Nearly 25% of Virginians live in common interest communities, such as HOAs. Many HOAs restrict opportunities for residents to manage their runoff using native plantings ("conservation landscaping"). These restrictions prevent property owners from reducing stormwater impacts on their own properties and stormwater impacts to our local creeks and streams. Moreover, restrictions on landscaping limits these Virginian's from accessing state-funded programs like the Virginia Conservation Assistance Program. As Virginia continues to face more frequent and intense storms, it will be important to use every tool in our toolbox to protect our local streams, the Bay, and our drinking water.

HB528 (https://lis.virginia.gov/cgi-bin/legp604.exe?241+sum+HB528) was introduced in the 2024 General Assembly by Delegate Krizek and co-patroned by Senator Surovell and Delegate Laufer. The bill saw significant support from the conservation community. Through collaboration with the Community Associations Institute (the primary lobbying organization for community associations), the bill evolved during the course of the General Assembly. While significant progress was made on bill language, Delegate Krizek withdrew the bill in committee and requested a workgroup with the Housing Commission. The bill was discussed at the Housing Commission's June 5, 2024 Local Land Use and Community Living workgroup. The organizations working together on the bill language are expected to return to the workgroup with an update on August 20, 2024.`
