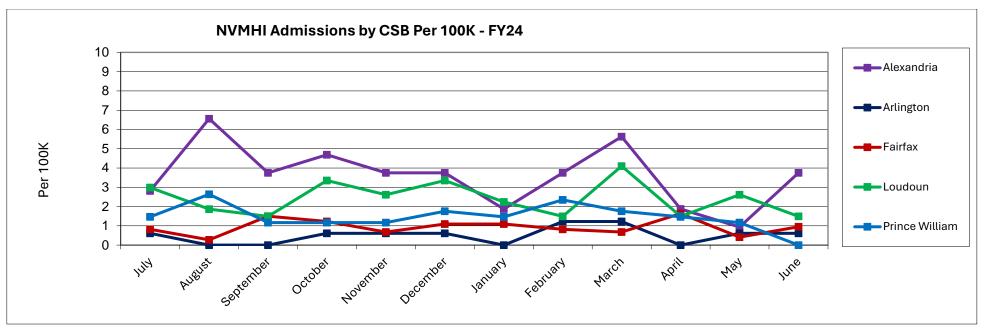


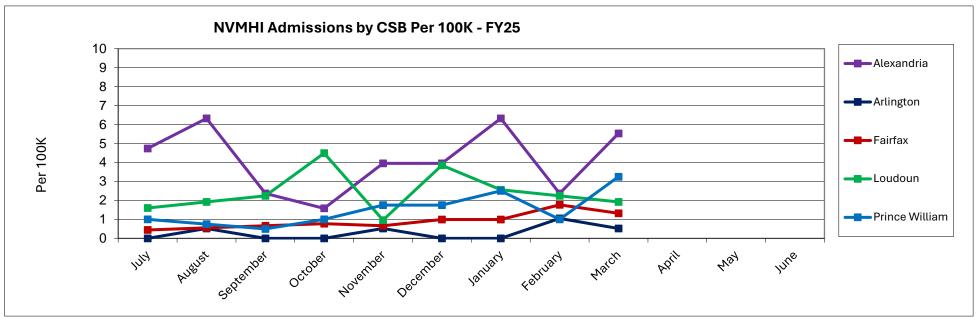
FY24 vs. FY25 NVMHI Admissions by CSB - March FY25





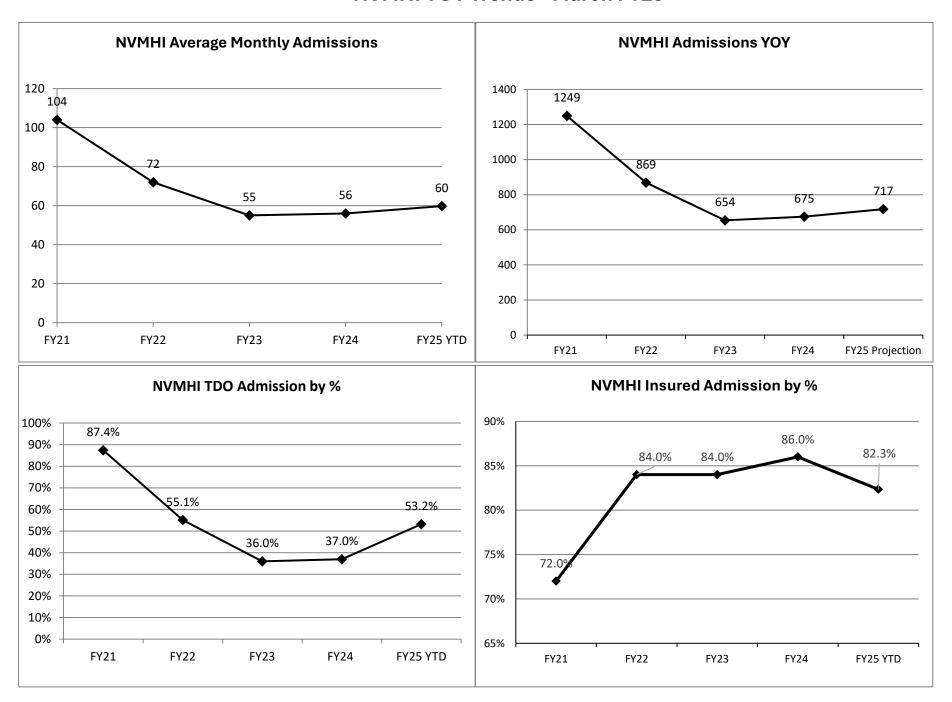
FY24 vs. FY25 NVMHI Admissions by CSB per 100K - March FY25
