EQAC 2022 Annual Report on the Environment

Priority Recommendations for Implementation

The 2022 ARE was presented to the Board of Supervisors Environmental Committee at its December 13, 2022 meeting. At that meeting, it was requested that the Office of Environmental and Energy Coordination work closely with EQAC to identify their top three to five priority recommendations and to develop proposals for implementation, with support from relevant county agencies, and report back to future Board of Supervisors Environmental Committee meetings in 2023.

EQAC members voted to select the following recommendations as priorities for implementation at their January 11, 2023 meeting (Table 1). The selected priorities were based on recommendations where staff support may make progress on implementation. Consequently, recommendations that require a Board action such as recommending additional staff or funding were removed from consideration.

Three of the four recommendations (Priority Recommendations 1-3) address a similar topic of improving the protection and conservation of natural resources in the county. While they are unique recommendations in the 2022 ARE, it is proposed that these three recommendations be addressed as a group. Specifically, there may be an opportunity to bring these recommendations to the attention of the Environmental Policy Review as part of the Comprehensive Plan Amendment process that is scheduled to start in 2023. This proposed approach is described in the table below.
