## Safe & Connected Integration Project

<u>Purpose</u>: Fully implement the Safe & Connected Practice model throughout CYF

Method: Engage Accenture to help us identify strengths and gaps, and develop a roadmap to guide this work

**Status: Roadmap is almost complete; entering Implementation Phase** 



## **CWI Redesign**

<u>Purpose</u>: Strengthen professional development for new hires, current staff, and supervisors

<u>Method</u>: Engage Butler Institute to help us assess needs and develop curricula, simulations, transfer of learning activities, supervision framework, and coaching plans

Status: Work began in late April to set up project structure, adjust workplan, provide foundation and conduct needs assessment



### **Equity**

<u>Purpose</u>: Ensure that an equity-informed approach anchors every interaction with peers and every intervention with families as well as the delivery of services to the community.

Method: Integrate an Equity Plan into all major initiatives, including the Safe & Connected Integration Project and CWI Redesign

Status: Charter approved in May; work is beginning on equity planning for Safe & Connected Integration Project.



#### IT projects

FROST: Database to help maintain compliance and track and report on work with children in foster care, resource families, and adoptive families. Partial launch in Feb 2021; full launch expected summer 2021.

**OpenText**: Design new electronic case file system to replace Documentum. Project began in early May and will last 8-12 months.



## Other significant efforts

<u>PIP</u>: Participate in the statewide Program Improvement Plan coming out of the last federal Child and Family Services Review. Helped VDSS achieve 9 of 10 outcomes

<u>Strategic Plan</u>: Sunset current plan and develop new two-year plan focusing on Safe & Connected practice, professional development objectives, and strengthened focus on engaging relatives

<u>Timely Adoption</u>: Increase percent of children adopted from foster care within 24 months. Study factors contributing to this. Already seen improvement from 12% to 35%.
