PUBLIC ASSISTANCE AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICES (PAES)

New Name. Same Services. Improved Access!

The DFS Self-Sufficiency Division has a new name! We still offer the same important services with improved and more convenient access:

MEDICAID

Medical, dental, and behavioral health care for adults; people with low income; people who are blind or have other disabilities; pregnant women; children in need and their caretakers; and refugees when they first enter the U.S. Medical Care for Children Partnership (MCCP)

Offers families with low income a reduced-cost health care program for children up to age 19 who do not qualify for Medicaid and are uninsured. This program is available to families residing in Fairfax County or the Cities of Fairfax and Falls Church.

SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SNAP)

Formerly known as "food stamps," SNAP can be used like a debit card to buy food from authorized retailers and participating farmers' markets.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Job seekers can access employment workshops, career coaching, resume development, occupational skills training, job search assistance, and much more. We also help employers with recruitment and screening, employee training, development and retention, wage subsidies, tax credits and federal bonding.

TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF)

Temporary cash assistance to parents with low income and relative caretakers who have children under 18 years old. Parents receiving TANF may also be eligible for the VIEW (Virginia Initiative for Education and Work) program to prepare to enter, succeed in and advance in the workplace.

GENERAL RELIEF

Assistance to adults with low-income who have temporary disabilities, and to children in-need living with non-relatives. This program is available to families residing in Fairfax County or the Cities of Fairfax and Falls Church.

ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Help with heating and cooling costs. Applications for Heating Assistance are

accepted in October and November each year. Crisis Assistance (used to pay bills for utilities that are in danger of being disconnected) applications are accepted from November to March. Cooling Assistance applications are accepted from June to August. The exact dates vary each year so please contact us for details.
