- On January 16th, Volunteer Solutions had a service project completed by the Volunteer Fairfax,

 Stacey Sherwood Center in the City of Fairfax with 600 participants. Families with elementary
 aged children packed **150** Bags of Sunshine that will be delivered in March to Home-Delivered
 Meals clients in the Fairfax and Reston regions.
- Upcoming Events Involving Volunteer Solutions
 - ➤ On February 7th, Volunteer Solutions' Planning Coordinator will appear on Facebook Live with the Nepali American Community Center (NACC) to provide community education on Adult and Aging services.
 - ➤ On February 9th, Volunteer Solutions' volunteer drivers will deliver mini-floral arrangements to Home-Delivered Meals clients in the South County region. These arrangements are being generously donated by the Garden Club of Waynewood (GCW) in Alexandria. The Nutrition Unit and Volunteer Solutions are collaborating on this project.
 - > On February 11th, Volunteer Solutions' South County Regional Volunteer Coordinator will conduct volunteer outreach at Supervisor Storck's Annual Town Hall Meeting.
 - On February 15th, Volunteer Solutions will host a Dementia 101 training for volunteers led by Insight Memory Care.

Nutrition: Meals on Wheels

- The Nutrition Unit is currently in the process of filling the vacant Social Service Specialist III position. The position was posted for 2 weeks and closed on January 13th, 2023.
- The Nutrition Unit continues to provide MOW services to eligible adults over age 60 or adults over age 18 with a disability.

Nutrition: Congregate Meals

 The Congregate Nutrition Program continues to provide nutritious meals and opportunities for socialization and

recreation to county residents aged 60 and over at Fairfax County Senior Centers and Adult Day Health Centers.

Caregiver and Support Services

- During January, **9** Caregiver Alert Notifications were sent via email, text messages, and voice communication methods. The notifications contained information on Free Ballet Class for Adults, McLean Community Center Old Firehouse Winter Block Party, Caregiver Stroke support Group, Stroke Survivor support groups, Virtual Chronic Pain Self-Management, Virginia Lifespan Respite Voucher Program, Free Flu Vaccine Clinic, and a Death Café. Currently there are **1,137** subscribers.
- The caregiver column for the Golden Gazette included a message about Carving Out an Identity Separate from Caregiving, the Stroke Support Group-Helping Hands Stroke Club, Group Speech Therapy Sessions, Virtual Kinship Café- Support & Encouragement for Caregivers, and Death Café.
- The monthly Caregiver Webletter was emailed this month to **1,376** people. The Webletter contained information on Helping Hands Stroke Club, Stroke Support Group, Caregiver Stroke support Group, virtual Chronic Pain Self-Management, Ballet Class for Adults, Emergency Preparedness Monthly Webinars, McLean Community Center Winter Block Party, Free Seed Library, Amateur Art- Learn to Draw, and New Year -New You -- Start 2023 with Meditation.
- During January, data collection from 2022 on caregiver educational programs was analyzed. In 2022, there were **1,436** participants who attended the live caregiver educational programs. This represented a **141%** increase in program participation from 2021 in which there were **597** participants. In addition, **6,055** people watched the recorded sessions. This represented a **216%** from 2021 in which there were **1,915** people who watched the recorded sessions.

- The Fenwick Foundation Partnership supports family caregivers by providing free outside events and activity opportunities, such as tickets to theaters, plays, musicals, baseball games, and more. Currently, The Fenwick Foundation is providing access to virtual and in-person events live shows, music events, museums, ballets, holiday shows, and more. The program accepts referrals from the Department of Family Services, adult day health centers, and other county programs. The program currently has 33 participants.
- Senior Express provided **23** round-trip rides to **11** unduplicated clients, and **47** hours of respite to their family caregivers for the month of December.
- The Covid Grocery & Medication Assisted Transportation program provided **5** round-trip rides to **4** unduplicated clients for the month of December.
- Discretionary Funds, which provide durable medical equipment and adaptive equipment to clients who need financial help, assisted **3** clients through the family caregiver grant, providing **10** items, and **1** client through the Barbara Antley Gift Fund, providing **3** items in December.
- The Residential Repair & Renovation (R&R) Program helps seniors 60 yrs. of age or older remain safely in their home by providing home repairs and modifications. In January, there was 1 new request and 2 completed projects to fix a furnace and provide heat and installation of grab bars to help prevent falls.
- The Occupational Therapist (OT) Consultation Program sends out an OT to perform a home safety evaluation for A&A clients. Clients are referred to this service by their case worker. There were **3** new referrals received in January and **3** completed evaluations.
- The Chore Services Program allows the AAA to provide services for Adult & Aging clients, 60 years or older, who can no longer perform these services themselves and who do not have the means to hire someone to provide the specified service(s). Services may include heavy housekeeping, yardwork, minor appliance repair and painting (limited). In January, 1 new request was received.
