




Participate in the Fairfax County Youth Survey





Nearly 75% of the students who reported physical abuse also responded that they were emotionally abused by a parent or adult in the past year.



of Fairfax county youth who reported emotional or physical abuse at home reported that they had seriously considered suicide in the past year (vs. 6% of those who did not report the experience)

ALCOHOL & SUBSTANCE USE (ATOD)

of Fairfax county youth who reported that they reported emotional or physical abuse at home had used alcohol, tobacco, and substances in the past month (vs. 10% of those who did not report the experience)



Sexual Harassment and Dating Violence



MENTAL HEALTH

of those who experienced physical violence by their date/partner reported feeling sad or hopeless for two or more weeks in a row (vs. 35% of those who did not experience physical violence)
