- On October 2nd, Supervisors Herrity and Walkinshaw • presented a resolution to recognize the 2021 Fairfax Area "Think Tank" COVID-19 Challenge Winners. Commission on Aging (COA) Chair Cathy Cole offered remarks on behalf of the 50+ Technology Committee. The Committee announced the Think Tank Challenge as a call for strategies or programs to help address social isolation for older adults and people with disabilities who have little or no technology. The winning proposal, submitted by the Long-Term Care Coordinating Council's COVID-19 Impact & Response Committee, was a blueprint for a program called Friend Mobile. The team chair offered remarks and explained that Friend Mobile will use a motorized vehicle to visit older adults and adults with disabilities who are socially isolated. This vehicle will be equipped to bring entertainment, food, companionship, education, and more.
- At the October 25th Board of Supervisors (BOS) Legislative Committee meeting, the BOS reviewed the 2022 draft Human Services Issues Paper. The Human Services Issue Paper is a supplement to the 2022 Fairfax County Legislative Program as the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors has long recognized that investments in critical health, housing, and human services programs are essential to maintaining a healthy and vibrant community that provides all residents an equitable opportunity to thrive.
- At the November 9th BOS meeting, Supervisor Herrity will present a proclamation to recognize November as National Family Caregivers Month. Sharron Dreyer, COA Commissioner from Lee District, will receive the proclamation.
- The Fairfax Area Commission on Aging (COA) will meet virtually on Wednesday, November 17th. Kathleen Thomas, Communications Specialist for the Division of Adult and Aging Services, will share a communication plan for the upcoming SHAPE the Future of Aging Survey, which will be sent to older adults in the community in early 2022. In addition, the COA is developing commissioner outreach strategies in individual magisterial districts to support the survey. Theresa Brown, Volunteer Solutions Supervisor, and Linda Hernandez-Giblin, Planning Coordinator, will also present about current and developing AAA initiatives to address social isolation.

• The 50+ Technology Committee, including Commission on Aging Chair Cathy Cole, has announced the 6th Annual "Shark Tank" Technology Challenge. The challenge is open to all high school students in Fairfax County, City of Fairfax, and the City of Falls Church to develop an innovative device or app that will have a positive impact in the lives of older adults, adults with disabilities, or caregivers. **\$5000.00** in cash prizes have been provided by Shark Tank sponsor, IntegrityOne Partners.

- Fairfax County VICAP was featured in the October 30, 2021 New York Times article titled "THE NEW OLD AGE – Why Aren't More People Comparison Shopping for Health Plans?" One of the VICAP volunteers, Jack Hoadley, was interviewed along with a Fairfax County resident he counseled.
- The annual Medicare Open Enrollment Period is October 15th through December 7th.
 - Medicaid Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus (CCC Plus) open enrollment is October 1st through December 18th.
 - ➤ Medicaid Medallion 4.0 open enrollment is November 1st through December 31st.
 - Federal Marketplace/Affordable Care Act (ACA) open enrollment is November 1 through December 15th.
 - Federal Employees Health Benefits Program (FEHBP) open enrollment is November 9th through December 14th.
 - > TRICARE (military) open enrollment season is November 8th through December 13th.
 - > Medicare General Enrollment Period is January 1st through March 31st.

Nutrition: Meals on Wheels

• A new partnership with several communitybased organizations will ensure all Meals on Wheels (MOW) clients receive a special Thanksgiving meal delivery this year. Volunteers Solutions' volunteers will also support this effort by delivering this special meal. MOW clients will receive a variety of traditional Thanksgiving meal items, both prepared foods and shelf-stable pantry items, that can be used to serve as a family holiday meal. Volunteers will pick up the meal kits at different community-based organizations and deliver to MOW clients on Tuesday, Nov. 23rd.

- The Nutrition Unit continues to provide MOW services to eligible adults over age 60 or adults over age 18 with disabilities who elect to self-quarantine due to the pandemic.
- The Nutrition Unit is in the process of surveying MOW clients now that the weekly delivery model has been implemented for **3** months.

Nutrition: Congregate Meals

- On November 1, 2021, Genuine Food Lab, LLC started serving meals to Herndon Senior Center and Herndon Adult Day Health Centers. Participants are delighted that meals are being prepared on-site in the commercial kitchen again. The kitchen was closed in March 2020 due to the pandemic.
- The Congregate Nutrition Program continues to provide nutritious meals and opportunities for socialization and recreation to county residents aged 60 and over at Fairfax County Senior Centers and Adult Day Health Centers.

- On Wednesday, October 6, *Medicare 101* caregiver webinar was held. **39** people attended the event.
- On Wednesday, October 20, *Medicare 102* caregiver webinar was held. **44** people attended the event.
- On Friday, October 1, Aging in Place- A Panel Conversation was held. **55** people attended.

- During the month of October, **11** Caregiver Alert Notifications were sent via email, text messages, and voice communication methods. The notifications contained information on Medicare 101 and 102 presentations, Covid-19 vaccines boosters, Kinship Caregiver cafes, Dementia Friend information sessions, The Caregiving Journey: A Panel Conversation with Family Caregivers, Caregiver Telephone Support Call, Caring for You and Caring for Me virtual classes and more. - In October, the caregiver unit received **8** phone calls from family caregivers seeking information about educational programs, support groups, and other supportive services in Fairfax.
- On October 12th, caregiver staff conducted a virtual presentation to the Chamber of Commerce-Senior Resources Council about state of caregiving, current statistics, and resources. **14** people attended the presentation.
- In October, caregiver staff attended a Senior Resource meeting and provided Fairfax AAA information about resources and services for family caregivers, older adults, and adults with disabilities to **29** attendees.
- On October 27th, caregiver staff attended a Senior Resource Fair at Frying Pan Park and provided Fairfax AAA information about resources and services for family caregivers, older adults, and adults with disabilities to **46** attendees.
- The Fenwick Foundation Partnership supports family caregivers by providing free outside events and activity opportunities, such as tickets to theaters, plays, musicals, baseball games, and more. Currently, The Fenwick Foundation is providing access to virtual and in-person events, such as

dental webinars, soccer games, holiday events, circus outings, live music events and more. The program accepts referrals from the Department of Family Services, senior centers, adult day health centers, and other county programs. The program currently has **22** participants.

- Caregiver staff attended the Dementia Friendly Fairfax (DFF) task force meeting and co-hosted a Dementia Friends Information Session on October 23rd for **3** community members. On Friday, October 29, staff co-facilitated a Spanish DFF presentation to family caregivers. **4** people attended.
- Senior Express provided **26** round-trip rides to **9** unduplicated clients, and **53** hours of respite to their family caregivers for the month of September.
- The Covid Grocery & Medication Assisted Transportation program provided **11** round-trip rides to **8** unduplicated clients for the month of September.
- The Discretionary Funds, which provide durable medical equipment and adaptive equipment to clients who need financial help, aided **5** clients/caregivers, providing **7** items in September.
- Residential Repair & Renovation Program: Served 1 client in October
- Occupational Therapist (OT) Consultation Program: Made **4** referrals to TMT in October.

Northern Virginia Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program

- Ombudsman staff and ombudsman volunteers continue to conduct onsite visits to nursing facilities and assisted living facilities.
- Increased requests for assistance from the Ombudsman Program have continued since ombudsmen reentry into long-term care facilities.
- Ombudsman Program's next virtual in-service training for ombudsman volunteers was rescheduled from October to November. In-services are continuing education trainings for ombudsman volunteers and are held every other month. In-services focus on different topics and are opportunities for ombudsman volunteers to share their experiences and ideas.
- Ombudsman Program contributes a monthly short piece on the topic of long-term care in Fairfax County's monthly newspaper for older adults called the "Golden Gazette." September's piece was on activity programs in long-term care facilities.

Ombudsman Program completed its 3-Day Fall 2021 New Ombudsman Volunteer Training for prospective ombudsman volunteers in October! Trainings are held twice a year (spring and fall) and are mandatory for prospective ombudsman volunteers. Next step is to "place" new ombudsman volunteers throughout long-term care facilities in Northern Virginia.
