#### 5. MINIMUM SERVICE PROVIDER QUALIFICATIONS:

#### 5.15. Behavioral Health Senior Clinician

- a. Licensed to practice in the Commonwealth of Virginia in one of the following: Licensed Clinical Social Worker, Licenses Professional Counselor, Clinical Psychologist, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, Licensed Substance Abuse Treatment Practitioner or Clinical Nurse Specialist
- Master's Degree: psychology, social work, nursing, counseling, or a related field
- c. Driver's License
- d. CPR Certification within 3 months

#### 5.16. Nurse Practitioner

- a. Licensed to practice as a Nurse Practitioner in the state of Virginia
- b. Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with a bachelor's degree in nursing; plus a master's degree in nursing as a clinical nurse practitioner
- c. Depending upon area of assignment, may require one year of experience as a certified nurse practitioner

#### 5.17. Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner

- Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with a master's or doctorate degree in nursing and graduation from a state-certified, advanced practice program
- b. Experience in treating people with medications for Opioid Use Disorder
- c. Certified as a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) or similar
- d. Possess an unrestricted license to practice as a Licensed Nurse Practitioner (LNP). LNP licensure must be in the Commonwealth of Virginia
- e. Possess a valid DEA number and unrestricted DEA license in Virginia by date of hire

# Appendix C Temporary Health Care Services Tasks to be Performed

#### Behavioral Health Senior Clinician Tasks

#### 1. Provide the following services for the Community Services Board:

- Coordinate care and services to individuals diagnosed with substance use disorder and on medication for addictions treatment (MAT) to make successful re-entry back to the community and decrease recidivism.
- Conduct clinical assessments using the ASAM criteria for individuals with primary substance use, co-occurring mental health disorders/developmental disabilities/and/or physical illness.
- c. Maintain collaborative relationships with individuals and develop diagnostic formulation and make recommendations for further services in a timely manner. Must be able, through observation, to monitor and assess risk for harm to self and/or others.
- d. Demonstrate knowledge of community resources and effectively navigate those resources in the interest of the individual.
- e. Provide clinical consultation and intervention, coordination, and linkage with Adult Detention Center (ADC) and community partners(including but not limited to court services, CSB, and community residential programs) to support community re-entry.
- f. Create and manage group and family treatment to diagnostically, culturally, and socio-economically diverse individuals.
- g. Conduct groups for individuals on MAT. Description of Hazard(s): Face to face client interactions that cannot be limited to 6' or greater. Same contact with other county staff in the jail, community, and courts. Same clients and staff this position is exposed to do not comply with the use of PPE.
- h. Engineering / Administrative / Work Practice Controls: Due to community settings and jail, courts being host environments, these workplace controls are not able to be implemented by the employer, the setting also places security limitations to such controls. As possible, virtual meetings are used, but cannot be for all interactions. Staff clean their own areas at the ADC and cannot clean in the community or courts. Clients served may be and are also confirmed COVID positive.
- PPE Required: PPE as required by Very High-or High-Risk Level Assessment Tasks listed that require use of this PPE: Face to face client interactions of known COVID positive.

## DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES Duty #1 (40%)

This position serves as a clinician providing direct clinical services for individuals that need CSB services and are on MAT at the ADC. Independently performs substance abuse assessments including assessments of risk. Provides case coordination, crisis intervention, supportive counseling, and outreach. Develops diagnostic formulation and makes recommendations for further services using the ASAM criteria. Must be able, through observation and clinical interview, to monitor and assess individuals for risk for harm to self and/or others.

Demonstrates the ability to assess the need for substance abuse and co-occurring services. Provide group counseling to individuals on MAT at the ADC. Demonstrates the knowledge of community resources and effectively navigates those resources in the interest of the individual. Provides clinical consultation and treatment intervention, collaboration, and coordination with community partners to support community re-entry and minimize recidivism.

Duty #2 (20%)

Assumes case coordination and referral responsibilities and coordinates referral services for individuals with other community agencies. Coordinates closely with inter-agency services, intra-agency programs, and other private profit and non-profit agencies to ensure collaborative treatment planning for individuals.

Duty #3 (20%)

Demonstrates proficiency in relevant credible programs, individual data, and scheduling, knows appropriate forms to use for assessments to include, but not limited to, assessment paperwork, emergency services referral forms, and IRTT referral forms. Build group roster and ensure that they are managed within the SIPS programs at the ADC. Completes all clinical paperwork and refers cases in a timely manner. Participates in related administrative activities including meetings and supervision. Completes administrative paperwork in a timely manner. Work hours as assigned based on the program needs. Maintains clinical training, licensure, professional and organizational standards.

Duty #4 (10%)

Participates in related administrative activities including meetings and supervision. Completes administrative paperwork in a timely manner. Work hours as assigned based on the program needs. Maintains clinical training, licensure, professional and organizational standards. Provides consultation to the office of the sheriff, court services, judges, attorneys, CSB colleagues, outside providers, and family members about appropriate clinical interventions for inmates who have been seriously impacted by MH/SA/ID disorders and who are involved with the criminal justice system.

Duty #5 (10%)

Adheres to all policies and procedures of the county, Fairfax-Falls Church CSB, and office of the sheriff documenting clinical information in compliance with all confidentiality guidelines promulgated by CSB, office of the sheriff, state and federal standards, regulations, and laws. Cooperatively accepts and performs other professional duties that may or may not be specifically listed but falls within the general responsibility of this position. Other duties as assigned.

#### PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Must be able to walk significant distances within multiple buildings, climb stairs and respond to physical requirements, necessary to comply with security and safety regulations.

Ability to attend offsite meetings and trainings.

Communicate effectively orally and in writing and observe, process, and document clinical information.

Must be able to access, input, and retrieve computer data.

#### **Nurse Practitioner Tasks**

#### 1. Provide the following services for the Sheriff's Office:

- a. As part of a care team, provides care to clients in various health and human services delivery programs and to adult and juvenile clients in County detention centers
- b. Performs physical examinations, laboratory work and diagnostic procedures
- c. Develops treatment plans, including prescribing medications
- d. Provides health education
- e. Performs related work as required
- f. Other Requirements:
  - 1. Criminal Background Investigation
  - 2. Child Protective Services
  - 3. Tuberculosis Test
  - 4. National Provider Identifier
  - 5. Independent prescriber certification preferred

### Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner Tasks

### 1. Provide the following services for the Sheriff's Office:

- a. The Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner differs from the Nurse Practitioner in that the Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner can provide the same physical health diagnoses and treatment as a Nurse Practitioner but has additional training and/or experience in behavioral health and provide ongoing behavioral health treatment, including medications for Opioid Use Disorder.
- b. Other Requirements:
  - 1. Criminal Background Investigation
  - 2. Child Protective Services
  - 3. Tuberculosis Test
  - 4. National Provider Identifier
