  - The Fairfax Area Commission on Aging (COA) met virtually on December 20<sup>th</sup>. Yashoda Premysler, Program Manager of CARE Mobile, gave a presentation on CARE Mobile services and discussed potential opportunities for collaboration through the SHAPE the Future of Aging Plan. The next COA meeting is on January 17, 2024.

Allegra has served in the Caregiver and Support Services Unit for the past two years, most recently as the Social Services Specialist III, where she has enriched the lives of caregivers in Fairfax through the development and implementation of successful and exciting caregiver and support services programs.

- On December 1, 2023, a panel conversation, "*Providing Care at the End of Life*," was held. **174** people received the slide presentation and recording, and **64** people attended the live session.
- On December 13, 2023, a *Dementia Friend Information Session* was held. **58** people registered, and **18** people attended the presentation.
- On December 15, 2023, a Spanish series, "iPresente! Una historia latina de los Estados Unidos," was held. 22 people received the slide presentation, and 6 people attended the live session.
- During December 2023, **8** Caregiver Alert Notifications were sent via email, text messages, and voice communication methods. The notifications contained information on Elderlink's Virtual Support Call, Dementia Friendly Information Session, Presente Una Historia Latina de Los Estados Unidos-Spanish webinar, Helping Hands Stroke Club-Stroke Support Group, Gingerbread House Maker Session, Caregiver YouTube Webinar recordings, Home Repair for the Elderly, and the McLean Community Center Annual Winter Block Party. Currently, there are **1,383** subscribers.

- The caregiver column for the Golden Gazette included a message about Caregiving Over the Holidays and provided information on the events: Virtual Dementia Friendly Information Session, iPresente! Una Historia Latina de Los Estados Unidos, Fairfax Caregiver Alert Notifications, and the Parkinson Social Network.
- The monthly Caregiver Webletter was emailed this month to **2,439** people. The Webletter contained information on the following topics:

- The Fenwick Foundation Partnership Program supports family caregivers by providing free events and activity opportunities, such as tickets to theaters, plays, musicals, baseball games, and more. Currently, The Fenwick Foundation is providing access to virtual and in-person events. The program accepts referrals from the Department of Family Services, Adult Day Health Centers, and other county programs. The program currently has 32 participants.
- The Dementia Friendly Fairfax (DFF) action team did not meet in December. The next meeting will be on Tuesday, January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2024.
- On December 3<sup>rd,</sup> 2023, a staff member from the caregiver unit, provided an in-person presentation on "Helpful Tips and Resources for Family Caregivers" to the Unitarian Universalist Church of Arlington. There were approximately **12** attendees.
- On December 19th, two staff members from the Caregiver unit, attended the virtual VCC Executive Committee Meeting where discussions took place of the redesigns for No Wrong Door Easy Access website, the future VCC homepage, 2024 goals and the new Vice Chair was announced. The next meeting will be on February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- The Barbara Antley Gift Fund was used to assist 1 client and provided 2 items in December.
- The Residential Repair & Renovation (R&R) Program helps seniors 60 years of age or older remain safely in their homes by providing home repairs and modifications. In December, there were 4 new requests, and 2 jobs were completed.
- The Occupational Therapist (OT) Consultation Program sends out an OT to perform a home safety evaluation for A&A clients. Clients are referred to this service by their case worker. There were 4 new referrals, and 3 consultations were completed in December.
- The Chore Services Program allows the AAA to provide services for Adult & Aging clients, 60 years or older, who can no longer perform these services themselves and who do not have the means to hire someone to provide the specified service(s). Services may include heavy housekeeping, yardwork, minor appliance repair and painting (limited). This month, 1 request was received, and 2 jobs were completed.
