This notice provides essential guidance for all FCPS schools designated as polling places for the upcoming election on **Tuesday**, **September 9**, **2025**. Please review the following requirements and responsibilities carefully to ensure full compliance.

#### Regulation 8422: Community Use of School Facilities as Polling Places

Responsibilities for the use of school facilities as polling places are outlined in the current version of *Regulation 8422, Community Use of School Facilities as Polling Places*. Review that regulation carefully, especially the sections regarding the display of flags and required hours of access for election officials.

# Polling place survey

A polling place survey will be emailed to your point of contact approximately **six to eight weeks before Election Day**. This survey is used to coordinate delivery of voting equipment and timing of facility access for setup on the Monday before Election Day. Ensure the survey is completed and submitted by the specified deadline.

## Voting equipment delivery and pickup

- Delivery window: between Wednesday, August 27 and Wednesday, September 3
- Pickup window: between Wednesday, September 10 and Wednesday, September 18

Election cages **(65"H, 63"W, 33"D)** containing voting equipment will be delivered to each school one to two weeks before Election Day.

Custodians should be advised that Office of Elections staff will visit each location the week before Election Day to verify that the correct equipment has been delivered. A custodian or other staff member in each facility should be prepared to direct the Office of Elections staff to the location(s) of the equipment within each facility.

Voting equipment will be picked up within one week after Election Day.

#### Voting room, tables, and chairs

Although school is in session, the voting room must be in the gym or another room that provides at least 1,500 square feet of unobstructed space.

The voting room must include:

- At least 10 tables (tables with attached chairs are not permitted)
- At least 20 separate, moveable, adult-sized chairs

If additional equipment is needed, submit a request to the Logistics Center for more tables or chairs no later than **Friday**, **August 29**.

#### Entry access and door procedures

Voters cannot be required to sign in at the main office. If your school has a door access system:

- Deprogram the voter entrance doors for the day, OR
- Assign a staff member to monitor the door and ensure voters can enter without delay

## Prohibited activities within 40 feet of polling place entrance

In accordance with Virginia Code § 24.2-604, no campaigning, bake sales, fundraising, or other solicitation may take place within 40 feet of the polling place entrance.

# Parking & accessibility

All polling places must be fully ADA-compliant, including clear and accessible entry to the building from the designated accessible entrance.

- Do NOT allow school buses to park near any entrance designated for voter access.
- Election officers will post signs to reserve accessible parking spaces for voters.
- Refer to the attached chart for the required number of voter-reserved parking spaces.

## Election day requirements – Tuesday, September 9, 2025

The building must be open by 5:00 a.m. Each school is authorized for two hours of custodial overtime. In addition:

- Ensure all lighting (interior and exterior) is functional.
- Adjust exterior lighting to turn on early for election worker arrival at 5:00 a.m.
- Ensure climate control is active in the voting area from 5:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m.
- Do not schedule fire drills on Election Day.
