- Q11. MFD hardware section 6.1.2., what percentage of the fleet today has analog faxing and what percentage uses RightFax?
- A11. 100 percent of the fleet uses RightFax.
- Q12. MFD hardware section 6.1.2., is the goal to move all analog faxing to RightFax immediately or over time?
- A12. Almost all faxing preformed in the County is via RightFax.
- Q13. MFD hardware section 6.1.2., we have seen many organizations move a percentage of devices from A3 to A4 based on the reduction of 11x17 printing. Would the County want to see A4 options as well?
- A13. The County desires to see all solutions including A3 and A4 MFD's.

- Q14. MFD hardware section 6.1.2. B, "Current print output from MFD Program devices has risen from 15% to 65% of total County output over the last ten years." How has the pandemic affected your volume in the last 2.5 years?
- A14. Total output decreased during the pandemic.
- Q15. Are your print volumes back to 2019 levels?
- A15. With the County return to work policy and the institution of the new up to 60% Telework policy for eligible employees occurring less than five months ago it is too early to tell.
- Q16. MFD hardware section 6.1.2.A, the request is to support Appletalk/Bonjour...do you mean Airprint?
- A16. Apple Bonjour network discovery protocol is currently a requirement and support for native Apple AirPrint is strongly preferred.
- Q17. MFD hardware section 6.1.2., what percentage of the fleet is classified as "First Responders" and how many locations are there?
- A17. Currently 65 MFD's are listed as First Responder or 24/7/365 support and 55 MFD's are listed as After-Hours support.
- Q18. MFD hardware section 6.1.2., how many "Frequently Used field replacement units" are stored at the County Facilities today?
- A18. "Frequently Used field replacement units" mentioned in Sections 6.1.4 F., 6.2.5 F., and 6.3.5 Maintenance and Supplies. Multiple "Frequently Used field replacement units" or FRU's per model are stored in a secure location within the Government Center what some may call a "Parts Locker" along with several sets or consumables and supplies for each model.
- Q19. Can the county provide a list of the disparate operating environments, networks and MFDs per location as referred to by the county statement in the RFP on page 3, section 5.2.?
- A19. The operating environments are germane to the Agency's business, services provided, as well as facility type i.e., warehouse, golf course clubhouse, group home, outpatient services, central offices etc. All County facilities owned or leased have hardwired TCP/IP network connectivity, most have wireless or Wi-Fi connectivity and some have inbuilding cellular connectivity. Number of MFD's per location varies and typically correlates to the number of employees at the location as well as the input/output needs with as few as one MFD and as many as 88 at the most populated facility.
- Q20. MFD Software section 6.1.3, can you provide more detailed information on the exact type of mobile devices used by the county and in what capacity?
- A20. Mobile devices are mentioned in Sections 5.2, 6.1.1, 6.1.4 E. I., and 6.3.5 Support Staff. In each case mobile devices are smart phones and tablets. The County primarily uses iOS mobile devices to conduct County business including email, text, phone calls, video/web conferencing, data capture, printing, etc.
- Q21. MFD Software Section 6.1.3., will the county allow for further scoping of the infrastructure and requirements with regard to the high availability request?
- A21. Yes. High-Availability is mentioned in Sections 6.1.3. and 6.3.4.
- Q22. MFD Software Section 6.1.3, can the county further define what templates are needed for job ticketing with regard to sending jobs to the print shop?
- A22. This is not mentioned in Section 6.1.3 but is mentioned in Section 6.2.3 A. I. and is in reference to capabilities desired in a print management information software solution similar to those found in solutions from RSA and EFI.

- Q23. MFD Software Section 6.1.3, would a FedRamp certified hosting platform provided by the County (i.e Azure) satisfy the FedRamp requirement for any applications installed in said environment?
- A23. FedRamp was mentioned in Section 6.1.8 B. 1. and Section 6.2.8 B. I. and Section 6.3.8. In each case Offeror cloud solution(s) should be FedRAMP moderate and SOC 2 compliant at a minimum regardless of where hosted.
- Q24. Please share the names of the vendors that were onsite for your Wednesday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> walk thru?
- A24. DEX Imaging LLC, Sharp Business Systems, Konica Minolta Business Solutions dba Meridian Imaging Solutions, and Ricoh -USA.
- Q25. Section 5.2 MFD's, Pertaining to chart listed for MFD's, do the MFD's fall under the industry standard copier segments? i.e. bizhub 360i is Copier segment 3?
- A25. Refer to Attachment C Pricing Schedule.xlsx and the segments as defined by the County.
- Q26. Section 5.3 Print Services, Pages 4 & 5 under Print Services have two tables showing the County's current devices that are owned. It is understood that the new vendor would be replacing the leased equipment but what is the County asking for in regard to all the owned pieces of equipment listed?
- A26. The leased Xerox equipment is now owned by the County. The County would like the option of procuring any printing and finishing equipment necessary to meet current and future customer requirements during the course of the contract.
- Q27. Section 6.1.2, Section H --Pertaining to Segment 3 copiers solely, operating at 31 40 pages per minute, would the County be open to accept finishing/stapling of 50 pages per packet? For such a robust finisher which would handle 100 sheet stapling, the cost as well as footprint for the system would be overkill for this segment.
- A27. Refer to Attachment C Pricing Schedule.xlsx and the segments as defined by the County. The stated finisher options listed in Section 6.1.2, Section H should be available regardless of cost and/or size as required by some customers.
- Q28. Section 6.1.2, We believe there is no finisher available to support Segment 4 6 with 200 sheet stapling capability. Would the County change the specification to 100 sheet stapling capability?
- A28. Offerors should list all available finishers and finisher options your firm offers for each model.
- Q29. Section 6.1.2, Segment 3 and Segment 4 within the industry are looked at as workgroup solutions with segment 5 leaning more to lite production, requiring all the advanced finishing options such as post process insertors. With this information, would the County agree that the requirement for the post process insertor could be waived for Segment 4?
- A29. Please use the County defined segments when responding
- Q30. Section 6.1.3 B, is the County tying together IWR and ICR in the form of Zone word capture for this requirement?
- A30. The desire is to recognize and capture in zonal and/or full document, typed and handwritten sentences, phrases, text, characters for purposes to include classification, extraction, indexing, etc.
- Q31. Section 6.1.4, B,
  - 1) Who is responsible for removing the existing fleet from all the County facilities?
  - 2) If the new vendor is responsible, where does this equipment go?
  - 3) Is it for disposal or will it need to be returned to a leasing company?
  - 4) If a leasing company, will the County assure there is no outstanding payments due for said equipment?
  - 5) Additionally, under section 6.1.8 B it is requested that a certificate of destruction be provided for all MFD Hard drives. If these are leased pieces of equipment, they must be returned to the leasing

- company with hard drives intact. Who is responsible for providing and installing these new hard drives?
- A31. 1) Current vendor is responsible for removing the existing MFD fleet from all County facilities. 2) N/A 3) N/A 4) N/A 5) Selected Offeror is responsible for maintaining chain of custody and providing certificate of data destruction for all non-volatile memory in each MFD and replacement of all non-volatile memory if required by non-County entity.
- Q32. Section 6.1.4, D, how many MFD's must be supported under the 24/7/365 requirement?
- A32. Duplicate question, see response to question 17.
- Q33. Section 6.1.4, E, how many MFD's are within the Courthouse/Massey Complex that is to service by the dedicated technician? Is this dedicated technician also responsible for servicing MFD's outside of the complex?
- A33. Currently there are 83 MFD's that fall within the Courthouse/Massey Complex to be serviced by a primary dedicated technician with a named secondary and tertiary as backup to the primary. These technicians will also service MFD's in the Courthouse/Massey Complex as needed.
- Q34. Section 6.1.6, please define what is "new technology" that can cause the technology refresh clause to kick in?
- A34. Anything the County deems extremely advantageous or necessary to conduct County business. To date, this clause has never been invoked.
- Q35. Section 6.2.2, since the County's current B/W production unit has the capability of 300GSM (110 Cover), will the County accept 13lb bond up to 110lb cover for the black & white production gear? (Larger range than current equipment)
- A35. Must meet or exceed current capabilities.
- Q36. Section 6.2.2, will the County accept 600 x 2400 dpi print resolution for the black & white production? Higher resolution than current equipment which is 600 x 600)?
- A36. Must meet or exceed current capabilities.
- Q37. Section 6.2.5 B:
  - 1) Who is responsible for removing the existing fleet from all the County facilities?
  - 2) If the new vendor is responsible, where does this equipment go?
  - 3) Is it for disposal or will it need to be returned to a leasing company?
  - 4) If a leasing company, will the County assure there is no outstanding payments due for said equipment?
  - 5) Additionally, under section 6.2.8 B it is requested that a certificate of destruction be provided for all MFD Hard drives. If these are leased pieces of equipment, they must be returned to the leasing company with hard drives intact. Who is responsible for providing and installing these hard drives?
- A37. 1) Current vendor is responsible for removing the existing MFD fleet from all County facilities. 2) N/A 3) N/A 4) N/A 5) Selected Offeror is responsible for maintaining chain of custody and providing certificate of data destruction for all non-volatile memory in each MFD and replacement of all non-volatile memory if required by non-County entity.
- Q38. 1) Is a dual/combined vendor response acceptable? 2) This would not be a sub-contracting arrangement but one vendor responding to Part 2: Production Print and a partner vendor to Parts 3: Enterprise Scanning & 4: Records Compliance and Preservation. 3) If awarded the contract, can we bill separately for services.
- A38. 1) Yes, but only one vendor/offeror can submit a response on behalf of the offerors. 2) Only one vendor/offeror can submit a response on behalf of the offerors as the prime contractor. It is up to the offeror/vendor in how they will work together to fulfill all the requirements of the RFP. 3) Normally the County works with the prime contractor as they are the ones

responsible for the performance of the entire contract and how payment is distributed. It will depend upon the response the vendor/offeror is proposing to the County as we may be able to negotiate a method to meet the needs of the vendor/offeror regarding payment.

- Q39. Are there any files that are not allowed to go offsite for scanning?
- A39. Yes. Determined business owner and contents of data.
- Q40. What is the expectation for pick-up/transporting of files to be scanned?
- A40. If files are cleared for offsite scanning selected vendor is responsible for retaining chain of custody and ensuring security of files to be picked-up/transported.
- Q41. Would Fairfax County box the files or would the chosen scan vendor do so?
- A41. The chosen scan vendor would do so.
- Q42. Would Fairfax County ship boxed files to the scanning site or expect onsite pickup?
- A42. Onsite pickup.
- Q43. Is the last day to submit questions to be addressed in the addendum be extended?
- A43. Yes, changing date from June 29, 2022 at 4:30 PM EDT to July 15, 2022 at 4:30 PM EDT.
