What is 988?

988 is a 3-digit number to connect anyone in the United States to the Suicide & Crisis Lifeline. Currently 988 is not routed by your physical location, and only by your phone number. For a local response and a connection to local resources, dial 703-527-4077 to directly contact the 988 Lifeline Center located in Fairfax County.

When should I call 988?

Call 988 or 703-527-4077 when you or someone you know is struggling or in crisis (mental health, substance use, or suicidal thoughts). Both numbers connect you to trained mental health professionals that are available 24/7/365. They will talk to you about how to support yourself or someone you are concerned about.

Can I text 988?

Yes. You can text 988 and a trained mental health professional will text you back. To contact the 988 Lifeline Center in Fairfax County directly, text "CONNECT" to 855-11.
