

Parking Lot Accessibility

1. Is the parking lot surface stable, firm, and slip resistant? Yes No
2. Are the exterior pathways stable, firm, and slip-resistant? Yes No
3.  Is the route to the entrance at least 3 feet wide without stairs or other abrupt changes in level? Yes No
4. Are there at least 10 voter parking spaces (20 for co-located precincts)? Yes No
5. Is there a van-accessible voter parking space (or 2 parking spots that can be combined)? Yes No
6. Is the “ Voter Parking Only” sign posted to identify parking spaces for voters with disabilities? Yes No
7. Is the yellow A-frame curbside sign clearly readable from a vehicle parked in a curbside space? Yes No
8. Is there a clear, flat path from the parking lot to the accessible building entrance (i.e. no raised curbs, no overhead obstructions)? Yes No

9. Is the accessible entrance as close as possible to the accessible parking?
