



Charge Up Fairfax

Request for Reimbursement Funds

Community associations that have been accepted into the Charge Up Fairfax program, completed an EV charging installation, and have complied with the terms and conditions agreed to when they applied to the Charge Up Fairfax program are eligible to receive a reimbursement grant to partially cover the installation costs of electric vehicle supply equipment (EVSE). Funding is available to offset up to one third of applicable installation costs, not to exceed \$5,000 per HOA. Requests for reimbursement must be made within one year of being accepted into Charge Up Fairfax.

Community associations in Fairfax County that are classified as having high or very high vulnerability in the Fairfax County Vulnerability Index, or that are classified as disadvantaged in the Federal Government's Justice40 Initiative, are eligible for up to \$10,000 paid on a reimbursable basis. OEEC will use GIS data to verify that the HOA is in an area shown in the Fairfax County Vulnerability Index, or the Federal Government's Justice40 Initiative as described above. See page 3 for eligible expenses and a map of One Fairfax and Justice40 areas.

Communities that were approved for grant-only participation of Charge Up Fairfax are eligible for funds to cover one-third of eligible expenses for the installation of EVSE, up to \$7,000. Communities approved for the grant-only track in Fairfax County that are classified as having high or very high vulnerability in the Fairfax County Vulnerability Index, or that are classified as disadvantaged in the Federal Government's Justice40 Initiative, are eligible for up to \$12,000 of grant funds.

Submission and processing:

You will be notified within 10 days of receipt if your grant request has been approved and the dollar amount for reimbursement. Once approved, a check will be mailed to the address provided above within 45 business days.

The reimbursement check will be sent by the Northern Virginia Soil & Water Conservation District (NVSWCD), Fairfax County's partner in administering Charge Up Fairfax. NVSWCD will also send a 1099 tax form at the end of the year.

Authorization

The request for reimbursement must be signed by the President of the board of directors (or their authorized designee) to be accepted for consideration. If not previously submitted, please provide evidence of your authority to bind the community association. Examples of suitable evidence include a copy of the community association's governing documents, providing a link to a website or database, or the minutes of a recent board meeting.

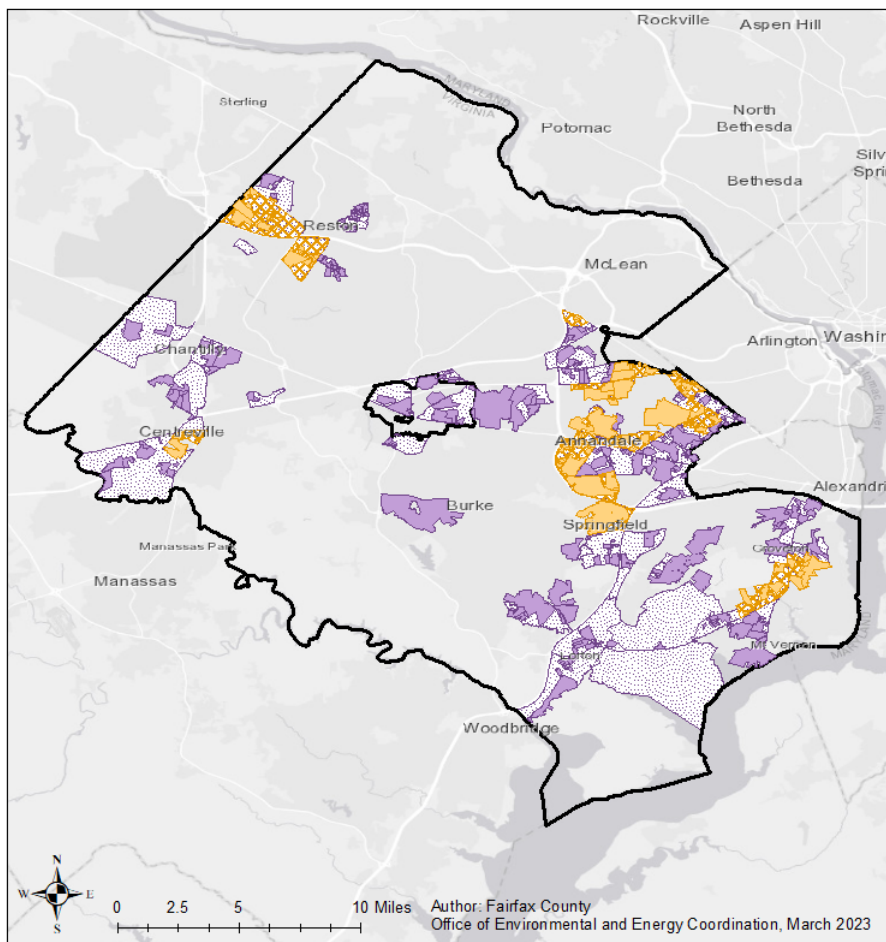

Eligible expenses for reimbursement under Charge Up Fairfax Grant Program:

- Engineering design
- EV charging equipment
- Electrical work necessary to power and install the charging station(s)
- Installation costs including trenching and building penetration repair (if any)

Ineligible expenses for reimbursement under Charge Up Fairfax Grant Program:

- Equipment purchased and upgrades made to prepare the community to be EV-ready, such as solar canopies, the creation of new parking spaces, or adding a sidewalk (excludes necessary electrical work)
- Fees incurred by attorneys, consultants, or management companies
- Changes in insurance premium or any charges from insurance companies
- Operation and maintenance expenses

This map shows Civic Associations in Fairfax County that may have higher demographic or socioeconomic vulnerability, according to One Fairfax (local) and Justice40 (federal) designations.

Orange Civic Associations are those that intersect Census Tracts classified as vulnerable by BOTH Justice 40 and One Fairfax. Note: All Justice 40 Census Tracts are also One Fairfax Census Tracts.

Purple Civic Associations are those that intersect Census Tracts classified as vulnerable by One Fairfax, but not by Justice 40.
