



CHARGE UP FAIRFAX

What is it?

Charge Up Fairfax is a program that supports Fairfax County community associations (such as homeowner's or condominium associations) in overcoming challenges, both technical and financial, in installing on-site electric vehicle (EV) charging stations for residents and their guests.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING

How much financial assistance is available?

Communities in the Charge Up Fairfax program can get one-third of eligible expenses for the installation of charging stations, up to **\$5,000**. Communities classified as having high or very high vulnerability in the Fairfax County Vulnerability Index, or classified as disadvantaged in the Federal Government's Justice40 Initiative, may be eligible for up to **\$12,000**.*

**Communities that demonstrate a strong technical understanding but require financial support may qualify to participate for a grant-only option.*

How does it work?

1. **Prepare to apply** by surveying residents, identifying potential charging locations and reviewing governance documents and funding options.
2. **Submit an online application**. You'll be notified within 1 month of the application deadline if you are accepted into the program.
3. **Participate in an engineering site visit and receive a feasibility memo** to examine power sources, barriers, costs and timeline.
4. **Select a contractor** to obtain quotes, select equipment, and complete the design, permitting, and installation.
5. **Request a reimbursement grant** from the county after installation is complete.
