



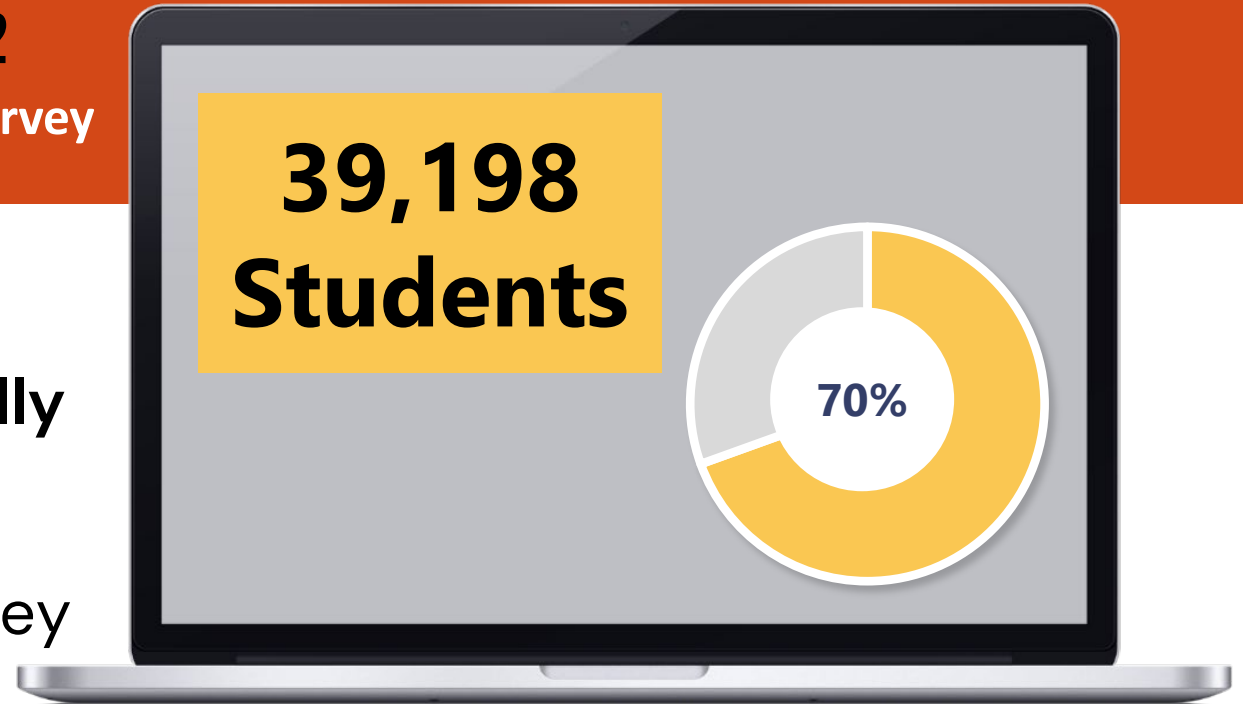

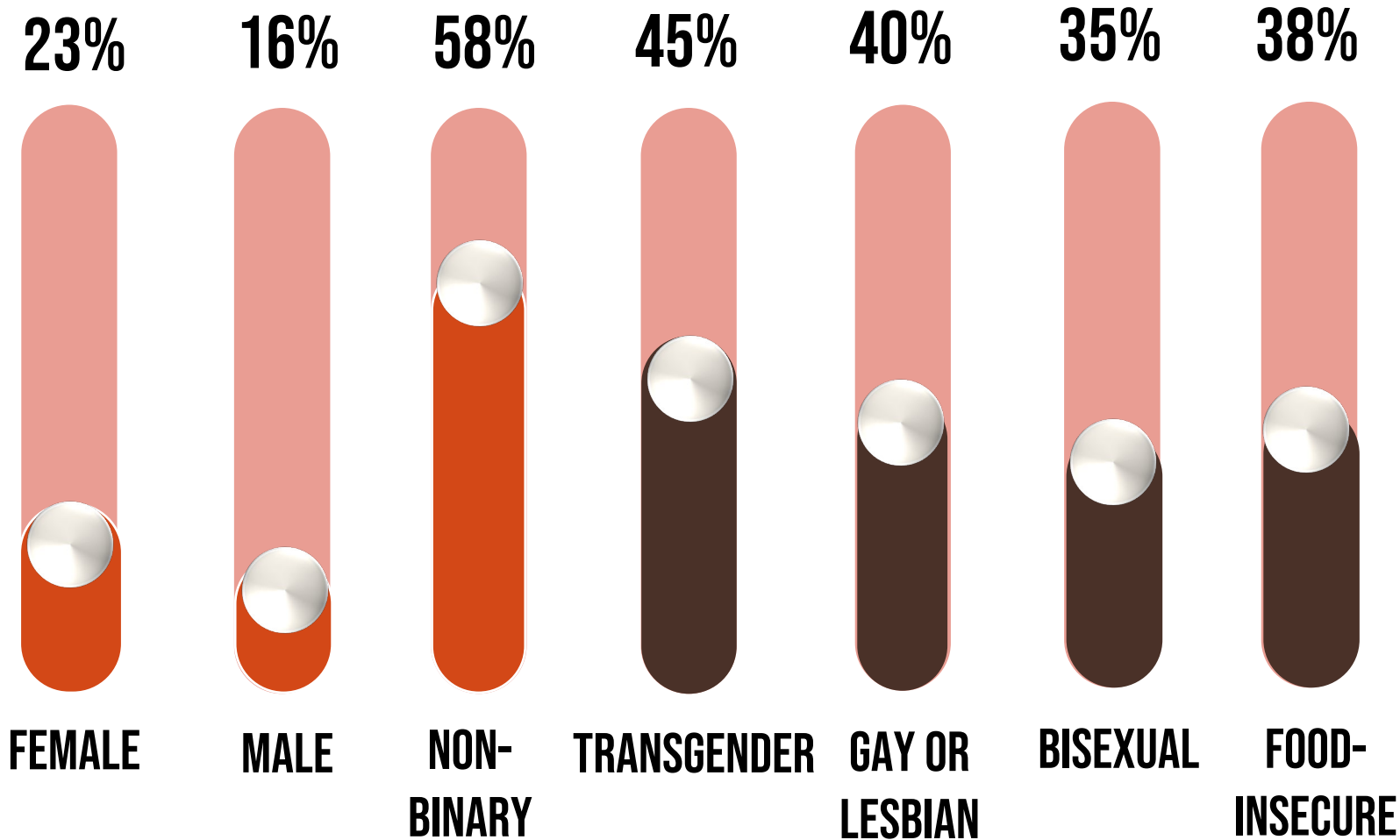

Emotional Abuse at home



20% OF 8TH, 10TH, 12TH GRADE STUDENTS

Reported having been bullied, taunted, ridiculed, or teased by a parent or other adult in their household in the past year (decrease by 5% from 2021).

Physical Abuse at home

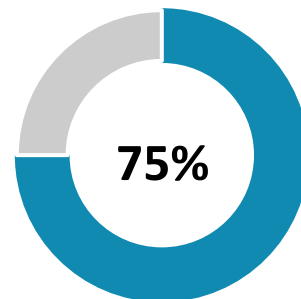
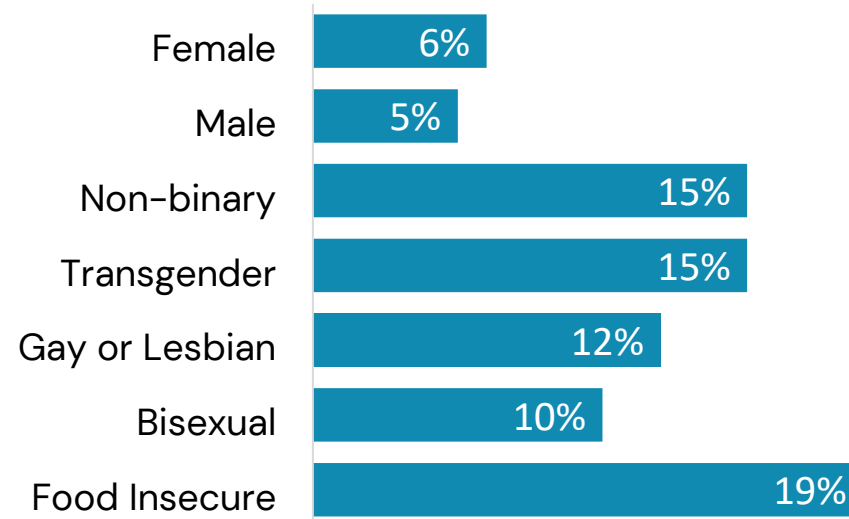
6% OF 8TH, 10TH, AND 12TH GRADE STUDENTS

Reported having been hit, kicked or physically hurt by a parent or adult in the past year.

11% OF 6TH GRADE STUDENTS

Reported having been hit, kicked or physically hurt by a parent or adult in the past year.

PERCENT PHYSICAL ABUSE BY A PARENT OR ADULT PAST YEAR



Nearly 75% of the students who reported physical abuse also responded that they were emotionally abused by a parent or adult in the past year.

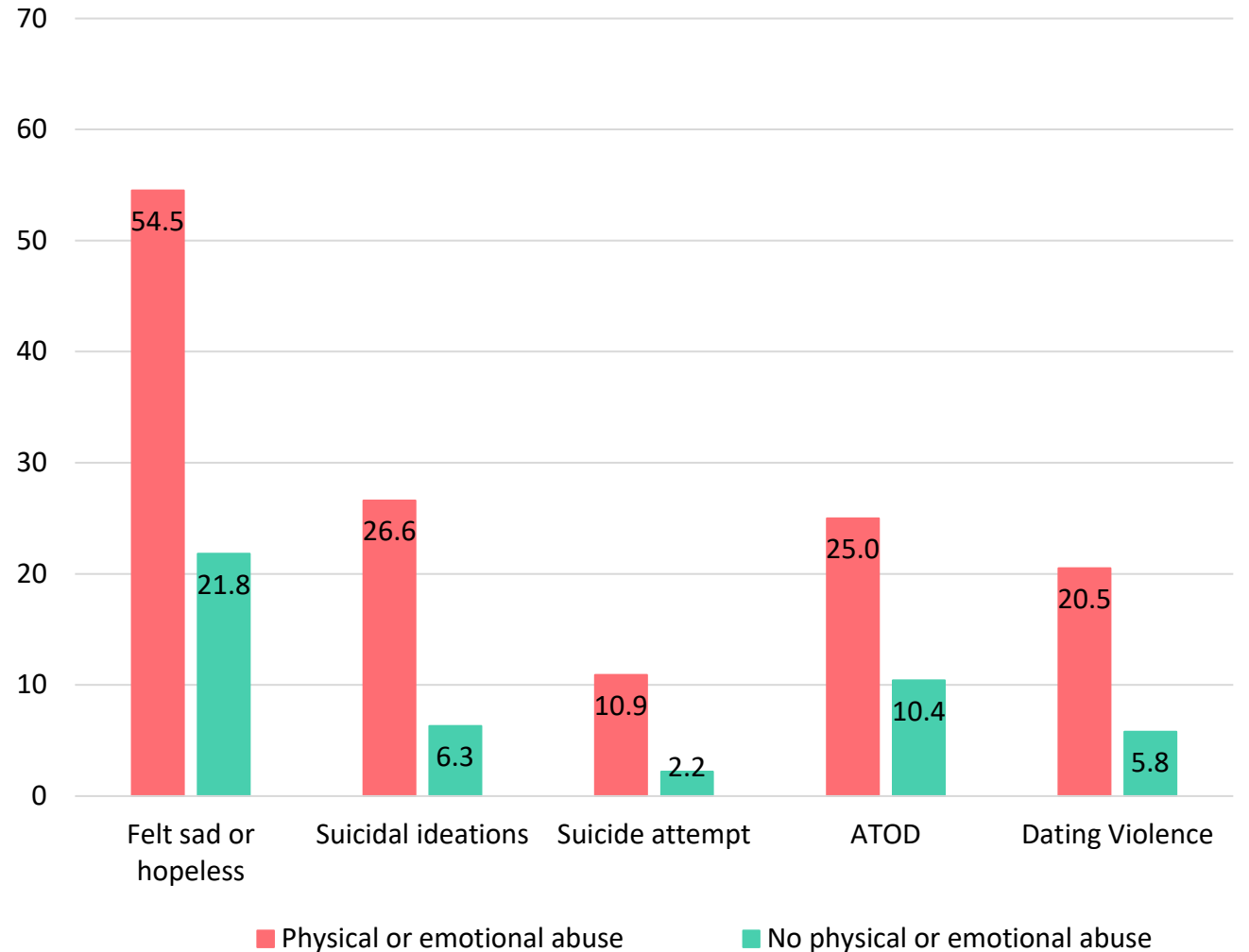
27%

of Fairfax county youth who **reported emotional or physical abuse at home** reported that they had **seriously considered suicide** in the past year (vs. 6% of those who did not report the experience)

ALCOHOL & SUBSTANCE USE (ATOD)

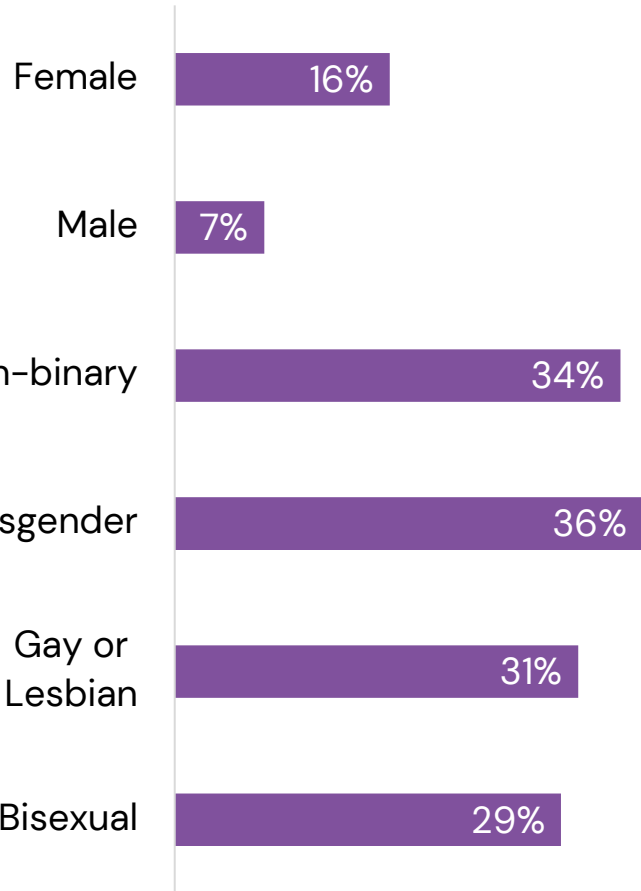
25%

of Fairfax county youth who reported that they **reported emotional or physical abuse at home** had **used alcohol, tobacco, and substances** in the past month (vs. 10% of those who did not report the experience)

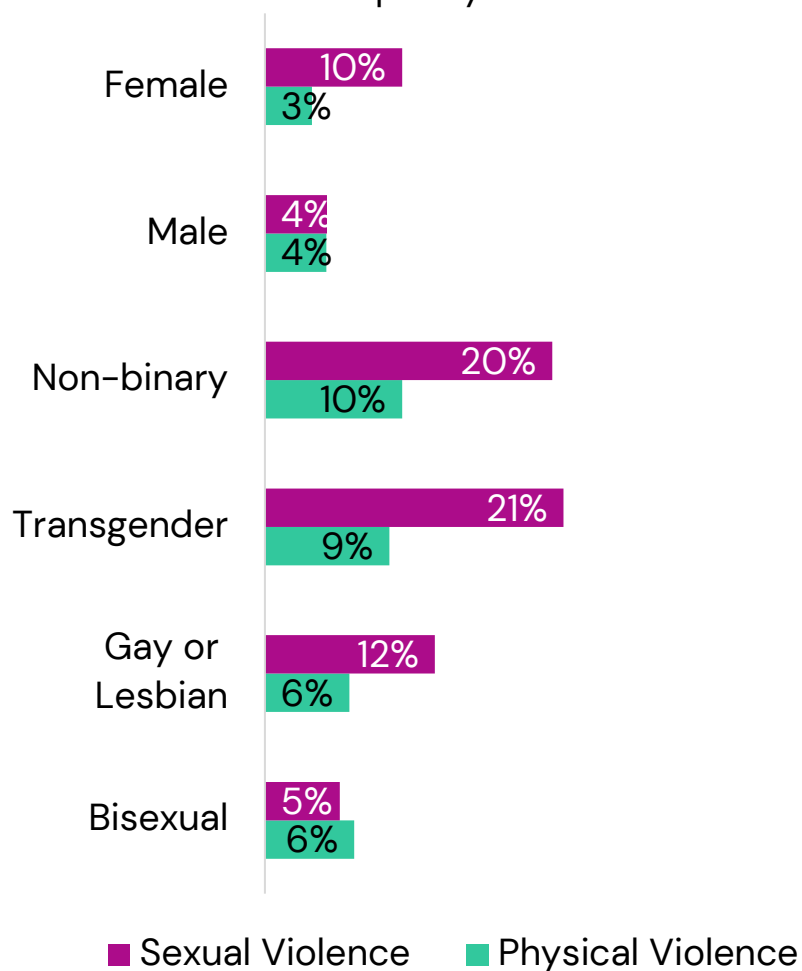


Sexual Harassment and Dating Violence

MENTAL HEALTH

66%

of those who **experienced physical violence by their date/partner** reported **feeling sad or hopeless** for two or more weeks in a row (vs. 35% of those who did not experience physical violence)

41%

of those who **experienced sexual violence** said they seriously **considered suicide** (vs. 12% of those who did not experience sexual violence)
