Community Assessment: Health Insurance Coverage

In 2000, a Community Assessment was conducted jointly by Fairfax County, the City of Fairfax, the City of Falls Church, and the Fairfax–Falls Church United Way to gather information about people in our community and to assist in human services planning. In September 2000, the survey was mailed to 11,200 households in the two Cities and the County. The response rate was 6,859 households or 63 percent after compensating for vacant housing and incorrect addresses. This was the second Community Assessment; the first survey was conducted in 1995.



This publication profiles people and households with or without health insurance coverage in the five Human Services Regions, the Cities of Fairfax and Falls Church, and the Total Area. The tables contain person level data about sex, race/ethnicity, English proficiency, educational attainment, employment status, labor force participation, mental health issues, long-lasting conditions, and poverty levels. Tables also contain household data on household size, race and age of household head, language spoken at home, income, housing type and tenure, housing costs, percentage of income spent on housing, financial difficulties, and internet access.

The distributions percentages will sum to 100 percent going down the columns of information for each characteristic.

^{**} Insured Rates by Characteristic provide the percent of persons or households within a characteristic class that comprise each insurance status group. For example, the insurance rates show the percent of persons under 5 years old with health insurance. The insurance rate percentages will sum to 100 percent going across rows of information for each characteristic.
