Land Development Services staff will lead discussion about Parking Reimagined, an initiative to review Article 6 of the Zoning Ordinance which regulates off-street parking and loading. - On February 9, 2023, Volunteer Solutions' volunteer drivers delivered mini-floral arrangements to Home-Delivered Meals clients in the South County region. These arrangements were generously donated by the Garden Club of Waynewood (GCW) and Trader Joe's in Alexandria. The Nutrition Unit and Volunteer Solutions collaborated on this project. 100 Home-Delivered Meals clients received floral arrangements delivered by 12 volunteers.
- On February 11, 2023, the Volunteer Solutions' South County Regional Volunteer Coordinator conducted volunteer outreach at Supervisor Storck's Annual Town Hall Meeting. There were **300** individuals in attendance.
- On February 25, 2023, the Volunteer Solutions' Supervisor presented an overview of Adult and Aging programs and volunteer opportunities to the American Turkish Friendship Association. There were **50** individuals in attendance in-person.
- In honor of Older Americans Month, Volunteer Solutions is now accepting Adult and Aging client referrals for Helping Hands Projects which will take place in May. Projects provide opportunities for groups and individuals to assist Adult and Aging clients by performing yard work such as lawn moving, weeding, pruning bushes, and minor landscaping.
- Upcoming Events Involving Volunteer Solutions
 - > On March 14 & 15, 2023, Volunteer Solutions' volunteer drivers will deliver Bags of Sunshine to **150** Home-Delivered Meals clients.

Nutrition: Meals on Wheels

- The Nutrition Unit has filled the vacant Social Service Specialist III position.
 Lauren Koontz has been promoted from a Social Service Specialist II to Social Service Specialist III. She will officially transition into her new role on March 13, 2023.
- On February 9, 2023, the Garden Club of Waynewood donated 100 mini floral arrangements that were distributed to Meals on Wheels (MOW) participants located in the South County area.
 Volunteers assisted with the delivery of the mini floral arrangements.
- The week of February 13, 2023, Meals on Wheels participants received a nutritional education flyer "Eat Right With Less Salt" from the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. In addition, participants received KN95 masks and an infrared forehead thermometer as a result of a partnership with the Department of Emergency Management and Security (DEMS).
- The Nutrition Unit continues to provide MOW services to eligible adults over age 60 or adults over age 18 with a disability.

Nutrition: Congregate Meals

• The Congregate Nutrition Program continues to provide nutritious meals and opportunities for socialization and recreation to county residents aged 60 and over at Fairfax County Senior Centers and Adult Day Health Centers.

Caregiver and Support Services

- On Wednesday, February 15, 2023, *Communicating with a Loved One with Dementia*, was held. **107** people attended the webinar.
- On Wednesday, February 8, 2023, a *Dementia Friend Information Session*, was held. **59** people attended the presentation.
- During February, **9** Caregiver Alert Notifications were sent via email, text messages, and voice communication methods. The notifications contained information on Virtual Dementia Friends Information Session, Communicating with a Loved One with Dementia Webinar, Kinship Caregiver Café, Dementia 101 Class, Crisis Assistance Program, Virtual Caregiver Support Call, Virtual Qigong Class, Parenting Education Programs, and Stroke Survivor support groups. Currently there are **1,150** subscribers.
- The caregiver column for the Golden Gazette included a message about Home Safety, Communicating with a Loved One with Dementia-Caregiver Webinar, the Fairfax Caregiver Alert Notifications Program, and the Inova Parkinson's & Movement Disorders Center.

- The monthly Caregiver Webletter was emailed this month to **1,425** people. The Webletter contained information on Communicating with a Loved One with Dementia, Virtual Caregiver Support Call, Helping Hands Stroke Club, Stroke Support Group, Virtual Dementia Friends Information Session, Virtual Kinship Café, Dementia 101, Virginia Lifespan Respite Voucher Program, AARP Tax Assistance, Virtual Qigong Classes, and Parenting Education Programs.
- The Fenwick Foundation Partnership Program supports family caregivers by providing free outside events and activity opportunities, such as tickets to theaters, plays, musicals, baseball games, and more. Currently, The Fenwick Foundation is providing access to virtual and inperson events live shows, music events, museums, ballets, holiday shows, and more. The program accepts referrals from the Department of Family Services, adult day health centers, and other county programs. The program currently has 33 participants.

- Senior Express provided **21** round-trip rides to **11** unduplicated clients, and **48.5** hours of respite to their family caregivers for the month of January.
- The Covid Grocery & Medication Assisted Transportation program provided **6** round-trip rides to **5** unduplicated clients for the month of January.
 - The Declaration of Local Emergency related to COVID-19 came to close in Fairfax County on March 1, 2023. In alignment with the discontinuation of local emergency, the **COVID Grocery & Medication Assisted Transportation Program will be ending effective March 31, 2023**. No additional rides will be available after this date.

Please Note: This is not to be confused with the **COVID-19 Vaccine Transportation Service**. Future referrals for this service will be directed to the Neighborhood and Community Services, Human Services Transportation Line by contacting: **703-222-9764** to be screened for eligibility.

- Discretionary Funds, which provide durable medical equipment and adaptive equipment to clients who need financial help, assisted **2** clients through the family caregiver grant, providing **2** items, and **0** client through the Barbara Antley Gift Fund, providing **0** items in January.
- The Residential Repair & Renovation (R&R) Program helps seniors 60 yrs. of age or older remain safely in their home by providing home repairs and modifications. In February, there were 3 new requests, 2 completed and 1 cancellation.
- The Occupational Therapist (OT) Consultation Program sends out an OT to perform a home safety evaluation for A&A clients. Clients are referred to this service by their case worker. There were **2** new referrals received in February.
- The Chore Services Program allows the AAA to provide services for Adult & Aging clients, 60 years or older, who can no longer perform these services themselves and who do not have the means to hire someone to provide the specified service(s). Services may include heavy

housekeeping, yardwork, minor appliance repair and painting (limited). In February, 2 new requests were received, and 1 home assessment was completed.

- ElderLink is recruiting to fill two Social Worker Case Manager positions.
- The current ElderLink director, Will Jin, will be transitioning to another department within Inova starting April 2, 2023, and Lauren Elcesser will be assuming the Director of ElderLink role starting on April 10, 2023.
