Poverty in Fairfax County

In 2019, poverty for a family of four is defined as a family annual income of less than \$25,750 per year.

Of the 1,136,115 County Population*

68,141

(6.0% or 1 in 17) people live in poverty.

6,955

(10.0% or 1 in 13) children under age 5 live in poverty.

7,404

(4.7% or 1 in 18) people over age 65 live in poverty.


(8.4% or 1 in 14) children under age 18 live in poverty.

Economic Security

According to the MIT Living Wage Calculator¹ families working in low-wage jobs make insufficient income to live locally given the local cost of living.

In Fairfax County on average:

A family of four with two children would need over \$75,000 to meet their expenses.

Employment

The unemployment rate is 6.0% (Aug 2020, up from 2.5% in Aug 2019).

Housing

In 2019, the average monthly rent of a one-bedroom apartment was \$1,612, an increase of 34% since 2008.

Homelessness

In January 2020 there were 1,041 homeless people in Fairfax County; 31% of them were children under age 18.

Health

An estimated 95,768 or 8.5%, of county residents were without health insurance in 2019.

Child Care

The cost of full-time preschool child care in Fairfax County in 2020 ranged from \$14,000 to over \$19,500 per year, \$17,000 to nearly \$22,500 per year for an infant.

Food

In the 2019-2020 school year, Fairfax County Public Schools reported that 57,899 students (or 30.9% of enrollment) were eligible for free and reduced lunch.
