

MINUTES
Fairfax County Electoral Board
April 5, 2019

The Fairfax County Electoral Board met on Friday, April 5, 2019, in Conference Room 315/319 at the Fairfax County Government Center located at 12000 Government Center Parkway, Fairfax, to determine the ballot order for candidates filing simultaneously for the same office. Chairman Stephen M. Hunt, Vice Chairman Bettina M. Lawton, Secretary Katherine K. Hanley, General Registrar Gary Scott, Assistant Registrar Patty Reilly, and Clerk to the Board Beth Dixon Methfessel were present.

Mr. Hunt called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and introduced himself, Vice Chairman Lawton, and Secretary Hanley (Board). Ms. Hanley moved to approve the agenda, and by a vote of 3-0, the April 5, 2019, meeting agenda, was adopted.

Mr. Hunt explained that pursuant to Va. Code § 24.2-529, the Board will determine the ballot order for Democratic candidates simultaneously presenting their campaign filing documents for the following offices:

- Commonwealth's Attorney
- Chairman, Board of Supervisors
- Supervisor, Braddock
- Supervisor, Hunter Mill
- Supervisor, Lee
- Supervisor, Providence

Ms. Hanley explained that the each of the names of the candidates who filed simultaneously had been placed inside of a sports-themed, plastic egg by the Clerk to the Electoral Board. The ballot order for each of the six offices will be decided separately by placing the eggs for the respective contest into a silver bowl. Chairman Hunt will draw the eggs out, one at a time, open it, and read the name. The first name drawn takes the highest position on the ballot.

For the office of Commonwealth's Attorney, two of two candidates filed simultaneously. Mr. Hunt drew the two names in the following order:

1. Raymond F. Morrogh
2. Steve Thomas Descano

For the office of Chairman, Board of Supervisors, four of four candidates filed simultaneously. Mr. Hunt drew the four names in the following order:

1. Ryan L. McElveen
2. Timothy M. Chapman
3. Jeffrey C. McKay
4. Alicia E. Plerhoples

For the office of Supervisor, Braddock District, two of two candidates filed simultaneously. Mr. Hunt drew the two names in the following order:

1. James Robert Walkinshaw
2. Irma Marianela Corado

For the office of Supervisor, Hunter Mill District, two of five candidates filed simultaneously. Mr. Hunt drew the two names in the following order:

1. Walter Lee Alcorn
2. Lauren Tyler Dodd

The ballot order for the remaining candidates for Hunter Mill District as determined by time of filing is as follows:

3. Shyamali Roy Hauth
4. Margaret D. Parker
5. Parker Kane Messick

For the office of Supervisor, Lee District, four of four candidates filed simultaneously. Mr. Hunt drew the four names in the following order:

1. Larysa Kautz
2. Rodney Lusk
3. James Thomas Migliaccio
4. Kelly M. P. Hebron

For the office of Supervisor, Providence District, three of five candidates filed simultaneously. Mr. Hunt drew the three names in the following order:

1. Edythe Frankel Kelleher
2. Dalia A. Palchik
3. Phillip A. Niedzielski-Eichner

The ballot order for the remaining candidates for Hunter Mill District as determined by time of filing is as follows:

4. Erika Milena Yalowitz
5. Linh D. Hoang

Upon the completion of all the draws, Ms. Hanley read aloud the ballot order for each contest as determined by lot or by time of filing.

Mr. Hunt moved that the Board enter into a Closed Session for the purpose of discussing specific personnel matters, as permitted by Va. Code § 2.2-3711(A)(1). Without objection, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board entered into Closed Session at 3:12 p.m.

At 3:24 p.m. the Board concluded the Closed Session. Chairman Hunt read the following statement:

“In accordance with *Virginia Code* § 2.2-3712(D), I am asking the Secretary of the Electoral Board to conduct a roll call vote to certify that to the best of each member’s knowledge that (i) only public business matters lawfully exempted from open meeting requirements of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act were conducted in the closed meeting and (ii) only such public business as was identified in the motion for the closed meeting, by which the closed meeting was convened, was heard, discussed or considered in the closed meeting of the Electoral Board. The roll call vote will be recorded and included in the minutes of the Electoral Board.”

Secretary Hanley called the roll for the vote on the above statement:

There being no further business, Ms. Lawton moved to adjourn. The motion carried, and without objection, the meeting was adjourned at 3:25 p.m.
