Accountability Workgroup Goals: Items without Consensus

<u>Goal 3</u>

"Support survivors and their families with options and resources for [safely] separating/disconnecting/disengaging or reconstructing family relationships..."

Some workgroup members proposed the following phrasing: *Nonjudgmental individualized options to survivors and family members. Provide resources to survivors and family members for self-determination of continuing or ending the relationship. Enhance safety for survivors and family members by providing individualized options supported by resources, services and supports. Survivor autonomy self-determination. Enhance safety for survivors and family members by engaging them in individualized, value-based exploration of options, supported by access to a range of resources, services, and supports.*

<u>Goal 7</u>

"Create systems of accountability that compliment but are different from existing institutional systems, such as the criminal justice system..."

Some workgroup members proposed the following phrasing: *Provide hope and dignity for all involved in recovery from domestic violence (but some said seems like a guiding principle, an absolute, rather than a goal).*

<u>Goal 9</u>

"Prioritize hope and dignity in our policies and procedures, health, wellness, and resilience of all people and communities..."

Some group members suggested also: Create supportive environments.

<u>Goal 10</u>

"Train the next generation of interventionists. [Engage the community in what domestic violence looks like and their role in prevention.]..."

Some group members did not agree with the term *interventionists* or that the training of service providers was the priority of this workgroup.

<u>Goal 11</u>

"Strengthen our commitment and understanding of intersections between violence and systemic issues, addressing disparities, disproportionality, and culturally-relevant options..."

The following phrasing was stricken so as to be more universally receivable by the public: *racial justice, economic justice, reproductive justice, and gender justice.* However, some workgroup members believed strongly that these must be included for there to be a successful outcome.
