- On Tuesday, July 18, a staff member presented on "Supporting Family Caregivers Through Education, Outreach, and Data Collection" at the 2023 USAging Annual Conference. The Fast Track session was attended by **30** professionals.
- Senior Express provided **20** round trip rides to 8 unduplicated clients, and **42.5** hours of respite for the caregivers for the month of June.
- Discretionary Funds, which provide durable medical equipment and adaptive equipment to clients who need financial help, assisted **2** clients through the Family Caregiver Discretionary Fund, providing **3** items; and **2** clients through the Barbara Antley Gift Fund, providing **3** items in July.
- The Senior Cool Care Program is a public-private partnership sponsored by Dominion Energy and administered by the <u>Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services</u> that helps low-income older citizens in Virginia keep cool during summer months. The program provides single room fans, window air conditioners and portable air conditioners to older adults, 60 or older, are at or below 150% of the poverty level, and need additional cooling at home. The program runs May 1 through the last working day in October. In July, the program provided 4 portable air conditioner units and 3 tower fans to 7 older adults.
- The Residential Repair & Renovation (R&R) Program helps seniors 60 years of age or older remain safely in their home by providing home repairs and modifications. In July, there were 4 new requests and 3 were completed.

- The Dementia Friendly Fairfax (DFF) action team met on Tuesday, August 29, 2023. The action team shared updates and discussed the interest to continue virtual and in-person information sessions. In addition, the team discussed the possibility of providing future Korean and Spanish Dementia Friendly Information Sessions. The group will meet on Wednesday, September 26, 2023.
- In July, the Senior Express Program provided 13 round trip rides to 8 unduplicated clients.
- Discretionary Funds, which provide durable medical equipment and adaptive equipment to clients who need financial help, assisted **2** clients through the Family Caregiver Discretionary Fund, providing **2** items; and **o** clients through the Barbara Antley Gift Fund.
- The Senior Cool Care Program is a public-private partnership sponsored by Dominion Energy and administered by the <u>Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services</u> that helps low-income older citizens in Virginia keep cool during summer months. The program provides single room fans, window air conditioners and portable air conditioners to older adults, 60 or older, who are at or below 150% of the poverty level, and need additional cooling at home. The program runs May 1 through the last working day in October. In August, the program provided 3 tower fans and 1 box fan to 4 older adults.
- The Residential Repair & Renovation (R&R) Program helps seniors 60 yrs. of age or older remain safely in their homes by providing home repairs and modifications. In August, there was 1 new request and 4 were completed.
- The Occupational Therapist (OT) Consultation Program sends out an OT to perform a home safety evaluation for A&A clients. Clients are referred to this service by their case worker. There were **3** new referrals, and **3** consultations were completed in August.
- The Chore Services Program allows the AAA to provide services for Adult & Aging clients, 60 years or older, who can no longer perform these services themselves and who do not have the means to hire someone to provide the specified service(s). Services may include heavy housekeeping, yardwork, minor appliance repair and painting (limited). This month, 1 request was received, and 1 job was completed.
