


As of 2018, the Virginia General Assembly and Department of Rail and Public Transportation require that large public transportation agencies, like Fairfax Connector, develop a TSP



Alternatives At-A-Glance

Alternative 1

- Similar to current service and builds on recommendations from Transit Development Plan
- Improves hours of operations
- Improves frequency of service to places such as Tysons

Alternative 2

- Local all-day routes
- Frequent service to Metrorail Stations via feeder routes during rush hours
- Improves hours of operations
- New regional connections:
- Vienna to Reston
- Centreville to Tysons
- Chantilly to Franconia-Springfield Metrorail Station

Alternative 3

- Combines existing service with new regional service connections:
- Centreville to Tysons
- Chantilly to Franconia-Springfield Metrorail Station







When it comes to WALKING to the bus stop vs. WAITING for the bus, I prefer...










When it comes to TRANSFERRING buses vs. OVERALL travel time, I prefer...








